killing or taking of the Avocet, Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe or Loon, Harrier (all species), Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Linnet, Golden Oriole, Owl (all species), Red Poll (all species), Siskin, Spoonbill, Black-winged Stilt, Tern or Sea-Swallow (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), and Woodpecker (all species) is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Great Yarmouth.

All Birds protected on Sundays.

V. During that particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the County Borough of Great Yarmouth.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Great Yarmouth:—Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-Knee), Great Crested Grebe or Loon, Kingfisher, Sand Martin, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher (Sea Pie), Ringed Plover (Ringed Dotterel, Stone Runner), Ruff or Reeve, Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wild Duck and Teal (all species), Woodcock.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 5th January, 1911, is hereby repealed.
