The 7th a Fire happened in the great Tower which stands in the middle of the fort, and in two other places, but it was soon put out by the Besteged. The 7th we made our selves Masters of a Redoubt, and of the Communication between the Fort and the Citradel, and took about 40 Prisoners. The 8th we attack'd the Cover d Way of the Fort, at datter a very sharp Dispute, we made our selves Misters of it, having in this Action had 500 Min killed and wounded. The night following we lodged our selves in the Ditch. From the Imperial Camp before Belgrade, August 10. On the 30th of the list Mouth the Army passed the Save near the Island of Zingari; The 31th the necessary Dispositions were made for the besseging of Belgrade. The 8th the Auxiliary Troops of Brandenburg, with the Battalions of Nigrelli and Herberssen arrived at Sembja, and yesterday they passed the Save, and joined the Army. This day or to morrow we expect our Cannon for Battery, being 50 Pieces of 24 Pounders, besides Mortas, &c. and in the meantime we are working to raise our Batteries, and to sinish our Line of Circumvallation, which reaches from the Save to the Danabe. This day came to the Camp two Turks, being sent by the Garison in the Palanke of Banczvoua, about 3 Lagues from hence, to Capitulate for them, which is granted, and the said Garison is to be conducted to Semendria; The two Turks were sent back this Evening, with 30 Germans, and some Hussirs, who are to take possession of the Palank, in which are 9 Pieces of Cannon. to take possession of the Palank, in which are 9 Pieces of

The Baron de Vorsten arrived here on the 8th Instant from our Camp before Belgrade, by whom, and the Advices we have received since, we understand, that the Imperialists had formed the Siege of wholh, and the Advices we have received tince, we understand, that the Imperialists had formed the Siege of that Fortress, having opened their Trenches, and being at work on their Line or Circumvallation and on their Batteries; The Garison is stronger then was at first reported, (it being thought that the 3000 Men who were lately detached from thence to Temesware, are got back again by Water) however the Imperialists hope to be Masters of the place by the end of this Month, the Turks being in no condition to relieve it; For we have Advice from Adrianuple, that the Grand Visier did not set out from thence till the 6th of the last Month; That he had with him but 10000 Men of all forts, and that at Nicopolis he was to Meet and Conter with the Cham of Tarray about the present Necessities of their Affiss.
