

England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 5s. will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF LONDON.

HIGH STREET, ELTHAM.

To the London County Council;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the London County Council for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of High-street, Eltham, within the Metropolitan Borough of Woolwich:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of High-street, Eltham, within the Metropolitan Borough of Woolwich, as extends from its junction with Sherard-road to its junction with Victoria-road.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the Twenty-seventh day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

URBAN DISTRICT OF CHESHUNT.

To the County Council of Hertford;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Hertford for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads within the Urban District of Cheshunt:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the Urban District of Cheshunt which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the Twenty-seventh day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

SCHEDULE.

So much of the Cambridge-road as extends from a point opposite the south corner of the building of the Waltham Cross Electric Theatre to a point 25 yards north of Park-lane; and

So much of the Eleanor Cross-road as extends from its junction with the Cambridge-road aforesaid to a point 60 yards east of the railings of the Eleanor Cross monument.
