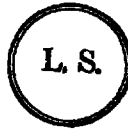
(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 24th September, 1914.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Rixton Sub-district of Warrington Registration District should be united with Winwick Sub-district of the same Registration District, and that the enlarged Sub-district should be called and known as Winwick Sub-district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.R., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Local Government Board have, by Order dated the 16th day of September, 1914, ordered, declared, specified, and directed that on and after the 28th day of October, 1914, Part II and sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50 and 51 comprised in Part III of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the District of the Borough of Marlborough aforesaid, subject as to sections 25, 27, and 30 comprised in Part II, and sections 35 and 38 comprised in Part III of the said Act, to the conditions and adaptations set forth in the Schedule to the said Order.
