

the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, in the City of London, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London, between that Benefice and four other Benefices, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Clement, City Road, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Mary, Edmonton, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Pancras, all of which Benefices are also situate in the said County of Middlesex, and in the said Diocese of London, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tillingham, which said last-named Benefice is situate in the County of Essex, and in the Diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Chapter of Saint Paul's') are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, and also of the four other Benefices aforesaid.

"And whereas the present endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, comprise amongst other things a sum of £16,549 7s. 11d. India three pounds per centum per annum Stock held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for, and for the benefit of, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, and as part of the endowments of the said Benefice.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefices of Saint Clement, City Road, Saint Mary, Edmonton, Saint Pancras, and Tillingham, are at present insufficiently endowed, and that after the transfer to, or for the benefit of, the Vicars or Incumbents of the said Benefices of such sums of Stock as are hereinafter mentioned, the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the Cure of Souls within the Cures attached to the said Benefices of Saint Clement, City Road, Saint Mary, Edmonton, Saint Pancras, and Tillingham, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, is now full of a Clerk, the Vicar or Incumbent thereof being the Reverend Nigel Mackenzie Morgan-Brown.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, acting as such Bishop, and with the consent of the Right Reverend John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with their several Episcopal Seals), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of Saint Paul's (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and also with the consent of the said Nigel Mackenzie Morgan-Brown, acting as the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same,

and as from the 25th day of December, in the year 1916, all those separate sums of Stock (together constituting all that the said sum of £16,549 7s. 11d. India three pounds per centum per annum Stock) which are specified in Column II. of the Schedule to this Scheme appended, and which at present are held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for, and for the benefit of, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, shall be transferred from such Benefice to the Benefices mentioned in Column I. of the said Schedule, and set opposite to the respective sums of Stock specified in Column II. as aforesaid, and shall be annexed to such Benefices respectively and form part of the endowments thereof.

"And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths, now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Saint Giles, Cripplegate, shall continue to be payable by the vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
