Treasury Chambers, June 16th, 1914.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 3rd March, and concluded on the 13th May, 1914, the following verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold and silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint, from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one

thousand nine hundred and thirteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to 127 sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and to 31 half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus three thousandths of an ounce (- .003 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the

said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus nine hundred thousandths (or + .00009), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue ten sovereigns and four half-sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first, 123.396 grains, the second 123.348 grains, the third 123.196 grains, the fourth 123.220 grains, the fifth 123.234 grains, the sixth 123.344 grains, the seventh 123.214 grains, the eighth 123.400 grains, the ninth 123.197 grains, and the tenth 123.406 grains, and that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively, the first, 61.711 grains, the second 61.563 grains, the third 61.669 grains, and the fourth 61.724 grains. We then assayed the said ten sovereigns and four half-sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.71, the second 916.81, the third 916.87, the fourth 916.84, the fifth 916.84, the sixth 916.81, the seventh 916.72, the eighth 916.68, the ninth 916.94, \mathbf{and} the tenth 916.88 tively, \mathbf{and} the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereigns to be, the first 916.51, 916.70, secondthe third 916.68, and the fourth 916.58 respectively. We also took a coin from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether sixteen half-crowns, twenty florins, twenty four shillings, fifteen sixpences, one fourpence, eighteen pences, one twopence, and one penny, and weighed each of the said silver coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the said Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus six thousandths of an ounce (- .006 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus eight ten thousandths (or - .0008), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue one half-crown, one florin, one shilling, one sixpence, and one threepence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such halfcrown weighed 217.908 grains, that such florin weighed 173.987 grains, that such shilling weighed 87.481 grains, that such sixpence weighed 43.600 grains, and that such threepence weighed 21.916 grains. We then assayed the said half-crown, the said florin, the said shilling, the said sixpence, and the said threepence separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crown to be 924.5, of such florin to be 925.1, of such shilling to be 924.9, of such sixpence to be 925.0, and of such threepence to be 926.2.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE SYDNEY BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took two coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to one hundred and two sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was nil on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus fourteen hundred thousandths (or + .00014), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue six sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123.199 grains, the second 123.370 grains, the

third 123.226 grains, the fourth 123.255 grains, the fifth 123.262 grains, and the sixth 123.180 grains. We then assayed the said six sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.88, the second 916.98, the third 916.64, the fourth 916.93, the fifth 916.84, and the sixth 916.91 respectively.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, to the thirtyfirst day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to ninety-six sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two thousandths of an ounce (+ .002 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus twenty-two hundred thousandths (or + .00022), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH JUNE 1914.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and fourteen, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of June, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

GUILDFORD ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the borough of Guildford to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough, as the case may be, and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.

- 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected place and their movement not being prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.
- (2.) Swine may be moved to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as amended by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911, authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Guildford.
- (3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.
- (6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Guildford, who, before countersigning the de-

- claration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.
- (10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or sale-yard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughterhouse specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.
- (11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorised by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.
- (12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.
- (13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed

or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes

prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Guildford, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter pro-
- (3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of Place of Destination.

A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any market, fairground or saleyard, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the person using the same for such purpose, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—
"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases

of Animals Act, 1894:
"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected place under any order of the Board:

"Slaughter-house" includes bacon-fac-

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Prohibition of Landing of Animals from Belfast.

· 1. No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Belfast shall be landed at any port or place in Great Britain.

Prohibition of Landing from other authorised Irish Ports except for slaughter within certain Landing Places.

- 2.—(1.) Notwithstanding Article 3 (3) of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1914 (No. 14), cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland after the making of this Order shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Board, be moved out of the Landing Place at which they are landed, and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.
- (2.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland after the making of this Order shall not be landed at either of the Landing Places for Irish animals at Cumberland Basin (Bristol) or Ramsden Dock Station (Barrowin-Furness).

Special Provision as to Animals Destined for Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.

3. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place, shall not be carried through the Eastham lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Board, and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5. It any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
