given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Egmanton, in the County of Nottingham, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Egmanton aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as herein-after directed.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of July, 1914, notice of such representation was given, and it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 20th day of August, 1914, and that the said Order in Council be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels

of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 20th day of August,

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 16th day of July, 1914, has been duly published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner directed by the said Order.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial ground in the said Civil Parish of Egmanton, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be and the same is hereby prohibited, and that burials in the said Parish be discontinued as follows, viz.:-

Egmanton.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, in the Parish of Egmanton, in the County of Nottingham, and in the old Churchyard adjoining the same.
