To substitute for No. 3 of the existing Statutes the following Statute:—

3. The University shall, so far as its means and other duties permit, maintain and develop University of London King's College for Women as an institution for the higher education of women, of which the education relating to Home Science (or Household and Social Science) shall be carried on in such place or places within the parish of Kensington, in the administrative county of London, as the Senate may from time to time appoint, and the education other than education relating to Home Science (or Household and Social Science) shall be carried on in or on such premises forming part of or adjacent to premises occupied by University of London King's College as the Senate shall from time to Provided always that ro time appoint. teaching shall be given in the places or in or on the premises aforesaid by the University in any subjects which pertain exclusively to the curricula in the Faculty of

Theology. And further provided that the University may continue to carry on the said education other than education relating to Home Science (or Household and Social Science) in or on the premises in or on which the said education was carried on immediately before the date of the coming into force of this Statute for such period not exceeding eighteen months from that date as the Senate shall appoint.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, cap. 66, notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of forty days from the date of this Gazette, to make alterations as shown below in the Regulations for the admission of Candidates to the Civil Service of India, under Section 32 of the Statute, 21 and 22 Victoria, cap. 106.

For Regulation 10, which at present stands

as follows, viz.:—

"10. The selected Candidates will also be tested during their probation as to their proficiency in Riding.

The examinations in riding will be held as

follows : --

(1) Shortly after the result of the Open Competitive Examination has been declared, or at such time or times as the Commissioners may appoint during the course of the proba-

tionary year.
(2) Again, at the time of the Final Examination. Candidates who may then fully satisfy the Commissioners of their ability to ride well and to perform journeys on horseback will be awarded from 100 to 200 marks, according to the degree of proficiency displayed, to be added to their marks in the Final Examination. Candidates who fail to obtain 100 marks, but are reported by the Civil Service Commissioners to have reached a minimum standard of proficiency in riding, and are certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, will, on their arrival in India, be subjected to such further tests in riding as may be prescribed by their Government, and shall receive no increase to their initial salary until they have passed such tests to the satisfaction of that Government.

A Candidate who fails at the end of the year of probation to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that he has reached the minimum standard of proficiency in riding, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of Selected Candidates."

It is proposed to substitute the following, that is to say: -

"10. The selected Candidates will also be tested during their probation as to their proficiency in Riding.

The examinations in riding will be held as follows:-

(1) Shortly after the result of the Open Competitive Examination has been declared, or at such time or times as the Commissioners may appoint during the course of the proba-

tionary year.

(2) Again, at the time of the Final Examination. Candidates who may then that they are sufsatisfy the Commissioners that they are sufficiently at home in the saddle for the efficient performance of all the duties of the Civil Service of India will be awarded marks ranging between 101 and 200, according to the degree of proficiency displayed, to be added to their marks in the Final Examination. Candidates who fall short of this adequate proficiency, but show such minimum proficiency as is evidence that with a moderate amount of practice they can attain full proficiency, will receive marks ranging between 1 and 100; they will be allowed to proceed to India, and will on their arrival there be subjected to such further tests in riding as may be prescribed by their Government, and shall receive no increase to their initial salary until they have passed such tests to the satisfaction of that Government. A candidate who fails at the end of the year of probation to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that he has reached the minimum standard of proficiency in riding, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of Selected Candidates."

It is intended that the new regulation should apply to candidates selected at the Open Competitive Examination of 1915 and subsequently.

THE FOREIGN PARCELS (CUSTOMS AND EXCISE) WARRANT,

Whereas it is desirable to make provision for the delivery from premises licensed for the rectifying and compounding of spirits by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise for transmission by Parcel Post to places out of the United Kingdom of such tinctures as the said Commissioners may from time to time allow, We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on us by the 14th section of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise and of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their respectively signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:-

- (1) The Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885, shall not apply to parcels of tinctures delivered from premises licensed for the rectifying and compounding of spirits by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, hereinafter referred to as "bonded parcels";
- (2) Every bonded parcel delivered from premises licensed for the rectifying and compounding of spirits by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise shall be accompanied by an authority for its exportation on drawback by parcel post, signed by an Officer of Customs and Excise;
- (3) The Officer of the Post Office accepting a bonded parcel, duly accompanied by the Customs and Excise authority, shall give the sender a certificate of the posting of the parcel;
- 4) The certificate of posting thus given shall for the purposes of section 107 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876; relating to the exportation of bonded goods, be deemed to be evidence of an act equivalent to shipment under that section;
- (5) The delivery of bonded parcels from premises licensed for the rectifying and compounding of spirits by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise shall be subject to such bond and to such special conditions as the said Commissioners may from time to time prescribe;
- (6) If any claim be made on the Postmaster-General for compensation in respect of the loss of or damage to any bonded parcel, that claim shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be deemed to be con-clusive evidence that such parcel has not been duly exported and that its contents have gone into consumption in the United Kingdom, and any drawback paid shall be repaid by the compounder or rectifier;
- (7) In this Warrant the expression tinctures has the same meaning as in section 4 (1) of the Revenue Act, 1906;
- (8) This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of June, 1914.
 - (9) This Warrant may be cited as the

"Foreign Parcels (Customs and Excise) Warrant, 1914."

NATIONAL INSURANCE.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Wales) (Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1914, dated 27th May, 1914, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55), with reference to the provision of funds to meet expenditure for sanatorium benefit incurred during the period ending 13th January, 1913.

Whereas by Section 78 read with Section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things enacted that if any difficulty arises in bringing into operation in Wales Part I. of the Act the Welsh Insurance Commissioners (in this Order referred to as "the Commissioners") may, with the consent of the Treasury, by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I. of the Act into operation in Wales, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas it is enacted by Sub-section (2) of Section 16 of the Act that the sums available for defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit in each year shall be one shilling and three pence in respect of each insured person resident in the County or County Borough, and such further sum as is mentioned in the said sub-section:

And whereas it is provided by Sub-section (1) of Section 61 of the Act that all sums available for sanatorium benefit shall be paid or credited to Insurance Committees at the

or credited to Insurance commencement of the year:

And whereas by the National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit) (Wales) Order, 1913, it was amongst other things previded that for the purpose of defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit during the period from the 15th day of July, 1912, to the 12th day of January, 1913, both inclusive (in that Order and hereinafter referred to as "the initial period"), there should be deducted from the amounts standing to the credit of Approved Societies the sums therein specified, and that the sums so deducted should be apportioned amongst the several Insurance Committees in proportion to the number of persons in their respective areas:

And whereas in the case of persons whose contribution cards were not brought into account before the 31st day of December, 1913, no deduction has been made under the provisions of the recited Order, and for the reasons more particularly set forth in that Order it is expedient that such deductions should be made:

And whereas by reason of the premises a difficulty has arisen in bringing Part I. of the Act into operation:

Now, therefore, the Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 78 read with Section 82 of the Act, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(1) For the purpose of enabling Committees to defray the expenses of sanatorium benefit incurred during the initial period, there shall be deducted at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may direct, from the amounts standing to the credit of Approved Societies, the sums specified in the Schedule to this Order, and the sums so deducted shall be apportioned between the several Insurance Committees in proportion to the number of insured persons resident in their respective areas:

Provided that the contributions paid by any person not entitled to sanatorium benefit shall not be taken into account in calculating the amount to be deducted from the amount standing to the credit of an Approved Society.

ing to the credit of an Approved Society.

(2) For the purposes of this Order the expression "person not entitled to sanatorium benefit" means an insured person whom the Insurance Committee have no power to recommend for sanatorium benefit.

2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1914.

SCHEDULE.

The sum to be deducted from the amount standing to the credit of an Approved Society shall be such sum as would represent a payment of 3\frac{3}{4}\text{d}. for each member of the Society who surrendered a stamped card to the Society in respect of the period ending the 13th day of October, 1912, and of 3\frac{3}{4}\text{d}. for each member of the Society who surrendered a stamped card to the Society in respect of the period ending the 12th day of January, 1913:

Provided that in the case of any member of the Society in whose case the cost of benefits is payable as to $\frac{a}{v}$ ths or $\frac{1}{4}$ th out of moneys provided by Parliament, the sum to be deducted as aforesaid shall be reduced by $\frac{a}{v}$ ths or $\frac{1}{4}$ th, as the case may be.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Middlesex have made application to the Local Government Board for a Regulation to be made, in pursuance of the said subsection, putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising Roxeth Hill, Harrow, extending from its junction with London Road to its junction with Lower Road.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1). COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

WENDOVER.

To the County Council of Bucking-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Buckingham, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate at Wendover, in the county of Buckingham, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and

Report has been made to Us thereon:
NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads at Wendover which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

SCHEDULE.

So much of Aylesbury Street as extends for

a distance of 100 yards from the Clock Tower: High Street, Pound Street, and Bacombe Terrace to a point 14 yards west of the houses on that Terrace; and

So much of Tring Road as extends from its junction with Aylesbury Street to a point 50 yards east of the main entrance to the Congregational Chapel.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1). COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—



CORNWALL (EPIZOOTIC ABORTION) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Limitation of Scope of Order.

1. This Order shall not apply to a premature calving resulting from accident or some other definite cause other than epizoetic abortion.

Notice of Premature Calving and Isolation pending Inquiry.

- 2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a cow which has calved prematurely shall with all practical speed give notice of the fact to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the cow is.
- (2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

(3.) The cow and its calf (if any) shall be kept separate by the owner or person in charge thereof from any bull or cow (other than a calf) pending the inquiry by the Local Authority as to the existence of epizootic abortion.

(4.) The membranes, discharges and other matter liable to cause infection, and the calf, if born dead, shall be destroyed by the owner or person in charge of the cow as soon as possible by burning or burial in lime, but not until such samples as are required for the purpose of the prescribed veterinary inquiry have been taken by the officer employed by the Local Authority to carry out such inquiry. Such matter shall, as far as practicable, be removed from contact with cows by the owner or person in charge of the cow.

Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Epizootic Abortion.

3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of a premature calving shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted, with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector, to ascertain whether it was caused by epizootic abortion.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a cow which has calved prematurely shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article.

Isolation of Diseased Animals by Notice served by Inspector of Local Authority.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority, unless satisfied by an inquiry under the preceding Article

that the premature calving was not caused by epizootic abortion, shall forthwith cause a Notice (in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) to be served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the owner or person in charge of the cow affected requiring that the cow and its calf (if any) be detained on or in a field, yard, shed, or other place specified in the Notice, and after the service of such Notice it shall not be lawful for any person, until the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the calving, or the previous withdrawal of the Notice by an Inspector of the Local Authority—

- (i.) to move the cow or its calf, or permit either to stray, from or out of such field, yard, shed, or other place, except as hereinafter provided;
- (ii.) to permit the cow or its calf to come in contact with any bull or cow (other than a calf); or
- (iii.) to remove from or out of such field, yard, shed, or other place any dung, fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with the cow, without the written permission of an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) The owner or person in charge of the cow or calf shall from time to time, as often as occasion may require, or as an Inspector of the Local Authority may direct, cleanse and disinfect such internal and external parts of the cow as have been in contact with infectious membranes, discharges or other matter, and also cleanse and disinfect the calf.
- (3.) An Inspector of the Local Authority, if satisfied that the movement of a cow or its calf to which a Notice applies to some other place of detention is expedient for purposes of isolation or other necessary purpose, may by Licence authorise such movement, and the cow or its calf may thereupon be so moved, subject to the directions of the Inspector, by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, to such place of detention, and thereupon the Notice shall have effect as if such place of detention were therein specified.
- (4.) A cow or its calf detained under a Notice under this Order may be moved from or out of the place of detention specified in the Notice to a slaughterhouse, if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are situate from which the cow or calf is to be moved. On arrival at the slaughterhouse the cow or calf shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.
- (5.) Every Licence granted under this Article shall be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the cow or calf at the time of completing the movement authorised by the Licence.
- (6.) An Inspector shall with all practicable speed send copies of any Notice or Licence issued by him under this Article to the Local Authority, and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District. Where the place of destination is in another District the Inspector shall also send a copy of the Licence to the Local Authority of that District.
- (7.) A calf placed with a cow shall, for the purpose of this Article, be treated as its calf.

Provision in case of Second Case of Premature Calving.

5. Where a premature calving of a cow takes place on any farm or premises on which there is a cow which has aborted from epizootic abortion within three calendar months, the Local Authority may cause a Notice in respect of the subsequent premature calving to be served under the preceding Article without the necessity of the veterinary inquiry hereinbefore prescribed, unless at or immediately after their receipt of the information of premature calving they are furnished by the owner or person in charge of the cow with a veterinary certificate to the effect that the premature calving was not caused by epizootic abortion.

Cleansing, Disinfection and other Precautions.

- 6. The occupier of any premises on which there is a cow required by this Order to be kept separate from other animals shall take such steps as may be necessary to prevent its dung or urine coming in contact with any other cow, and shall from time to time, as occasion may require, or as an Inspector of the Local Authority may direct, cleanse and disinfect the part of the premises used for the cow in manner following:—
 - (i.) The part of the premises shall be thoroughly soaked or drenched with a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); then
 - (ii.) The part of the premises shall, if the nature thereof so permit, be scraped and, where necessary, swept, and the scrapings and sweepings and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
 - (iii.) The part of the premises shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and then be thoroughly coated or washed with—
 - (a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or
 - (b) a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid), followed by a thorough sprinkling with limewash; or
 - (c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid, followed by a thorough sprinkling with limewash.
 - (iv.) In the case of a field, yard, or other place which is not capable of being so cleansed and disinfected, it shall be sufficient if such field, yard, or place be cleansed and disinfected as far as practicable, and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be burnt or well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with cows.

Granting of Movement Licences.

. 7. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the cow or calf to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the cow or calf, or by the occupier of the farm or premises

or slaughterhouse from or to which the cow or calf is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Withdrawal of Notices of Isolation.

8. A Notice of Isolation may be withdrawn by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, served on the owner or person in charge of the cow.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

9. Epizootic abortion of cows shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (Police);

Section forty-four (General Administrative Provisions);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
 - "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
 - "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
 - "Cow" includes heifer.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Extent.

12. This Order extends to the District of the Local Authority of the county of Cornwall.

Commencement.

THE AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW (FRUIT) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

Definitions.

2. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agri-

culture and Fisheries:

"The Local Authority" means as regards any District the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"Disease" means the disease affecting gooseberry and current bushes which is known as Sphaerotheca mors-uvae or American Gooseberry Mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease.

Prohibition of Sale of Diseased Gooseberries.

3. The sale or exposure for sale of diseased gooseberries is hereby prohibited, and any person who sells or exposes for sale diseased gooseberries or causes or permits any such sale or exposure shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, unless he proves that he did not know that the gooseberries were diseased.

Regulation of Importation of Gooseberries.

4.—(1.) The landing in England or Wales of any gooseberries brought from any place outside Great Britain (except the Channel Islands) is prohibited except where there is attached to the package in which the fruit is imported a label bearing the words "Imported gooseberries," and stating the country and district in which the fruit was produced, and either the name of the consignor, or a distinctive name or mark previously registered with the Board for the purposes of this Article.

(2.) The label required by this article shall not be erased or obliterated or detached from the package so long as any of the imported

gooseberries remain therein.

Information to be given as to Imported Gooseberries.

5. Every person who has or has had in his possession any imported gooseberries, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any imported gooseberries, shall, if so required in writing by the Board, or the Local Authority, or an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, give the Board, or the Local Authority, or the Inspector, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the country and district in which the fruit was produced and the consignor by whom, and the consignee to whom, the fruit was consigned to England or Wales. Provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any proceedings under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Cleansing of Packages containing Diseased Gooseberries.

6. A package which has contained diseased gooseberries shall, after the removal of all

gooseberries therefrom, and before the package is used for packing gooseberries or any other description of fruit, be thoroughly cleansed by washing, or other suitable method, by the owner or person in charge of the package.

Powers of Inspectors to Enforce Cleansing of Packages.

7. An Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority may by notice served on any person who has in his possession or under his charge a package which contains or has contained any imported gooseberries or any diseased gooseberries, whether imported or not, require such person to cleanse the package thoroughly to his satisfaction by washing or other suitable method, or if such person so prefer, to destroy the same forthwith in the presence of the Inspector, and for the purpose of cleansing to remove from the package any fruit therein.

Power to Prohibit Removal of Packages containing Diseased Gooseberries.

8. An Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority may, by notice served on any person who has in his possession or under his charge a package which contains any diseased gooseberries, prohibit the removal of the package from the premises where it is, until the diseased gooseberries are removed therefrom.

Powers of Entry.

9. Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, or by the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that there are any imported or diseased gooseberries or is any package which contains or has contained any such gooseberries, and examine the gooseberries and packages on such premises.

Offences.

- 10. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—
 - (1.) in contravention of this Order erases or obliterates or detaches a label from a package; or
 - (2.) refuses or fails to give any information required under Article 5, or gives false information; or

(3.) fails to cleanse any package in accord-

ance with Article 6; or

(4.) when served with a notice under
Article 7, fails to cleanse or destroy in the
prescribed manner the package to which the
notice relates, or to remove the fruit therefrom: or

from; or
(5.) removes any package in contravention of a notice served under Article 8; or

(6.) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

Revocation of Order.

- 11.—(1.) The American Gooseberry Mildew (Fruit) Order of 1912 is hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not—
 - (i.) affect the previous operation of that Order or anything duly done or suffered under that Order; or
 - (ii.) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under that Order; or

(iii.) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against that Order; or

(iv.) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

(2.) Every notice served under the Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if it were a notice under this Order.

Execution of the Order.

12. Each Local Authority shall carry into effect this Order within their District, and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of May, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the GOOSEBERRY MILDEW AMERICAN (FRUIT) ORDER OF 1914.
