changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.'

And whereas by section 8 of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted: "That when by any Order of His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the Minister thereof duly nominated and licensed thereto and his successors shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rentcharges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual Curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid.'

And whereas the Right Reverend Huyshe, Lord Bishop of Worcester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 26th day of January, 1914, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

- "I Huyshe, by Divine permission, Bishop of Worcester, do, in pursuance of the 26th section of an Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—
- "1. There is in the county of Warwick and my Diocese of Worcester the Vicarage of Wootton Wawen, the parish whereof comprises (amongst other places) the chapelry and township of Henley-in-Arden, the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.
- "2. The said chapelry and township contains a consecrated church or chapel long since erected and dedicated to St. John the Baptist, distant from the parish church of Wootton Wawen two miles or thereabouts. The seats in the said church or chapel are free and unappropriated, and the inhabitants of the said chapelry and township are accustomed to resort to the said church or chapel for Divine Service and other rites of the Church of England, including marriages.

- "3. The population of the said parish, exclusive of the said chapelry and township is, according to the Census of one thousand nine hundred and eleven, five hundred and thirty-four, and the population of the said chapelry and township, according to the same Census, is one thousand and sixty-two.
- "4. The net annual value of the said benefice (exclusive of the said chapelry and township) arising from tithe rentcharge glebe fees and Easter dues is two hundred pounds or thereabouts, and the net annual value of the said chapelry and township arising from glebe fees Easter dues and other sources, is two hundred and fifteen pounds or thereabouts.
- "5. It appears to me that the said chapelry and township may, under the provisions of the said Act 1 and 2 Vic., cap 106, and of the Act of the second and third years of the same reign, cap. 49, be advantageously separated from the said parish of Wootton Wawen and be constituted a separate parish for Ecclesiastical purposes, and a perpetual curacy and benefice, to be called 'The Perpetual Curacy of Henley-in-Arden.'
- "6. The Provost and Scholars of the King's College of Our Lady and St. Nicholas in Cambridge are the patrons of the said benefice of Wootton Wawen, and the Reverend Francis. Thomas Bramston is the present Incumbent of the said benefice.
- "7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing, appended to-Representation, describing the chapelry and township so as aforesaid proposed to be formed into a separate benefice and themode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents in writing of the said patron and Incumbent, and in case you shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred toin the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed that the chapelry and township of Henley-in-Arden, the boundaries of which are defined and well known, and which said chapelry and township is coloured pink and indicated by the letter 'A' on the annexed plan, be separated from the Ecclesiastical parish of Wootton Wawen, in the county of Warwick and Diocese of Worcester, and that the same be constituted a separate parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a benefice by the name of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Henley-in-Arden,' of which the said church or chapel of St. John the Baptist, Henley-in-Arden, shall be the parish church.

"The said separate parish and benefice of Henley-in-Arden shall henceforth be subject to the same Ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said
