Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, that the following amendments of Statutes 119 and 125 of the Statutes of the University of London have been made by the Senate, and that copies can be obtained on application to the Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W.

Statute 119 of the Statutes of the University to be amended by adding thereto a Proviso, the said Statute as so amended running as follows:—

"119. The Senate shall make provision for holding intermediate examinations for Internal Students or External Students in such subjects and at such periods and under such conditions as may be prescribed, and the Senate may if in its discretion it think fit to do so make arrangements to hold any intermediate examination or some part thereof for the Students of any School of the University jointly with the Governing Body of such School. Provided that during the continuance of the War begun in 1914 and a period of two years after the conclusion of such War the Senate shall have power to prescribe in special cases for Students of the University and of foreign Universities and foreign Institutions of similar rank whose studies have been interrupted owing to the War special examinations in lieu of the intermediate examinations for Internal or External Students."

Statute 125 of the Statutes of the University to be amended by adding thereto two Clauses numbered (3) and (4), the said Statute as so amended running as follows:—

"125. Except as hereinafter provided no person shall be admitted to a first degree in the University as an Internal Student unless and until he has completed an approved course of study comprising all the subjects in which he presents himself and extending over not less than three years. Such three years shall be calculated from a date not earlier than matriculation unless the Senate shall either generally by regulation or in special cases allow the same to be calculated from a date not exceeding four months before matriculation. Any person who has passed the intermediate examination Any person before he is registered as an Internal Student may be allowed to take the final examination for the first degree before the end of a three years' course provided that subsequently to passing the intermediate examination he shall have attended for two years an approved course of study for the final examination. passes that examination he shall be admitted

to the degree without further examination, but not until he shall have completed three years of study as an Internal Student by attending subsequently to passing the final examination a further approved course of study and not unless the Authorities of the School or Institution at which such course is held have certified that his attendance and progress have been satisfactory. Provided that

(1) A person who has presented himself for a final examination for a first degree as an Internal Student and has failed may be permitted to present himself on a subsequent occasion for such final examination as an Internal Student in subjects other than those in which he presented himself on the first occasion after such further course if any as the Senate shall generally by regulation or in special cases determine.

(2) A course of study extending over not more than one year taken in another University approved for the purpose subsequently to the passing of the intermediate examination may be accepted in lieu of an approved course of study taken in this University subject to such regulations as the Senate may from time to time prescribe.

(3) During the continuance of the War begun in 1914 and after its termination for such period as the Senate shall see fit the Senate shall have power to waive the conditions of this Statute in such a way as will prevent as far as possible any Internal Student of the University from being placed at a disadvantage through going on active service or undertaking other approved duties in connection with national defence.

(4) During the period aforesaid the Senate shall have power to waive the conditions of this Statute in such manner as they shall see fit in special cases in respect of students of foreign Universities and foreign Institutions of similar rank whose studies therein have been interrupted owing to the War begun in 1914 and who have become Internal Students of the University and have pursued a course of study therein extending over not less than one academic year.

For the purposes of this Statute the date of matriculation shall be taken to be the first day of the matriculation examination at which the candidate passed or in respect of which he was registered."

Order XI., Rule 8.

Order by the Lord Chancellor.

I, Richard Burdon Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, by virtue of Order XI., Rule 8, of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883, and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, hereby order as follows:—

Order XI., Rule 8, of the Rules of the Supreme Court shall, until further order, cease to apply to the German Empire.

## NATIONAL INSURANCE. NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1914, dated November 20, 1914, made by the Insurance Commissioners under section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with respect to bringing into operation Part I of the Act the Insurance Commissioners with the consent of the Treasury may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that Part of the Act into operation, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas, by virtue of paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act, if the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor at the commencement of the year is insufficient to provide the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes of medical benefit and sanatorium benefit, and towards the expenses of administration, that contributor is not, unless the Insurance Committee consents, and except subject to such conditions as the Committee may impose, entitled to any benefits during that year:

pose, entitled to any benefits during that year:
And whereas by Section 3 of the National Insurance Act, 1913 (in this Order called "the amending Act") it is enacted that Part I of the Act shall apply to persons who at the commencement of the Act were of the age of sixty-five and upwards and under the age of seventy, provided that a person who is of the age of sixty-five or upwards at the date of entry into insurance shall not be entitled to medical benefit after he attains the age of seventy, unless the number of weekly contributions paid by or in respect of him exceeds twenty-six:

And whereas it will not in all cases be possible at the commencement of the year 1915 to ascertain whether the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund will be sufficient to provide the sums aforesaid or whether the number of weekly contributions paid by or in respect of him exceeds twenty-six:

And whereas, by reason of the premises deposit contributors will, unless this Order is made, as respects the year 1915, be deprived of benefits to which they might otherwise have

been entitled, and accordingly a difficulty has arisen within the meaning of the said Section 78:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act—

(1) (a) A deposit contributor who on the 6th day of July, 1914, had an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of the period from the 1st day of January, 1915, to the 31st day of March, 1915, and

(b) a deposit contributor by or in respect of whom any contributions were paid during the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 5th day of July, 1914,

shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during the period from the 1st day of January, 1915, to the 31st day of March, 1915.

(2) A deposit contributor who entered into insurance before the 4th day of January, 1915, and by or in respect of whom no contributions were paid during the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 5th day of July, 1914, and who, on the 6th day of July, 1914, had not an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of the period from the 1st day of January, 1915, to the 31st day of March, 1915, shall not in any event be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during that period.

(3) If the amount standing to the credit of such deposit contributor as aforesaid in the Deposit Contributors Fund on the 4th day of

January, 1915, is sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable as aforesaid in respect of the period from the 1st day of April, 1915, to the 30th day of September, 1915, or of the period from the 1st day of July, 1915, to the 30th day of September, 1915, he shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during the period for which the amount is sufficient, and if the amount standing to his credit on the 4th day of July, 1915, is sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable as aforesaid in respect of the period from the 1st day of October, 1915, to the 31st day of December, 1915, he shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during that period.

- 2.—(1) A deposit contributor who attains the age of seventy after the 5th day of July, 1914, shall, notwithstanding anything in Section 3 of the amending Act, and subject to the provisions of this Order, be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit after he attains the age of seventy, if he entered into insurance more than twenty-six weeks before he attains that age.
- (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) (b) of Article 1 of this Order shall not apply to a deposit contributor who attained the age of seventy before the 6th day of July, 1914.
- 3. There shall be deducted, at such times as the Insurance Commissioners may determine, from the amount standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund the proper proportion for the periods or period during which he is by virtue of the foregoing provisions of this Order entitled to benefit of the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1915.

Provided that if it appears at any time that the amount so standing to the credit of a deposit contributor who becomes entitled to benefit as aforesaid was not sufficient to provide for that deduction, the Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, deduct from any contributions paid by or in respect of him in respect of the year 1915, such sum as together with any sum so standing to his credit as aforesaid, will be equal to the proper proportion of the sums so payable in respect of him.

4.—(1) The Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, continue the right to benefit of any deposit contributor to whom the provisions of Article 1 of this Order apply for a succeeding or any subsequent period up to and including the 31st day of December, 1915, if there is standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund before the beginning of each such further period or periods, an amount equal to the proper proportion for such further period or periods of the sums payable in respect of him under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1915, and there shall be deducted at such times as the Insurance Commissioners may determine from the amount so standing to his credit a sum equal to the proper proportion for such period or periods of the sums so payable as aforesaid.

(2) When a deposit contributor who is entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit before he attains the age of seventy entered into insurance within twenty-

six weeks of his attaining that age, there shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund the proper proportion of the sums payable in respect of him under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the period or periods commencing on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October, 1915, as the case may be, during which he is entitled to receive medical and sanatorium benefit.

- 5. Where a deposit contributor is entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit, but, at the date when he becomes so entitled, arrangements have not been made for providing those benefits, there shall, as soon as may be after those arrangements have been made, be deducted from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund, a sum equal to the proper proportion payable in respect of him, so, however, that the period or periods for which any such deduction is made, shall be a period or periods commencing on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, or the 1st day of October, whichever of the said dates is next before the date when the said arrangements were made.
- 6. During the period from the date of this Order to the 31st day of December, 1914, no payment on account of sickness benefit or maternity benefit shall, unless the Insurance Commissioners otherwise determine, be made to a deposit contributor of an amount greater than the excess (if any) of the amount then standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund over the sums properly payable under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1915, but if the amount standing to his credit on the 4th day of January, 1915, is in excess of the sums properly payable as aforesaid for the year 1915, any benefit with-beld under the foregoing provision shall, so far as may be, be paid forthwith out of the excess.
- 7. In the case of an insured person who, being a deposit contributor, becomes insured under the provisions of Section 46 of the Act, or ceases to be insured under the provisions of that Section, and again becomes a deposit contributor, such adjustment shall be made in the amounts to be deducted in respect of the years 1914 and 1915 as, having regard to the dates at which the insured person becomes, or ceases to be, insured under the provisions of the said Section, appear to the Commissioners to be just and necessary.
- 8.—(1) Save as otherwise expressly provided, the expression "Deposit Contributor" means, for the purposes of Articles 1, 3 and 4 of this Order, a deposit contributor who, if the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund were not insufficient for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act, would be entitled to medical benefit and sanatorium benefit.
- (2) In this Order, for the purpose of calculating the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of a deposit contributor to whom this Order applies, no account shall be taken of such part of those sums as is payable out of moneys provided by Parliament.
  - (3) In this Order a period of time from a

WHEREAS a new church has been built within the parish of Chitterne All Saints, in the county of Wilts and in the diocese of Salisbury, and has been consecrated and is known by the name of All Saints and Saint Mary.

And whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Edward, Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury, as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said parish of Chitterne All Saints, and the Reverend John Thomas Canner, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the sixth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, certified by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Chitterne All Saints that the said new church of All Saints and Saint Mary, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (known by the name of All Saints) of the same parish.

Now therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Vic-

### NOTTINGHAM CORPORATION (TRENT NAVIGATION TRANSFER.)

(Transfer οf Part of Undertaking Trent Navigation Company to Nottingham Corporation; Power to Corporation to Construct Locks and Other Works Authorized by Trent Navigation Act, 1906; Revival of Powers for taking Lands and Extension of Time for Construction of Works; Powers for Maintenance of Navigation; Power to Sell, Lease and Appropriate Lands; Power to Construct Quays, Wharves, etc., and to Erect Warehouses, etc.; Power to Corporation to Act as Carriers on Navigation; Licencing of Vessels; Tells, Rates and Charges; Pooling of Tolls, Rates and Charges with Trent Navigation Company; Power to Contract with Trent Navigation Company for Management and Maintenance of Navigation and Construction of Works; Power to Acquire or Lease and Work Ferries; Power to Advance Money to Trent Navigation Company for Construction of Newark Nether Lock; Repayment of Moneys Advanced by Development Commissioners; Borrowing of Money; Application of Sur-plus Revenue from Corporation Undertakings to Construction of Navigation Works; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Nottingham and county of the same city (hereinafter called "the Corporation" and "the city" respectively) for an Act for all or some of the following objects and purposes (that is to say):—

- 1. To transfer to and vest in or provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Corporation of so much of the Undertaking of the Trent Navigation Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), and all rights, powers, authorities, privileges, duties and obligations attaching to them in respect thereof over the River Trent and the Trent Navigation from Trent Bridge, in the city, to the Newark Navigation at Averham Weir, in the parish of Averham, in the county of Nottingham (which part of the said river and navigation is hereinafter called "the Navigation", and all lands, water rights, easements, works, real and personal property, and assets of the Company which are held by them in connection with the Navigation, or over which they may have any rights, and which may be necessary for or in connection with the Navigation, upon such terms and conditions as may have been or during the progress of the Bill for the intended Act may be agreed between the Corporation and the Company, to exclude the part of the Undertaking so transferred from any liability in respect of any mortgages, or debentures of, or advances made to the Company and any interest thereon, and any other debts or liabili-ties contracted by the Company prior to the passing of the Bill for the intended Act, and to confirm any agreement which may have been entered into before the passing of the Bill for the intended Act.
- 2. To authorize the Corporation from and after the said transfer or vesting to exercise and enjoy all the rights, powers, authorities

- and privileges of the Company under any and every Act relating to or affecting them (including the right to levy tolls, rates and charges) subject to such alterations and additions as may be defined in the intended Act or as Parliament may prescribe.
- 3. To make all necessary provision with regard to the Company incidental to the said transfer, and with regard to the payment of outstanding debts, the discharge of outstanding liabilities, the collection of outstanding assets, contracts in force at the date of the transfer, and other matters.
- 4. To empower the Corporation in particular to exercise the powers of the Company under the Trent Navigation Act, 1906 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1906"), and under such powers and the powers of the intended Act to construct, maintain, alter, improve and repair the several widenings, embankings and deepenings of the River Trent, cuts, locks, weirs, bridges, diversions of hauling paths and occupation road and other works authorized by the Act of 1906 at Stoke Bardolph, Gunthorpe, Hazleford and Holme Pierrepont in the county of Nottingham, and any other cuts, locks, weirs, bridges or other works authorized by that Act upon the Navigation.
- 5. To revive and extend the power granted by the Act of 1906 to purchase so much of the lands shown on the plans deposited in connection with the Bill for that Act as have not been purchased and as may be required for or in connection with the works hereinbefore mentioned or for or in connection with the Navigation, and to empower the Corporation to purchase the said lands.
- 6. To extend the time for constructing all the works authorized by the Act of 1906 for such period as may be defined in the Bill for the intended Act or prescribed by Parliament.
- 7. To enable the Corporation within the limits of the lands authorized to be purchased under the Act of 1906, or upon any lands for the time being belonging to them, from time to time to construct and maintain in connection with the Navigation all necessary cuts, channels, locks, weirs, dams, basins, reservoirs, ponds, aqueducts, trenches, pounds, docks, laybyes, gates, sluices, culverts, by-passes, arches, bridges, sewers, drains, embankments, towing-paths, walls, jetties, landing-places, dolphins, fenders, moorings, buoys, beacons, staithes, groynes, quays, wharves, warehouses, sheds, buildings, machinery, cranes, lifts, rails, junctions, sidings, turntables, signals, roads, approaches, lock-keepers' and collectors' houses, works and appliances.
- 8. To authorize the Corporation to cross, open or break up, divert, alter, stop up or interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, streets, roads, highways, footpaths, bridges, railways, tramways, rivers, streams, watercourses, drains, culverts, sewers, gas, water and electric mains and pipes, telegraphic, telephonic, electric and other wires, pipes and apparatus and other works so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the said works authorized to be constructed under the powers of the Act of 1906, or for any of the purposes of the other Acts relating to the Navigation or any of the purposes of the intended Act.
- 9. To enable the Corporation to exercise the powers of the Company with regard to the

maintenance and conservation of the Navigation and any rivers, streams, watercourses, sewers, or drains connected therewith, and to dredge, scour, deepen, widen, straighten, embank, cleanse, level, buoy, light and improve the bed, banks, shores and channels of the River Trent and any of its tributaries between Trent Bridge and Averham Weir.

10. To empower the Corporation from time to time to sell, exchange, demise and grant building and other leases and otherwise dispose of any lands and property to be acquired under the powers of or which may be appropriated to the purposes of the intended Act for such terms and periods as they may think proper or as may be prescribed in the intended Act; to lease or grant the use or occupation of or easements in or rights over any warehouses, buildings, sheds, wharves, yards, cranes, machinery, or other conveniences belonging to or provided by them.

11. To empower the Corporation to erect and fit up on any lands of the Corporation, and, with the consent of the owners, lessees, and occupiers thereof, on any other lands and on any quays, wharves or docks, and the river banks, free or bonded warehouses, depots, buildings, transit and other sheds, and other conveniences and appliances for the more convenient use of the Navigation and the improvement of the Navigation, and to hold, use, or let the same; and to sell, let, or otherwise dispose of lands for the erection thereon of the like matters and things by any company, person, or persons, and to authorize the Corporation to insure the same, and to let or appropriate the same or any of them to and for the use of particular trades, persons, or companies, and to enable the Corporation and any such company, person or persons to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements for and in relation to the exercise of any of the before mentioned powers by all or any of the said parties jointly, or by any or either of them severally; and to enable the Corporation to grant bond for Custom duties, and to make landing and warehousing entries, and to issue certificates for articles warehoused, and warrants for delivery transferable by endorsement or otherwise.

12. To empower the Corporation to ship, unship, tranship, land, convey, tow, barge, pile, measure, weigh, house, remove, watch, insure and deliver articles and perform any other duties or services in respect of goods, merchandise, and things brought upon the Navigation, or to or within the premises or works of the Corporation, and, if necessary, to sell any articles for payment of tolls, rates, rents and charges, or Custom duties.

13. To empower the Corporation to license tug-boats, steamboats, motor-boats, barges, lighters, keels, and other boats, and the masters thereof, and to prohibit upon the Navigation the use of any tugboat, steamboat, motor-boat, barge, lighter, keel, or other boat not licensed by the Corporation, or as regards any steamboat or tugboat being commanded by a master not licensed by the Corporation, and to suspend and revoke such licences.

14. To enable the Corporation from time to time to fix, alter and demand, take and recover tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties, and other charges for or in respect of the use of the Navigation, or any part or parts thereof, or any locks, cuts, wharves, docks, or other works connected therewith, and for or in respect of any l

services performed or labour used or employed by the Corporation in connection therewith, and to confer exemptions from and from time to time to compound for any such tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties, and other payments, and to alter any existing tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties, and charges.

15. To empower the Corporation from time to time to make, alter and enforce bye-laws, rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act, and especially for the following among other purposes: -For prohibiting, removing and regulating the placing of any matters or things which, in the judgment of the Corporation, may interfere with the Navigation or the safe and convenient user thereof, or of the wharves, docks, premises and works of the Corporation, or other wharves or premises and the river banks, for regulating the use of the Navigation, the speed of vessels navigating the same, the use of locks, docks, landing stages, tramways, warehouses, transit and other sheds and works connected therewith respectively, and the conduct of the masters and crews of vessels, and of other persons using and frequenting the same, for pre-scribing the terms and conditions for and payment on which licences for tugboats, steamboats, motor-boats, barges, lighters, keels and other boats, and masters thereof shall be granted, suspended, or declared to be forfeited by the Corporation, and for regulating the conduct of persons so licensed, and for fixing the tolls, rates and charges which the Corporation may demand and take under the powers of the intended Act.

16. To provide that the tolls, rates, dues and charges authorized to be taken by the Company either in their own right or as lessees of the Newark Navigation Commissioners appointed by the Act of 12 Geo. III., chapter 86, and the Corporation, in respect of so much of the River Trent as lies between Trent Bridge and the city of Nottingham and Dunham Bridge in the parishes of Dunham in the county of Nottingham, and Newton-on-Trent in the county of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey), shall be pooled, and to make such provision with regard to the division and apportionment of the said tolls, rates, dues and charges as may be agreed between the Company and the Corporation, or as may be indicated in the intended Act or prescribed by Parliament.

17. To provide that the Company, notwithstanding the transfer of powers proposed to be authorized, shall retain all rights, powers, privileges, duties and obligations which they at present possess as carriers upon the said Navigation, which may not be inconsistent with the rights, powers and duties of the Corporation in respect of the Navigation after the said transfer shall have taken place.

18. To empower the Corporation to contract with the Company for the performance of the duties and obligations of the Corporation in respect of the management, maintenance and conservation of the Navigation, under the provisions of all or any of the Acts relating to the Company and the intended Act, and with respect to the execution of all or any of the works authorized by the Act of 1906, and to authorize the Company to undertake such duties and the execution of such works.

19. To empower the Corporation to acquire or to take a lease of and to carry on the Farndon Ferry and any other ferry across the Navigation, and all rights, duties, privileges, liabilities and obligations in respect of any such ferry at present exercised by and imposed upon the Company, or any other body or person, and to authorize the Corporation to provide all necessary ferry boats for working the said ferries, or any of them, and to do all necessary works for maintaining the said ferries or any of them.

- 20. To authorize the Corporation from time to time to appoint such number of directors of the Company as may be prescribed by the intended Act.
- 21. To alter or amend any powers of the Trent Fisheries Board which may be inconsistent with the powers of the intended Act.
- 22. To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.
- 23. To authorize the Company to contribute towards the payment of interest on money borrowed by the Corporation for any of the purposes of the intended Act.
- 24. To empower the Corporation to advance to the Company such moneys as may be required for the construction of the Newark Nether Lock and Cut authorized by the Act of 1906 upon such terms and subject to such security as the Corporation may require.
- 25. To provide that the Corporation shall be empowered to repay to the Development Commissioners any moneys which may have been or may be advanced by such Commissioners to the Corporation for the purposes of the intended Act, with such interest as may have been or may be agreed with the Commissioners, and to provide that any such moneys shall be secured upon the works authorized by the Act of 1906 to be executed by the Corporation under the powers of the intended Act, and upon the revenue derived by the Corporation from the Navigation, and also to provide that any moneys so advanced to the Corporation and interest thereon shall be a first charge upon one-third of any net surplus of revenue over expenditure which may accrue to the Corporation in any year in respect of the Navigation under the provisions of the intended Act.
- 26. To empower the Corporation to borrow or raise money for any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to charge such money upon the borough fund and borough rate, the district fund and general district rate, and upon estates. undertakings, rates, rents, revenues and other property of the Corporation, or on any of those securities, and to execute and grant mortgages or to create and issue Corporation stock in respect thereof, and to empower the Corporation to apply any of their existing funds, rates and revenues, and any surplus revenues in their hands of the gas, water, electric lighting or tramway undertakings of the Corporation or any of such undertakings, or any money they are authorized to borrow, to any of the purposes of the intended Act.
- 27. To incorporate with or without amendment or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts:—The Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act,

1847; the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; the Public Health Acts; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Arbitration Act, 1889; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.

. 1. In this potice "the Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Sheffield, "the city" means the city of Sheffield, "the Bill" means the Bill for the intended Act, and "the Rotherham Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Rotherham.

2. To enable the Corporation to construct, form, lay down, maintain and work the tramways hereinafter described in the parish and township of Tinsley, in the city in the West Riding of the county of York, together with

4. The intended tramways are proposed to be constructed on a gauge of 4 feet 8½ inches, and it is not intended to run thereon carriages or trucks adapted for use upon railways.

5. The motive power to be used on the intended tramways is animal power or electrical power, to be applied by means of motors in the engines or carriages or communicated by electric lines in or under ground or overhead or steam, gas, air, or other mechanical power applied by means of locomotive engines, or by motors in the carriages or otherwise.

6. To empower the Corporation to purchase and acquire and to require the Rotherham Corporation to sell so much of the tramway undertaking of the Rotherham Corporation as is situate in the city, and in particular so much of that Undertaking as comprises the tramway constructed in pursuance of the Rotherham Corporation Act, 1900, as is situate in Sheffield-road in the city between Weedon-street and the city boundary at Templeborough, together with the works and conveniences, property, assets, rights, powers and privileges held, occupied, or enjoyed in connection therewith (all of which are in this Notice included in the expression "the Rotherham tramway.")

- 7. To empower the Corporation and any local authority, company or person owning or working any tramways which may now or hereafter be connected with any tramways of the Corporation to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to the formation of junctions, the leasing, working, running over, using, maintaining and managing of their respective tramways, the fixing, collecting, apportionment and distribution of rates and profits, the supply and maintenance of rolling stock, the employment of officers and servants, the supply of motive power, and the management, transmission and delivery of traffic.
- 12. To confer further powers upon the Corporation with regard to the provision, equipment, maintenance and running of motor omnibuses, and to authorize them to run such omnibuses along the following route (namely):—

From the city boundary at Handsworth Bridge, thence along main road, Handsworth-lane and Worksop-road to its junction with Church-lane at Aston. The said route is in the urban district of Handsworth, and in the parishes of Orgreave and Aston-cum-Aughton, in the rural district of Rotherham, in the West Riding of the county of York. And to extend to such omnibuses

- and to the exercise of the power to run the same all or some of the provisions contained in the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1907, and the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1914.
- 13. To confer upon the Corporation all such powers as may be ancillary or incidental to the matters herein referred to, or as may be indicated in the Bill including powers in relation to the acquisition of lands, and the levying of tolls, rates and duties, to alter existing tolls, rates and duties, and to confer, vary or extinguish any exemptions from the payment: thereof.

To authorize the Corporation to borrow or re-borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Bill and of their tramway undertaking, and for such other purposes as may be deemed expedient, and to charge the moneys to be so borrowed, and the interest thereon, on the tramway revenue of the Corporation, the borough fund, and borough rate, and the district fund and general district rate, or other local rates, and the estates, undertakings, tolls, rates, rents, revenues and other property of the Corporation, or any of such. securities, and to create, issue, execute and grant mortgages, debentures, debenture or other stock, consolidated stock or bills or promissory notes and annuities in respect thereof, and to authorize the Corporation to apply any of their funds to all or any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to make, levy and recover rates, and increase existing or authorized rates for any of such purposes.
- 15. To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.
- 16. The Bill will or may incorporate or make applicable all or some of the provisions of the Sheffield Tramways Act, 1872; the Sheffield Corporation (Street Widenings) Act, 1893; the Sheffield Corporation Tramways Act, 1896; the Sheffield Corporation (Streets and Tramways) Act, 1897; the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1900; The Sheffield Corporation Act, 1907; the Sheffield (Extension) Order, 1911; which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation, (No. 7) Act, 1911; the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1912; and the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1914; and the enactments incorporated therewith respectively, with such alterations and? amendments as may be deemed expedient, and will repeal such of those provisions as are inconsistent with the provisions of the Bill, and will enable the Corporation to exercise some of the powers granted by the said Acts, or any: of them, as well as the powers hereinbeforementioned.
- 17. To alter, amend, extend, enlarge, or repeal or re-enact with or without amendment all or some of the provisions of the several Actshereinbefore mentioned or referred to and all other Orders and Acts relating to the Corporation or to the city, or any part thereof.
- 18. To incorporate with or without alterations and amendments all or some of the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament following, or some of them (that is to say):—

The Lands Clauses Acts; the Tramways, Act, 1870; the Municipal Corporations Act; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Public Health Acts; the Local Government Acts;

and all Acts amending the said Acts respectively, or any of them.

19. (Construction of Waterworks in Counties of Stafford and Salop; Acquisition, Appropriation, Retention and Sale of Lands and Easements; Taking of Water; Laying of Mains and Breaking-up of Streets and Roads; Provisions for Securing Purity of Water; Supply of Water in Bulk; Extension of Limits for Supply of Water; Rates, Rents and Charges, and the alteration thereof; Further Provisions as to Supply; Borrowing of Money; Extension, Application, Incorporation and Amendment of Acts; and Other Matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Wolverhampton for an Act for (amongst others) all or some of the objects and purposes hereinafter mentioned:—

1. In this Notice "the Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Wolverhampton, "the borough" means the borough of Wolverhampton, "the Bill" means the Bill for the intended Act, and "the works" means the works proposed to be authorized by the Bill.

2. To empower the Corporation to make and maintain the works hereinafter described or referred to in the counties of Stafford and Salop (that is to say):—

Work No. 1.—A pumping station (hereinafter referred to as the Ivetsey Pumping Station) with a well or wells, boreholes, adits and other works and conveniences connected therewith or ancillary thereto to be situate in the parish of Lapley and Wheaton Aston in the rural district of Cannock in the county of Stafford in the fields or enclosures numbered 694 and 695 on the 1500 Ordnance Map (2nd edition, 1903), of that parish, such pumping station being on

the north-westerly side of the road leading from Watling-street to the village of Wheaton Aston, and situate 530 yards or thereabout measured in a direct line drawn in a north-easterly direction from the farmhouse known as The Hurst.

Work No. 2.—An aqueduct consisting of one or more lines of pipes, commencing in the said parish of Lapley and Wheaton Aston at or in the Ivetsey Pumping Station (Work No. 1), and terminating in the parish of Brewood in the rural district of Cannock in the county of Stafford at or in the service reservoir (Work No. 3) hereinafter described, and which said aqueduct will be situate in or pass through or into the several parishes following or some of them (that is to say):—The parishes of Lapley and Wheaton Aston and Brewood in the rural district of Cannock, the parish of Blymhill in the county of Stafford, and the parishes of Tong and Boscobel in the rural district of Shifnal in the county of Salop.

Work No. 3.—A service reservoir to be wholly situate in the parish of Brewood in the rural district of Cannock in the county of Stafford in the field or enclosure numbered 1,100 on the  $\frac{1}{2500}$  Ordnance Map of that parish (2nd edition, 1903), situate on the westerly side of Langley-Lawn-lane, the centre of such reservoir being situate 270 yards or thereabout measured in a direct line drawn in a south-easterly direction from the southerly corner of Boscobel House.

Work No. 4.—An aqueduct consisting of one or more lines of pipes, commencing at or in the said service reservoir (Work No. 3), and terminating in the parish and urban district of Tettenhall by a junction with the existing mains of the Corporation at or near to the junction of Lower-street with the road leading from Shifnal to Wolverhampton, which said aqueduct will be situate in. or pass through or into the several parishes or places following or some of them (that is to say):—The parish of Brewood in the rural district of Cannock in the county of Stafford, the parishes of Donington and Albrighton in the rural district of Shifnal in the county of Salop, the parishes of Codsall and Oaken and Wrottesley in the rural district of Seisdon, and the parish and urban district of. Tettenhall in the county of Stafford.

3. To empower the Corporation to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels of the works shown on the deposited plans and sections hereinafter mentioned, to the extent to be shown on the said plans or to be defined in the intended Act.

4. To empower the Corporation to purchase or take by compulsion or agreement lands, houses, hereditaments and other property in the parishes, districts and counties aforesaid for the purposes of the works or other the purposes of the Bill, and to acquire and take by compulsion or agreement easements or other rights in, over or affecting lands, houses, tenements, hereditaments and other property in those parishes, districts and counties without being required to take the surface thereof or other interests therein.

5. To enable the Corporation by agreement to purchase, take on lease and hold lands, buildings, water rights, easements or rights over or in land within or without the limits of supply of the Corporation for the general purposes of their undertaking and of the Bill (including the protection of their water supply), and notwithstanding the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts to hold, use, lease, sell, exchange, appropriate or otherwise dispose of any lands and buildings for the time being belonging to them with or without reservation of the water and water rights.

6. To make special provision with regard to compensation to be paid in respect of the lands to be acquired under the Bill, to provide that in determining the amount of such compensation any buildings erected, alterations made or interest created after the date hereof, or such other date as may be mentioned in the Bill, shall not be taken into consideration; to render persons claiming compensation liable to their costs in certain events, and to make provision for enabling them to amend their claims.

7. To authorize the Corporation on any lands belonging to them or over which they have or obtain easements to make and maintain culverts, tunnels, shafts, drains, junctions, discharge pipes, sluices, tanks, basins, filter beds, filters, embankments, dams, retaining walls, bridges, roads, tram-roads, approaches, telegraphic and telephonic apparatus, valves, machinery, buildings, appliances, apparatus and conveniences connected with or ancillary to the said works or necessary for inspecting, maintaining, repairing, cleansing, managing, working or using the same.

8. To empower the Corporation to collect, impound, take, divert, appropriate and use all such springs, streams and waters as can or may be taken, diverted, appropriated or used by the works, or as may be found on, in, or under any lands for the time being belonging to the Corporation, or over, or in respect of which they have, for the time being, easements.

9. To authorize the Corporation to discharge water from any of their waterworks into any available stream or watercourse.

10. To empower the Corporation to lay down, maintain, alter or renew aqueducts, conduits, mains, pipes, culverts, discharge pipes, telegraph and telephone conductors, wires, posts and other works for or in connection with their supply of water in, through, along, under, across or over streets, roads, footpaths, highways, bridges, rivers, streams, canale, railways and tramways, both within and without the limits of supply of the Corporation, and for that purpose and otherwise for the purposes of the Bill to extend to such works all or any of the provisions of the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863 and of the Acts relating to the water undertaking of the Corporation, and to empower the Corporation to break up cross, divert, alter or stop up, close for traffic, remove or otherwise interfere with, either permanently or temporarily, all roads, highways, streets, footpaths or places, pipes, sewers, drains, rivers, streams, canals, watercourses, bridges, tramways, tramroads, railways, and telegraphic and telephonic apparatus which it may be necessary to interfere with in constructing or maintaining the works for the time being belonging to or authorized to be constructed by the Corporation, or for other the purposes of the Bill.

11. To make provision for securing the purity of the water obtained by the Corporation for the construction of necessary works on lands

over or under which such water flows, and to empower the Corporation to enter into agreements with the owners, lessees and occupiers of lands with reference to the matters aforesaid.

12. To empower the Corporation to enter into and carry into effect special contracts with any local authority, company, body or person whether within or beyond the limits of supply for the supply of water in bulk or otherwise by either of the parties to the other, and to confer all necessary powers in that behalf upon the Corporation and all such authorities, companies, bodies and persons, and to enable them to raise or apply for the purposes of any such contract the necessary funds and rates.

13. To constitute the works part of the water undertaking of the Corporation, and to extend and apply thereto all or some of the provisions of the enactments relating to that undertaking, with such modifications as may be indicated in the Bill.

14. To alter and extend the limits of the Corporation for the supply of water under the Wolverhampton Improvement Act, 1869, so as to include, in addition thereto, townarea comprising the parishes or ships of Brewood, Featherstone, Hilton, Lapley and Wheaton Aston, Saredon, Shareshill and Stretton, in the rural district of Cannock and the parishes or townships of Blymhill and Weston-under-Lizard, all in the county of Stafford, and the parishes or townships of Boscobel and Tong, in the rural district of Shifnal, in the county of Salop, and to empower the Corporation within such area which is hereinafter referred to as "the New Limits ") to have and exercise all or some of the powers and authorities which they now have or may exercise within their exist-ing limits for the supply of water or any parts thereof, and to extend thereto, with or without modification, such of the enactments relating to the supply of water within their said existing limits as may be indicated in the Bill.

15. To authorize the Corporation to levy and impose such rates, rents and charges for the supply of water within the new limits as may be prescribed by the Bill, to alter existing rates, rents and charges, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment of rates, rents and charges.

16. To confer upon the Corporation in reference to their water undertaking all or some of the rights, powers and privileges of a local authority under the Public Health Acts, particularly the rights, powers and privileges relating to the laying down of water mains, and to empower the Corporation to exercise the same with reference to the aqueducts and other works authorized by the Bill, and to provide that for the purposes aforesaid the limits of supply of the Corporation shall be deemed to be their district.

17. To enact provisions for the protection of existing sources of supply in the immediate neighbourhood of the proposed Ivetsey pump-

ing station.

18. To make provision in regard to the supply of water in the parishes in the Cannock and Shifnal rural districts, intended to be added to and comprised in the Corporation's limits for the supply of water; the laying down of mains therein by the Corporation; the size and extent of mains; priority of supply, price, rent or rate for supply, and in regard to the steps to be taken by the rural district council

to ensure that the dwelling-houses therein are

adequately supplied.

19. To enable the Corporation and the Cannock District Council and any other local authority whose area is wholly or partly comprised within the limits of the Corporation for the supply of water to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements, and to confirm and give effect to any such contracts or agreements entered into before the passing of the Bill.

20. To amend Section 142 of the Wolverhampton Improvement Act, 1869, with respect to rent payable to the Corporation for a supply of water for domestic purposes by removing the yearly limit thereby prescribed or to repeal that section and to enact other provisions in regard to the charges to be made by and the sums to be paid to the Corporation for water supplied

for such purposes.

21. To further define the respective rights of the Corporation and the consumers of water for domestic purposes and to define the purposes to be included within the expression "domestic purposes" or to exclude from that expression any particular purpose or purposes; to provide that certain trade or manufacturing premises and hospitals, clubs, public-houses, inns, schools, boarding-houses, hotels or other premises shall be supplied by meter.

22. To make further and better provision with regard to the water undertaking of the Corporation and the supply of water by them, particularly in regard to the following

matters:-

The prevention and detection of waste of water, and the placing in streets, roads, and other places of meters, stopcocks, and other works; for preventing the injuring of meters and other fittings and the fraudulent use or alteration thereof; and exempting the Corporation from the obligation to supply more than one house by the same communication pipe.

23. To extinguish all public and private rights of way and other rights over the lands acquired under the Bill, and to vary and extinguish all other existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer

other rights and privileges.

24. To empower the Corporation to borrow, reborrow, or raise money for the purchase of lands for the construction of works, and for other purposes of the water undertaking of the Corporation, and for other purposes of the Bill, and to charge such money upon the improvement fund and improvement rate, or other local rates, and upon the estates, undertakings, rates, rents, revenue, and other property of the Corporation, or on any of those securities, and to authorize the Corporation to execute and grant mortgages or to create and issue Corporation stock in respect thereof, and to apply to the Bill some or all of the provisions relating to the borrowing of money and other financial matters of any Act of Parliament relating to the Corporation or the borough.

25. To enact all necessary provisions for giving full effect to the purposes of the intended Act or of the general or local Acts in force in the borough, including the making and confirmation of bye-laws, the imposition of penalties for breach of the provisions of the

Bill or any bye-law thereunder, the recovery, apportionment, and application of penalties and expenses; the payment of expenses of carrying the Act into execution; and the authentication and service of notices and other documents.

26. To repeal or amend or extend and apply to the Bill all or some of the provisions of the

following local Acts, namely:-

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Trustees or other persons for the time being authorized to maintain and improve the River Glen or the banks thereof (herein referred to as the Glen Bank Trustees), and the Trustees acting under and by virtue of the Deeping Fen Drainage Act, 1856 (herein referred to as the Deeping Fen Trustees), for leave to bring in a Bill for an Act for the following or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To empower the Board or the Joint Committee hereinafter named to deepen, scour, widen, enlarge and improve by dredging or otherwise the bed and channel of the River Glen, in the parishes of Pinchbeck, Surfleet Bourne, Deeping Fen or Deeping St. Nicholas, Baston and Thurlby, from the Sluice at the Reservoir in the parish of Surfleet to Kate's Bridge in the parish of Thurlby, and to support, maintain and protect the present river banks, walls and other works, and for that purpose to maintain, alter, vary, divert, improve, remove, stop up or discontinue all dykes, drains, cuts, rivers, tunnels, cloughs. sluices, outfalls, roads, ways, paths, embankments, and other works on, in or under connected with or adjoining the present river banks and walls, and to deposit on the banks. slopes and slipes of the River Glen and elsewhere, soil, earth and other materials which may be obtained in deepening, dredging and improving the bed and channel of the River Glen, and in executing any other of the works to be authorized by the Bill.

4. To authorize the Board or Joint Committee to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels shown on the deposited plans and sections and to stop up, cross, alter, divert, narrow or widen, alter or raise the level of or otherwise interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, public and private roads, footpaths, ways and highways, towpaths, drains, sewers, ditches, cuts, culverts, outfalls, sluices, stanches, banks, embankments and other works, rivers, streams, watercourses, canals and railways within all or any of the parishes and other places named in this Notice so far as it may be necessary to do so in executing the intended works, and in carrying out the powers

and provisions of the Bill.

5. To preserve and maintain the waterway of the River Glen, and the free flow and discharge of water therefrom by dredging or other means.

6. To empower the Board or the Joint Committee to underpin or otherwise secure or strengthen any houses, buildings, bridges or works which may be rendered insecure or affected by any of the intended works, and whether such houses, buildings, bridges or works are or are not intended or required to be

To empower the Board and the Deeping Fen Trustees and the Joint Committee to purchase and take or otherwise acquire by compulsion or agreement for any of the purposes of the Bill lands, houses, tenements and hereditaments and easements in or over the same in the parishes or places of Pinchbeck, Surfleet, Bourne, Deeping Fen, Deeping St. Nicholas, Baston, Uffington, Tallington, and Thurlby in the County of Lincoln.

9. To enable the Deeping Fen Trustees to deepen, scour, widen, enlarge, and improve by dredging, embanking, or otherwise any drains, dykes, cuts, or channels vested in them in the said County and for those purposes to maintain, alter, vary, divert, improve, remove, stop up or discontinue all dykes, drains, cuts, streams, sluices, tow paths, roads, ways, embankments, and other works on, in or under connected with or adjoining the said drain or drains and to deposit on the banks, slopes, and slipes of the said drain or drains or elsewhere soil, earth, and other materials which may be obtained or removed in executing any such dredging or other works.

10.
