Plymouth, August 21.

N Wednesday last sailed hence the sweepstakes. Yesterday in the morning Sir Thomas Atlen with the Fleet under his command, sailed before this Port to the Westwards, only the Leopard came in here, intending to put to lea again with

the first fair, wind.

Deal, Aug. 22. Yesterday a Danish ship of about 60 Tuns laden with Deals, Fagots, and some Skins, bound for Lon don, ran on ground upon the Northfand-head ne r the Goodwins, the Skipper and the rest of her men made their escape in their Boat, leaving the stip as lost, several boats were sent from His Majestjes ships to her assistance, who have se-

cured her Anchors and Cables.

Deal, Aug. 24. Yesterday morning above 40 fail of Merchant Ships failed thorow the Downs, outwards bound, most of them for the Streights and West Indies.

Briftol, Aug. 22. Nothips are lately arrived here, except only one imall Spaniard, laden with Oranges and Lemons. Several ships lie ready for the Streights and West-Indies, expecting only a fair wind. The Edgar is riding

in Hunger-road, fitting up wi hall convenient bafte.

Naples., Aug. 7. On Thursday last arrived here a
Courier Extraordinary from Spain, with Letters from that
Court to the Viceroy, informing him of the 1 ublicati n of the Peace with France, both in Madrid and other parts of spain; with Orders to publish it also in Naples, which was accordingly done the Saturday following with the found of Frumpers and beat of Drums, the Discharge of all the Great Guns from the Fortresses, and several Volies f om a Schladron of Spanish foot, which were for the greater solem-hiry drawn up before the Palace, and three Evenings toge-ther spent by the Princes and Nobility, with Lights and Fiteworks.
The same Night salled hence to Gallies, with & Tartands

with 2000 Spaniss, Italian, and German Soldiers, and a ptopolitionable quantity of Ammunicion for Sardiniss, to quiet the Commotions of that Island; but in a little time after their departure arrived a Feluca from Cagliari, with adter their departure arrived a Felica com Lagitars, with advice, that the diffurbance was over, and all this gas again, in peace end quietness; whereupon a Felica was immediately halfned out to recall the Gullies, which on Sunday in the Evening returned again into Port, and are now in teadiness to fer fail for the Levant.

Some other thips arriving from Smirns and Cyprus in-Tormus, that some of the Venetian Fleet being before the Port of Gira Petra to oppose the Turks in their passage to the reflief of the Vilier, were suddenly stracqued by a much arger Squadron of men of War from Barbary, with whom they entered into a rude Fight, which continued for some hours; in which time two of the Turkish ships were link, and two of the Venetians fired; but in the end the Christians having the encouragement of two great ships of 60 Guns apiece, which came leasonably to their assistance, the Barbarians were forced to quit t'e Fight with much damage and

a confiderable loss of men.

They tell us farther, that the Turks had raifed their Berteries before the Port of Candia, by which they much obfructed the Entry of a'l ships into the Town, and by their artificial Fireworks to inlightned the Portall the night, that their Canoniers could without difficulty discover any ships that endeavour'd to get in.

The Cardinals Palace at Florence is preparing for the Entertainment of Queen Christina of Swednland, who is

expected there in offober next.

Venice, Aug. 17. The Senate have thought fit to make choice of Segnior Alleffandro Moline, Captain of our Fleet in the Levant, to succeed in the Dignity of Censor, have or ered his return to take possession of his New Charges and have chosen Segnior Tadio Morofini to succeed him in the Fleet, who is preparing for his departure, and may fail the beginning of the next moneth.

Segnior Gerolomo Battaja, who was lately chosen to succeed in the Charge of General of our forces in Gandia, is on Wednelday to embark on a great/ship that is waiting for him; many other thips are to fail under his Convoy, with Men, Provision, and Ammucition in great plenty, and the fun of 200 thouland, Duçats in money for the use of the Garrison in Candia; with him go also several Persons of Quaity upon their private accounts as Voluntiors, to fignalize

their Valours in the desence of that place.

Two ships arrived here this Lift week; one from Zants the other from Smirna, both of them upon Merchants accounts, telling us that as they passed near Candia, they heard great inpoting, which gave them occasion to believe that the Turks were a tempting the Fortifications of that pace. They farther say that in Smirna, Soria, and Alexa andria, soveral Christian ships were impressed by the surks to carry fuccon a to their Army. That the Captain Bassa at Rhades with a Fleet of 45 Gallies, having disarmed nothers which he found to be unfi; for Service , and dispofed of the Slaves to supply the defects of his other Gallies 3 that he had 6000. Our Ships meet frequently with confiderable Prizes going for Ganea. They have taken lately two great ships ladea with Guns, with above 50 Turks about them, and near Sint Pelagia one other full of men with a lading of provifion for the Tu kish Army; all which were immediately sent into Candia, where the Garrison having great abundance of all necessaries, have on several occasions shewed eminent proofs of their Valour upon the Enemy, who nevertheless continue the Siege with much obstinacy, having given of late many furious affaults to the Out-works, and endeavoured what they are able to ruine the Fort de Sabionera, which has been as stouchy desended by Monsieur de St. Andre Montbruns who in return has fallied out upon them beating them

off with extraordinary Slanghter.

Some few dayes fince departed hence four flips for Dalmatia, with Orders to take in there 400 Foot & with seve-

ral Necessa ies for the Succours of Candia.
