Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (Customs) Amendment Order in Council, 1914, and shall be construed and read

as one with the Principal Order.

2. Article 47 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the following substituted

in lieu thereof, that is to say:---

No Customs duties levied on any articles other than tobacco in any form and intoxicating liquors of any kind, produced or manufactured in any part of His Majesty's Dominions or in any British Protectorate and imported into Southern Rhodesia, shall exceed in amount the duties levied on similar articles from oversea according to the tariff in force in the South African Customs Union at the date of coming into operation of the Principal Order or the tariff contained in the Customs Union Convention concluded between the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, the Orange Free State and Natal in May, 1898, whichever are the higher.

3. "The Cigarette, Excise and Surtax Ordinance, 1914," of Southern Rhodesia shall

3. "The Cigarette, Excise and Surtax Ordinance, 1914," of Southern Rhodesia shall be and remain in force from the date of coming into operation until other provision be made by the Legislative Council of Southern Rhodesia.

  4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith, and shall be published in the Gazette; and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.
- 5. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.
