“ And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, may properly be carried into effect.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he hath to this Scheme set his hand and his archiepiscopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, each of the said Archdeaconries of Canterbury and Maidstone shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in order under its name, and are numbered consecutively in the Sche-

dule to this Scheme annexed, and that every parish or cure or church, the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any Rural Deanery in the first column of the said Schedule, shall belong to and be a part of the Rural Deanery, and of the Archdeaconry, under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof, and shall not any longer belong to, or be a part of, any other Rural Deanery, or of any other Archdeaconry, or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean, or of any other Archdeacon.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
