#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of May, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twentyfour, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of ten benefices, all of which are situate in the county of Kent, and in the Diocese of Rochester, namely the benefice (being a rectory) of Cliffe at Hoo, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Eynsford, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Farningham, the benefice (being a rectory) of Halstead, the benefice (being a rectory) of Hayes, the benefice (being a rectory) of Keston, the benefice (being a rectory) of Kockholt, the benefice (being a rectory) of Orpington, and the benefice (being a rectory and a vicarage) of Wrotham, by way of exchange for the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of or presentation to each of eleven benefices, all of which are situate in the county of Kent, and in the Diocese of Canterbury, namely the benefice (being a vicarage) of Bearstead, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Boughton Monchelsea, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Boughton

age) of Boxley, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Chart Sutton, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Goudhurst, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Hartlip, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Rolvenden, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Stockbury, the benefice (being a vicarage with chapelry annexed) of Sutton Valence with East Sutton, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Woodnesborough.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said ten benefices of Cliffe at Hoo, Eynsford, Farningham, Halstead, Hayes, Keston, Knockholt, Meopham, Orpington, and Wrotham, is vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishoprick.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said eleven benefices of Ashford, Bearstead, Boughton Monchelsea, Boxley, Chart Sutton, Goudhurst, Hartlip, Rolvenden, Stockbury, Sutton Valence with East Sutton, and Woodnesborough, is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Rochester.

"And whereas the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and the said Dean and Chapter of Rochester, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said twenty-one benefices may be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said twenty-one benefices, and of the patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said twenty-one benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canter-

bury (in testimony of which consent he has affixed his signature and archiepiscopal seal to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of Rochester (in testimony of which consent they have caused their common or capital r seal to be affixed to this Scheme) we, the aid Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Engle, humbly recommend and propose that upc, and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation. to each of the said ten benefices of Cliffe at Farningham, Hoo, Eynsford, Halstead, Hayes, Keston, Knockholt, Meopham, Orpington, and Wrotham, and the churches thereof, shall be assigned and transferred from the said. Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and from his successors in the same Archbishoprick, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may, from time to-time, and at all times, be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Rochester for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said eleven benefices. of Ashford, Bearstead, Boughton Monchelsea, Boxley, Chart Sutton, Goudhurst, Hartlip, Rolvenden, Stockbury, Sutton Valence with East Sutton, and Woodnesborough, and the churches thereof, shall in like manner, and upon and from the same date, be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of Rochester, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may, from time to time, and at all times, be exercised by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent usfrom recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the 28th day of May, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and four-teenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, in the county of Berks, and in the diocese of Oxford.

county of Berks, and in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 13th day of June, in the year 1913, and published in the London Gazette on the same day, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, situate in the parish of Saint Aldate. Oxford, partly in the county of Oxford, and

partly in the said county of Berks, and wholly in the said diocese of Oxford, and the said district chapelry was named 'the district chapelry of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us, to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representa-tion), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose, that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, shall be altered so that all those portions of the parish of North Hinksey, and of the parish of South Hinksey, both in the said county of Berks, and in the said diocese of Oxford, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon coloured pink and green respectively, shall be dissevered

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from such parishes, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme or representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, in the county of Berks, and in the diocese of Oxford, being:-

"I. All that portion of the detached area of the parish of North Hinksey, in the said county, and diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Oxford, upon the west by the parish of Saint Thomas the Martyr (otherwise Saint Nicholas), Oxford, both in the county of Oxford, and in the said diocese of Oxford, upon the south and upon the east by the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the northeast, by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries Abingdon Road over the River Thames or Isis at Folly Lock, where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, the parish of Saint Aldate, Oxford, in the said county of Oxford, and in the said diocese of Oxford, and the said parish of North Hinksey all meet, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of the said river for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the parish of North Hinksey from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Oxford.

"II. And also all that detached portion of the parish of South Hinksey, in the said county of Berks, and in the said diocese of Oxford, which by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 25th day of March, in the year 1885, was annexed for civil purposes to the parish of Saint Aldate.'

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in that portion of the coast and islands of the Persian Gulf and Gulf of Oman which is within the dominions of His Majesty the Shah of Persia;

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 7th day of May, 1907, and cited as "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907," provision was made for the exercise of such jurisdiction by a Court held by the person for the time being holding the office of His Majesty's Consul-General for Fars and the coasts and islands of the Persian Gulf, and of Political Resident in the Persian Gulf, or by the Judicial Assistant;

And whereas by an Act passed in the 37th year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "The Slave Trade (East African Courts) Act, 1873," it was, amongst

other things, provided that:-

"Where any Treaty in relation to the Slave Trade is made after the passing of this Act, by or on behalf of Her Majesty, with any foreign State in Arabia, or on the East Coast of Africa, or on the shores of the Persian Gulf, or in any island lying off Arabia or off such coast or shores, including the islands of Zanzibar and Madagascar, and the Comoro Islands, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that as from such date, not being earlier than the date of the Treaty, as may be specified in the Order, such Treaty shall be deemed, and thereupon (as from the said date, or if no date is specified, as from the date of such Order) such Treaty shall be deemed to be an existing East African Slave Trade Treaty within the meaning of this Act, and the provisions of this Act shall apply and be construed accordingly.'

And it was further provided that:—
"Her Majesty may by such Order, or any subsequent Order referring to the same Treaty, direct that any Court, Consul, or person authorized by or in pursuance of an Order in Council to exercise within the dominions of the foreign State with whom the Treaty is made jurisdiction in matters relating to the Slave Trade shall, subject to the conditions, exceptions, and limitations, if any, contained in the Order, exercise all the jurisdiction conferred by this Act on the East African Courts; and such Court, Consul, or person, when exercising such jurisdiction, shall be deemed to be one of the East African Courts within the meaning of this Act;"

And whereas on the 2nd day of March, 1882, a Treaty or Convention was concluded between Her late Majesty and His Majesty the Shah of Persia for the suppression of the Slave Trade, in the following terms, that is to say:

'In the Name of God, the Almighty, all

Merciful.

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Shah of Persia, being mutually animated by a sincere desire to co-operate for the extinction of the barbarous Traffic in Slaves, have resolved to conclude a Convention for the purpose of attaining this object, and have named

as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—
"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Ronald Ferguson Thomson, Esquire, Her Énvoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of

"And His Majesty the Shah of Persia, his Excellency Mirza Saeed Khan, his Minister

for Foreign Affairs;
"Who, after having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:-

#### "ARTICLE I.

"In order to prevent the chance of negro slaves, male and female, being imported into Persia, British cruisers shall be permitted to visit and detain merchant-vessels under the Persian flag, or belonging to Persian subjects, which may be engaged in, or which there may be reasonable grounds for suspecting to be or to have been engaged, during the voyage on which they are met, in carrying slaves; and if any such slaves are found on board such merchant-vessels, the vessel, with all on board, shall be taken before the nearest Persian authorities for trial. But no person whatsoever who, being furnished with a Government passport, countersigned by a British resident or consul, may have gone from Persia to visit the places of pilgrimage shall, when returning, be interfered with, provided such person be not accompanied by more negroes, either male or female, than the number mentioned in his original pass. The presence of any such additional negro or negroes shall be prima facie evidence of an attempted Traffic in Slaves.

#### "ARTICLE II.

"If any merchant-vessel under the Persian flag be captured by a British cruiser and taken into a Persian port for adjudication, it shall be the officer of the British cruiser making the capture, or some duly authorized officer of the British Government, who shall be present at such adjudication.

"In the event of the captured merchantvessel being condemned and sold the proceeds of such sale shall go to the Persian Government, and all slaves found on board such vessel shall be handed over to the British

authorities.

#### "ARTICLE III.

"His Majesty the Shah of Persia agrees to punish severely all Persian subjects foreigners amenable to Persian jurisdiction who may be found engaging in Slave Traffic by sea, and to manumit and guarantee the safety and proper treatment of all slaves illegally imported, that is to say, imported by sea, into His Majesty's dominions after the signature of the present Convention.

#### "ARTICLE IV.

"The present Convention shall come into operation on the first of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two. After the Convention shall so have been brought into operation Article XIII of the Treaty between Great Britain and Persia, signed at Paris on the fourth of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, by which the agreement entered into by Great Britain and Persia in August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, was renewed, shall be considered as cancelled except as to any proceeding that may have already been taken or commenced in virtue thereof.

#### "ARTICLE V.

"The ratifications of the present Convention shall be exchanged at Tehran within five months or sooner, if practicable.

"Done at Tehran in quadruplicate, this second day of the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

- Subject to the provisions of this Order, it shall be lawful for the Court established under "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907," to exercise jurisdiction in matters relating to the Slave Trade.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Court established under "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907," shall exercise all the jurisdiction conferred by "The Slave Trade (East African Courts) Act, 1873," on the East African Courts, and the said Court, when exercising such jurisdiction, shall be deemed to be one of the East African Courts within the meaning of the said
- 4. This Order shall be published in the "Gazette of India" within such time after the passing thereof as the Secretary of State may prescribe, and shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1914.
- 5. This Order may be cited as "The Persian Coast and Islands (Slave Trade Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1914," and shall be read as one with "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907."

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Crewe, K.G., and the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, K.G., two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

"And whereas the intention of the Order in Council of the 2nd November, 1907, was to place the Army and Navy on the same footing

in the matter of double time:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to allow the additional concession as regards service in Egypt to Seamen and Marines, as from the date upon which it was granted to the Army, and also to apply any such privileges which may in future be granted to men of the Army to Seamen and Marines under the same conditions.

Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to allow Privates and Buglers of the Royal Marines to be classed as Corporals for pension purposes after 5 years' service on the recognised Establishment of a Divisional or Depôt Band, and also to extend to those Privates, Buglers and Musicians who qualify for Non-Commissioned Officers' pension the privilege of earning the Long Service and Good Conduct gratuity to the same extent and under the same conditions as Corporals:


