NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order (No. 3), 1914,

dated October 31, 1914, made by the Insurance Commissioners under section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas this Order is intended to be supplemental to the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Orders, 1913 and 1914 (in this Order referred to as the "principal Orders"), which contained provisions for facilitating the admission to approved societies of persons who had become or were deemed to have become deposit contributors and certain consequential provisions relating to financial adjustments between the Deposit Contributors Fund and the funds of approved societies and to the conditions upon which the arrears of persons who became members of societies under the provisions of the principal Orders might be paid:

And whereas the operation of the principal Orders was limited to persons who became members of approved societies before the 3rd day of August, 1914:

And whereas the difficulties referred to in the recitals to the principal Orders with regard to persons obtaining admission to approved societies still exist, and accordingly it is expedient for the purpose of bringing into operation Part I. of the Act that the provisions of those Orders should be further extended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 78 of the Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. The principal Orders shall be read and shall have effect as if the 1st day of January, 1915, were substituted therein for the 3rd day of August, 1914.

2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order (No. 3), 1914, and shall be read as one with the principal Orders.
