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tion year or a period from the end of that contribution year to the expiration of three weeks after the date on which the Welsh Insurance Commissioners have furnished or may furnish the Society with the particulars necessary for calculating his arrears, whichever period is the longer, and the period of grace after the end of that contribution year shall, so far as relates to him, be a period of thirteen weeks from the end of that year or a period from the end of the year to the expiration of seven weeks from the date on which the Welsh Insurance Commissioners furnish the Society with the particulars aforesaid, whichever period is the longer.

(2) If any part of the period of grace, as so extended, falls within the first penalty year, that year shall, so far as relates to the member, be treated as commencing on the first Monday after the end of the period of grace, or, if the Welsh Insurance Commissioners have authorised the society to fix some other day of the week for the commencement of the penalty year, as commencing on the first day so fixed after the end of the period of grace.

3. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order (No. 2), 1914, and shall be read as one with the three Orders above mentioned, and those Orders and this Order may together be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Orders, 1913 and 1914.
