And whereas as appears from the recitals to the principal Order doubts had arisen whether before the said 1st day of October, 1913, such persons were employed within the meaning of Part I of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and the said Order was intended to be made for the purpose of removing such doubts:

And whereas before the date of the principal Order the Insurance Commissioners, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 66 of the said Act, had determined that employment as an Assistant Overseer to the Overseers of the Poor (who is in this Order referred to as an "Assistant Overseer") or as a Collector of Poor Rates upon the terms referred to in the decisions given by the Commissioners under that section was not employment within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas it is apprehended that the principal Order may apply to persons employed as Assistant Overseers or Collectors of Poor Rates upon the terms aforesaid, and it is expedient that the principal Order should be amended so as to exclude such persons, so far as may be necessary, from the operation of the said Order:

And whereas in certain cases certificates of exemption were before the 1st day of October, 1913, granted under Section 2 of the said Act to persons employed under local or public authorities and for the reasons set forth in the recital to the principal Order, it is doubtful

whether such certificates were properly granted and whether contributions were properly payable in respect of those persons, and it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended so as to apply to the payment of contributions in respect of persons (other than the persons hereinafter mentioned) who held such certificates of exemption before the date aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the National Insurance Acts, 1911 to 1913, and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order, the provisions of that Order shall not apply to any person employed as an Assistant Overseer or as a Collector of Poor Rates upon the terms referred to in the decisions given by the Commissioners as aforesaid.

2. The provisions of the principal Order relating to the payment of contributions shall apply to contributions paid before the 1st day of October, 1913, in respect of any person employed under any local or other public authority (other than a person employed as Assistant Overseer or Collector of Poor Rates upon the terms aforesaid or employed in any of the employments excluded by the National Health Insurance (Employments under Local or Public Authorities) Exclusion Order, 1913) who held such certificate of exemption before the 1st day of October, 1913, and who by virtue of Section 6 of the National Insurance Act, 1913, was or would, if he had not held such certificate of exemption, have been on or after that date an employed contributor.

W HEREAS under orders dated 2nd February, 1914, and 24th February, 1914, respectively, the importation into the Isle of Man, from any port in Great Britain and Ireland of any animal was prohibited.

In this Order the expression "animal" means any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, swine, or goat.
