“WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated

Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Handsworth, situate within the Parish of Handsworth, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Birmingham.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Handsworth, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint James, Handsworth, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder-written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parish and New Parish respectively.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Handsworth, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Handsworth, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Handsworth, situate as aforesaid.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Russell, Bishop of Birmingham, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Rectory of the said Parish of Handsworth, as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint

James, Handsworth, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Handsworth, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Handsworth, which are described in the Schedule hereunder-written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto-annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Andrew, Handsworth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Handsworth.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Handsworth, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Handsworth, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon part of the south and upon the south-west by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint James, Handsworth, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west and upon the north-west by the Parish of West Bromwich, in the said County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield, upon the north and upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Hamstead, in the said County of Stafford, and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Hamstead, from the said Parish of Handsworth at the centre of the bridge which carries the road called Hamstead Hill across the River Tame, and extending thence southward along the middle of Hamstead Hill for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Handsworth Wood Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Handsworth Wood Road for a distance of nineteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Devonshire Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Devonshire Road for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway or footpath leading to the house called Oaklands, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the premises attached to such house, and extending thence first south-eastward along the said fence and then south-westward along the fence forming the eastern boundary of the said premises for a distance in all of eleven chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned fence meets the northern side of Church Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Church Lane for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grove Lane and

Oxhill Road, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Handsworth from the said New Parish of Saint James, Handsworth.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint James, Handsworth, which is bounded upon the south-east by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter, Handsworth, in the said County of Stafford, and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, upon the north-east by the said Parish of Handsworth, upon the north by the above-described portion of the same Parish, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south-west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Handsworth from the said New Parish of Saint James, Handsworth, at the junction of Oxhill Road with Sandwell Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Sandwell Road for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Newcombe Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Newcombe Road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Aylesford Road, and extending thence first southward and then eastward along the middle of Aylesford Road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rookery Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Rookery Road for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Antrobus Road, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Antrobus Road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading into Brunswick Road, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Handsworth, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter, Handsworth."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. come and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

“And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous, and it appears to us to be expedient, that towards the cost of effecting the said improvements a sum of 350*l.* (being a sum which, together with the amount of the outstanding balance of the sums already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by the borrowing of the same sum by way of Mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments, which now belong, or may hereafter belong, to the Bishoprick of Lichfield:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the

said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding 350*l.*, and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and endowments or emoluments, which now belong, or may hereafter belong, to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for the term of twenty years or until the said sum, so to be borrowed as aforesaid, with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the Mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly, at the end of the second period of twelve months, so computed, and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, one-fifteenth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also, at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that, if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore-mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors and assigns, to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof, by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale, and that such Mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said John Augustine, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest, costs and charges, shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum, so to be borrowed as aforesaid, shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that the receipt of one of our Joint Treasurers for the time being, indorsed on the said Mortgage Deed, shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum, so to be borrowed as aforesaid, the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence aforesaid.

All that portion of the Parish of Wanstead, in the County of Essex, and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west partly by the District Parish of Leytonstone and partly by the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Leytonstone, upon the south-west by the last-named New Parish, upon the south partly by the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Forest Gate, partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Forest Gate, and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Forest Gate, upon the east by the Parish of Little Ilford, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Little Ilford from the said Parish of Wanstead meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Wanstead Park, and extending thence first north-westward and then generally westward along the said wall or fence (thereby following in one part the northern side of the road called Northumberland Avenue and in another part the backs of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of the road called Woodlands Avenue) for a distance of one mile and seven chains or thereabouts to its western end on the eastern side of Blake Hall Road, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Blake Hall Road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the stream flowing along the southern side of Bush Wood, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said stream for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the point where such stream turns northward, and extending thence in a straight line due west (thereby recrossing the said stream and crossing Bush Wood) for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wanstead from the said District Parish of Leytonstone.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Little Ilford which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Great Ilford, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north and upon the west by the said Parish of Wanstead, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wanstead from the said Parish of Little Ilford at a point opposite to the southern end of the wall forming the western boundary of the City of London Cemetery, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Aldersbrook Road) for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the said wall on the north-eastern side of Aldersbrook Road, and extending thence first north-westward along the said wall and then north-eastward along the wall forming the northern boundary of the said Cemetery for a distance in all of thirty-three chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the said Cemetery, and extending thence first north-eastward along the wall or fence which extends in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary wall and forms the southern boundary of the

Wanstead Urban District Council's Sewage Farm and then south-eastward along the wall or fence which forms the south-western boundary of the said sewage farm for a distance in all of thirty chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the western bank of the River Roding, and extending thence south-eastward to a point in the middle of the River Roding upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Little Ilford from the said Parish of Great Ilford."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with Notice to any Person or Persons interested, that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such

Union, and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present or nominate to such United Benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 20th day of April, in the year of Our Lord 1914, in the words and figures following:—

"The undersigned, Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hereby states that it having appeared to him that the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Thornton le Street and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, both in the County and Diocese of York, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice for ecclesiastical purposes under the Acts of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the 13th and 14th years of the same reign, Chapter 98, he made inquiries into the circumstances of the case, and that on such Inquiry it appeared to him that the said union might be usefully made, and that the said Benefices, if united, would not be of inconvenient extent, and that he therefore caused to be published as required by the said first-mentioned Act a statement in writing of the facts, with notice to any person or persons interested to show cause in writing within the time prescribed by the said Act against such Union, and that such time has expired without any reasonable cause having been shown to him. Wherefore the said Archbishop doth hereby, pursuant to the said first-mentioned Act, certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances of the case respecting the said Union appeared on the before-mentioned Inquiry to be as follows:—

"That the said two Vicarages and Benefices are contiguous.

"That the aggregate population of the Parishes of the said two Benefices, according to the latest returns of population made under the authority of Parliament, does not exceed 707 persons, the population of Thornton le Street being 150, made up as follows:—

Thornton le Street	-	-	-	100
North Kilvington	-	-	-	50

and the population of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans being 557, made up as follows:—

North Otterington	-	-	-	75
Thornton le Moor	-	-	-	285
Thornton le Beans	-	-	-	197

"That the net yearly value of the Benefice of Thornton le Street is £165 or thereabouts, and the net yearly value of the Benefice of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, is £200 or thereabouts, to

which there should be added a special endowment of £94 per year for the Stipend and provision of an Assistant Curate for the Parish of North Otterington.

"That there is one Church belonging to the Benefice of Thornton le Street, and three Churches belonging to the Benefice of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, sufficient for the accommodation of the Inhabitants of the Parishes of such United Benefice.

"That each of the said Benefices has a House of Residence, and, in case the proposed union of such Benefices shall be carried into effect, it is proposed that the Vicar of the United Benefice shall use the Parsonage House of the Benefice of Thornton le Street as the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and that the Parsonage House of the Benefice of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, shall be assigned as the Residence House of the Assistant Curate.

"That the Patronage of the Benefice of Thornton le Street is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford, and that of the Benefice of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, is vested in the Archbishop in right of his See, and they have signified their Consent to the Union hereinbefore proposed.

"That the Reverend Frank Hilton Jackson, Clerk, M.A., is the present Vicar of the said Vicarage and Benefice of Thornton le Street, and he is also a consenting party hereto.

"That the said Benefice of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, is now vacant.

"That if the proposed Union is carried into effect it is proposed that the Patronage or Right of Presentation to the said United Benefice of Thornton le Street, with North Otterington, Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, shall be vested jointly in the said Dean and Chapter of Christ Church, Oxford, and the said Archbishop, who shall exercise the Right of Patronage as follows:—On the occasion of the next vacancy which shall occur after the taking effect of this Scheme the said Archbishop and his Successors shall be entitled to exercise the Right of Presentation, and on the occasion of the second vacancy after the taking effect of this Scheme the Right of Presentation shall be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Christ Church, Oxford, and thereafter the said Archbishop and his Successors, and the said Dean and Chapter of Christ Church, Oxford, shall exercise the Right of Presentation to the said United Benefice alternately.

"That if the proposed Union be carried into effect the said United Benefice shall be known by the name of 'Thornton le Street, with North Otterington, Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans.'

"The said Inquiry and Consents are thus certified by the said Archbishop to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may by virtue of the said Acts issue an Order, if Your Majesty in Council shall so think fit, for uniting the said Benefices of Thornton le Street, with North Otterington, Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"COSMO. EBOR."

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is

pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Vicarage of Thornton le Street, situate in the County and Diocese of York, and the Vicarage of North Otterington, with Thornton le Moor, and Thornton le Beans, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows, that is to say:—The first turn or right of presentation shall belong to, and be exercised by, the said Archbishop of York and his Successors, and the second turn or right of presentation shall belong to, and be exercised by, the said Dean and Chapter of Christ Church, Oxford, and thereafter the said Archbishop and his Successors, and the said Dean and Chapter of Christ Church, Oxford, shall exercise the right of presentation alternately.

WHEREAS by Section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more Benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act, should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when two or more Benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one Benefice, and, with respect to his own Diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the Benefices within his Diocese, of which such United Benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and, if on such Inquiry, it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such Benefice or Benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such Inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in Writing of the Facts, and in all other Cases a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer Door of the Church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the Benefices forming part of the United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such Six Weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion, and, if no sufficient Cause be shown within such

time, the Archbishop shall Certify the Inquiry and Consent, when the Patron's Consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices from such United Benefice, and for declaring the Rights of Patronage of the several Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the Diocese to which such United Benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such Diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such United Benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such Union shall be, *ipso facto*, dissolved, so far only as regards such Benefice or Benefices so proposed to be separated from such United Benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices shall be, and be deemed and taken to be, a separate and distinct Benefice or Benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such Union had taken place, and the Patron or Patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no Benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the Consent in Writing of the Patron or Patrons thereof."

And whereas by Section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that "Whenever two or more Benefices which have at any time been united into one Benefice shall be disunited and become separate Benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of Benefices of which such United Benefice consisted, or to one or more of such Benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the Consent of the Patron or Patrons of such Benefices respectively. (such consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons), to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such United Benefice to each of such Benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the Benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such Benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole United Benefice."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 13th day of February, 1914, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Brocklesby and the Vicarage of Kirmington, in the County and my

Diocese of Lincoln, by the separation of the said Vicarage of Kirmington from the said Rectory of Brocklesby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

“EDWARD LINCOLN.”

And whereas, on the 25th day of February, 1914, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case.

And whereas, on the 17th day of June, 1914, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

“We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“That the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, in whose Diocese is situate the United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Brocklesby and the Vicarage of Kirmington, in the County of Lincoln, having represented unto us that the disunion of the said United Benefice, by the separation of the Vicarage of Kirmington from the Rectory of Brocklesby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such union might usefully be dissolved, and that the Right Honourable Charles Alfred Worsley Anderson Pelham, Earl of Yarborough, being the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said United Benefice of Brocklesby with Kirmington, in case the same were now vacant, consents to the proposed disunion.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed to the principal outer doors of each of the Parish Churches of Brocklesby and Kirmington, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us, the said Archbishop, against such disunion, but no sufficient cause has been shown.

“The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the said Patron of the said United Benefice, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for the disunion of the said United Benefice by the separation of the Vicarage of Kirmington from the Rectory of Brocklesby so as to constitute each of them a separate Benefice, with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only, and we recommend that the house of residence situate in the said Parish of Kirmington, with garden and orchard together with the field lying to the south of the said house and garden, and numbered 129 on the Ordnance Map, and comprising four acres now in the occupation of Mr. William Garside, shall be the house of residence and glebe of the said Vicarage of Kirmington, and that in all other respects the said Rectory of Brocklesby and the said Vicarage of Kirmington shall each retain its own original

endowments and emoluments and bear its own charges and outgoings.

“RANDALL CANTUAR.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Brocklesby and the Vicarage of Kirmington, situate in the County and Diocese of Lincoln, shall be disunited by separating the said Rectory of Brocklesby from the said Vicarage of Kirmington.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the Archbishop, with the Consent of the Patron of the said Benefices, to assign and attach to the said Vicarage of Kirmington the house of residence situate in that Parish, with the garden and orchard together with the field lying to the south of the said house and garden, and numbered 129 on the Ordnance Map, and comprising four acres, (now in the occupation of William Garside), and to direct that in all other respects the said Rectory of Brocklesby and the said Vicarage of Kirmington shall each retain its own original endowments and emoluments and bear its own charges and outgoings.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been

given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Egmonton, in the County of Nottingham, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Egmonton aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as herein-after directed.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of July, 1914, notice of such representation was given, and it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 20th day of August, 1914, and that the said Order in Council be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels

of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 20th day of August, 1914.

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 16th day of July, 1914, has been duly published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner directed by the said Order.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial ground in the said Civil Parish of Egmonton, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be and the same is hereby prohibited, and that burials in the said Parish be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

Egmonton.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, in the Parish of Egmonton, in the County of Nottingham, and in the old Churchyard adjoining the same.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

CHESHAM.

To the County Council of Buckingham;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Chesham which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the Thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

SCHEDULE.

So much of the main road through the town of Chesham (including High Street and Red Lion Street) as extends from a point 50 yards north of its junction with White Hill to a point 100 yards south-east of the Railway Bridge which crosses the main road;

So much of White Hill as extends from its junction with the main road to a point 50 yards north-east of the "Three Tuns" Public House;

Broadway, Blucher Street, and so much of Charteridge Lane (otherwise Park Road) as extends from Blucher Street to the west side of Stanley Avenue;

Church Street, from its junction with the main road aforesaid to its junction at Pednor Mead End with Wey Lane; and

Germaines Street, from its junction with the main road aforesaid to the southern extremity of Germaines Street School Premises.

COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

GERRARD'S CROSS.

To the County Council of Buckingham;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Buckingham, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a certain road at Gerrard's Cross, within the County of Buckingham, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and

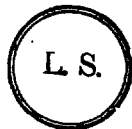

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the Packhorse Road, Gerrard's Cross, as extends from a point 50 yards south-west of its junction with the road leading past the School House, in a northerly direction over the Great Western and Great Central Railway Bridge to the Parish Boundary.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the Thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.
