And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration.

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report, dated the 3rd day of February, 1914, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

"We, the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby represent to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Huyshe, Lord Bishop of Worcester, in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, has represented unto us amongst other things.

"That there is in the county of Warwick and his diocese of Worcester the vicarage of Wootton Wawen, the parish whereof contains a population of five hundred and thirty-four (exclusive of the chapelry and township of Henley-in-Arden).

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the vicarage of Ullenhall, the parish whereof contains a population of four hundred and eighty.

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the rectory of Beaudesert, the parish whereof contains a population of one hundred and eighty-seven.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain detached portion of the said parish of Wootton Wawen, described in the

hereinafter-mentioned Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, appended hereto and delineated on the plan annexed to such Scheme, and thereon coloured green, and indicated by the letter 'A,' and also a certain district of the said parish of Wootton Wawen, also described in the said Scheme, and delineated on the said plan, and thereon coloured green, and indicated by the letter 'B,' may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Wootton Wawen and united to the said parish of Beaudesert.

"That it also appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain district of the said parish of Ullenhall, described in the said Scheme, and delineated on the said plan, and thereon coloured purple, and indicated by the letter 'C,' may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Ullenhall and united to the said parish of Beaudesert.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithe rentcharges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme, together with the consents thereto in writing of the Provost and Scholars of the King's College of Our Lady and St. Nicholas in Cambridge, the patrons or body corporate entitled to present to the benefice of Wootton Wawen, in case the same were now vacant, the Reverend Francis Thomas Bramston, the Incumbent of the same benefice, Hugh Goodwin Newton, Esquire, the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Ullenhall, in case the same were now vacant, the Reverend William Frederick Pelton, the Incumbent of the same benefice, the Right Honourable Richard Burdon Viscount Haldane of Cloan, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain on behalf of His Most Gracious Majesty the King, the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Beaudesert, in case the same were now vacant, and the Reverend James Smith Turner, the Incumbent of the same benefice, have been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and the consents above referred to, are hereunto annexed.

"And we, the said Archbishop, being, on full consideration and inquiry, satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.
