

retired Incumbents (hereinafter called the said Regulations), do hereby grant out of our common fund to the retired Incumbent the yearly sum of fifty pounds during the life of the retired Incumbent, subject as hereinafter mentioned, such yearly sum to commence and be computed from the said fifth day of January last past, and to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in every year; subject nevertheless to cesser, determination, withdrawal, suspension or reduction, as a grant made in accordance with the said Regulations and to all other the provisions and conditions contained in the said Regulations and applicable to a grant made in accordance therewith.
