BRITISH CARGOES LANDED FROM GERMAN SHIPS AT TSINGTAO.

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegram from His Majesty's Ambassador at Tokio to the following effect:—

British subjects who possess interests in cargoes which may have been landed from German ships at Tsingtao should address their claims, through His Majesty's Embassy at Tokio, to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs, sending detailed description of cargo, and documentary evidence in support of them.

The delivery of such cargo can only take place at Tsingtao. Permission to enter that place, subject to the consent of the military authorities, has been granted to foreigners having property there since November 20th last.

ment Act, 1914 (5 Geo. 5, Ch. 12), the Board of Trade have appointed the Accountant of Court in Scotland to act as Custodian of enemy property for Scotland.

The Admiralty, under the powers given to them by the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, hereby make the following Order:—

(1) This Order shall relate to the ports and territorial waters adjacent to the United Kingdom from and including Plymouth eastward up to and including Great Yarmouth, with the exception of the existing pilotage district of Arundel.

(2) Any bye-law in force for the time being in the area to which this Order relates shall have effect only subject to the provisions of this Order and of Orders made by the Trinity House in accordance with instructions hereunder.

(3) The Trinity House, as defined in the Pilotage Act, 1913, is hereby instructed as follows:—

(i.) To suspend, if it shall think fit, the licences of all or any present pilots and the existing pilotage certificates of all or any masters or mates within the said area.

(ii.) Subject to the provisions of this Order and to the approval of the Admiralty to make orders in respect of the said area for all or any of the purposes specified in Regulation 39 of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914.

(4) No person shall act as pilot within the said area without the special licence of the Trinity House.

(5) No licence shall be granted under this Order for a period longer than 14 days, and all licences shall be revocable and renewable at the absolute discretion of the Trinity House.

(6) A licence shall not be granted unless the pilot signs an agreement to conform with the Trinity House Orders.

(7) The Trinity House is authorised to make new rates or to modify existing rates for pilotage.

NOTE.—Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Order or of the Orders issued by the Trinity House will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and liable to be dealt with accordingly.

NATIONAL INSURANCE.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1914, dated December 7th, 1914, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by Section 78 read with Section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this

Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with respect to bringing Part I. of the Act into operation in Wales the Welsh Insurance Commissioners with the consent of the Treasury may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that Part of the Act into operation in Wales, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas, by virtue of paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act, if the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor at the commencement of the year is insufficient to provide the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes of medical benefit and sanatorium benefit, and towards the expenses of administration, that contributor is not, unless the Insurance Committee consents, and except subject to such conditions as the Committee may impose, entitled to any benefits during that year:

And whereas, by Section 3 of the National Insurance Act, 1913 (in this Order called "the amending Act"), it is enacted that Part I. of the Act shall apply to persons who at the commencement of the Act were of the age of sixty-five and upwards and under the age of seventy, provided that a person who is of the age of sixty-five or upwards at the date of entry into insurance shall not be entitled to medical benefit after he attains the age of seventy, unless the number of weekly contributions paid by or in respect of him exceeds twenty-six:

And whereas it will not in all cases be possible at the commencement of the year 1915 to ascertain whether the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund will be sufficient to provide the sums aforesaid, or whether the number of weekly contributions paid by or in respect of him exceeds twenty-six:

And whereas, by reason of the premises deposit contributors will, unless this Order is made, as respects the year 1915, be deprived of benefits to which they might otherwise have been entitled, and accordingly a difficulty has arisen within the meaning of the said Section 78:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act, and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act—

(1) (a) A deposit contributor who on the 6th day of July, 1914, had an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of the period from the 1st day of January, 1915, to the 31st day of March, 1915, and

(b) a deposit contributor by or in respect of whom any contributions were paid during the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 5th day of July, 1914,

shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during the period from the

1st day of January, 1915, to the 31st day of March, 1915.

(2) A deposit contributor who entered into insurance before the 4th day of January, 1915, and by or in respect of whom no contributions were paid during the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 5th day of July, 1914, and who, on the 6th day of July, 1914, had not an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of the period from the 1st day of January, 1915, to the 31st day of March, 1915, shall not in any event be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during that period.

(3) If the amount standing to the credit of such deposit contributor as aforesaid in the Deposit Contributors Fund on the 4th day of January, 1915, is sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable as aforesaid in respect of the period from the 1st day of April, 1915, to the 30th day of September, 1915, or of the period from the 1st day of July, 1915, to the 30th day of September, 1915, he shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during the period for which the amount is sufficient, and if the amount standing to his credit on the 4th day of July, 1915, is sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable as aforesaid in respect of the period from the 1st day of October, 1915, to the 31st day of December, 1915, he shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during that period.

2.—(1) A deposit contributor who attains the age of seventy after the 5th day of July, 1914, shall, notwithstanding anything in Section 3 of the amending Act, and subject to the provisions of this Order, be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit after he attains the age of seventy, if he entered into insurance more than twenty-six weeks before he attains that age.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (1) (b) of Article 1 of this Order shall not apply to a deposit contributor who attained the age of seventy before the 6th day of July, 1914.

3. There shall be deducted, at such times as the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may determine, from the amount standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund the proper proportion for the periods or period during which he is by virtue of the foregoing provisions of this Order entitled to benefit of the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1915.

Provided that if it appears at any time that the amount so standing to the credit of a deposit contributor who becomes entitled to benefit as aforesaid was not sufficient to provide for that deduction, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, deduct from any contributions paid by or in respect of him in respect of the year 1915, such sum as together with any sum so standing to his credit as aforesaid, will be equal to the proper proportion of the sums so payable in respect of him.

4.—(1) The Welsh Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, continue the right to

benefit of any deposit contributor to whom the provisions of Article 1 of this Order apply for a succeeding or any subsequent period up to and including the 31st day of December, 1915, if there is standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund before the beginning of each such further period or periods, an amount equal to the proper proportion for such further period or periods of the sums payable in respect of him under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1915, and there shall be deducted at such times as the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may determine from the amount so standing to his credit a sum equal to the proper proportion for such period or periods of the sums so payable as aforesaid.

(2) Where a deposit contributor who is entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit before he attains the age of seventy entered into insurance within twenty-six weeks of his attaining that age, there shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund the proper proportion of the sums payable in respect of him under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the period or periods commencing on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October, 1915, as the case may be, during which he is entitled to receive medical and sanatorium benefit.

5. Where a deposit contributor is entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit, but, at the date when he becomes so entitled, arrangements have not been made for providing those benefits, there shall, as soon as may be after those arrangements have been made, be deducted from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund, a sum equal to the proper proportion payable in respect of him, so, however, that the period or periods for which any such deduction is made, shall be a period or periods commencing on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, or the 1st day of October, whichever of the said dates is next before the date when the said arrangements were made.

6. During the period from the date of this Order to the 31st day of December, 1914, no payment on account of sickness benefit or maternity benefit shall, unless the Welsh Insurance Commissioners otherwise determine, be made to a deposit contributor of an amount greater than the excess (if any) of the amount then standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund over the sums properly payable under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1915, but if the amount standing to his credit on the 4th day of January, 1915, is in excess of the sums properly payable as aforesaid for the year 1915, any benefit withheld under the foregoing provision shall, so far as may be, be paid forthwith out of the excess.

7. In the case of an insured person who, being a deposit contributor, becomes insured under the provisions of Section 46 of the Act, or ceases to be insured under the provisions of that Section and again becomes a deposit contributor, such adjustment shall be made in the amounts to be deducted in respect of the years 1914 and 1915 as, having regard to the dates at which the insured person becomes, or ceases to be, insured under the provisions of

the said Section, appear to the Welsh Insurance Commissioners to be just and necessary.

8.—(1) Save as otherwise expressly provided, the expression "Deposit Contributor" means, for the purposes of Articles 1, 3 and 4 of this Order, a deposit contributor who, if the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund were not insufficient for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act, would be entitled to medical benefit and sanatorium benefit.

(2) In this Order, for the purpose of calculating the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of a deposit contributor to whom this Order applies, no account shall be taken of such part of those sums as is payable out of moneys provided by Parliament.

(3) In this Order a period of time from a named day to a named day includes both those days.

9.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1914.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Declaring Parts II, V, and VI and certain Sections comprised in Parts III, IV, and X

of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force.

BOROUGH OF LANCASTER.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Lancaster;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Lancaster, acting by the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority"), being the Urban District Council of the Urban District of Lancaster (hereinafter referred to as "the District"), have, in pursuance of Section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare certain Parts and Sections of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the District;

And whereas proof has been given to Our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of Section 3 of the Act of 1907, and at least one month has elapsed after the date of that advertisement;

Now therefore, in the exercise of Our Powers in that behalf, We by this Order declare, specify, and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation, Part II, Sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 45, 46, 50, and 51 comprised in Part III; Sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 57, 58, 59, 60, 62, 63, 64, and 68 comprised in Part IV; Part V; Part VI; and Sections 92, 93, and 94 comprised in Part X of the Act of 1907, shall be in force in the District.

(2) Where a Section to which reference is made in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order is a Section comprised in Part II, Part V, or Part VI, or is one of the Sections by sub-division (1) of this Article described as comprised in Part III or Part IV, and declared to be in force, the Section shall be in force in the District subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say:—

Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in Section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify, and direct, the said Section, in its application to the District and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that Section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that Section in the first column of that Schedule were added to and formed part of the Section.

ARTICLE II.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation, the Local Acts cited in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that Schedule, be no longer in force in the District.

(2) Where an enactment in a Local Act, other than the enactments specified in the Second Schedule to this Order, contains provisions which alter, amend, apply, or otherwise

relate to the enactments so specified, those provisions, to the extent to which they are inconsistent with any Section or Part to which Article I of this Order applies, shall no longer be in force in the District.

ARTICLE III.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the District, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE IV.—This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

Part III.
Section Thirty-five.

“ Nothing in this section shall render a person liable to a penalty in respect of a nuisance in relation to the construction of any such cistern as is described in this section, where the cistern has been so constructed as to comply with any regulation of the local authority in force in the district, unless the local authority can show that the said person has received and rejected their offer to bear one-half of the expenses of all necessary work of alteration or new construction.

“ This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section 91 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

“ The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not be exerciseable in relation to any subject-matter of this section.”

Section Thirty-eight.

“ Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exerciseable by or attaching to an owner or occupier

of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890.”

Part IV.
Section Fifty-nine.

“(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district.”

Part V.
Section Seventy-five.

“(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the Local Authority shall give notice for the purpose of sub-section (1) of this section.”

Part VI.
Section Seventy-six.

“(5) In any case in which by virtue of an enactment in any Act in force in the district, the local authority are empowered to pay or contribute towards the payment of a band to perform in a public park or pleasure ground no effect shall, so long as the local authority retain that power, be given to paragraph (d) of sub-section (1) of this section, in relation to that park or ground.”

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BOROUGH OF SUNDERLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Local Government Board have, by Order dated the 26th November, 1914, ordered that on and after the 14th January, 1915, sections 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 33, comprised in Part II, sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, and 51, comprised in Part III, sections 55, 56, 60, and 65, comprised in Part IV, sections 72 and 75, comprised in Part V, Part VI and Part X of the above mentioned Act, shall come into force in the district of the said Borough, subject, however, to the following condition and adaptations, that is to say (unless and until the said Board otherwise order):—

(1) Section 24 of Part II shall have effect as if the words and figures "Nothing in any Local Act shall affect the making or confirmation of any bye-law under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to any subject-matter specified in this section" were added to and formed part of that section.

(2) Section 27 of Part II shall have effect as if the words and figure "(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force" were added to and formed part of that section.

(3) Section 30 of Part II shall have effect as if the words "Nothing in this section shall apply to any wall or other structure in so far as the same is used either for the support of any street or public footpath, or for the protection of any street or public footpath from damage or obstruction by reason of the surface of the street or footpath being above or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or other structure was built after the street or footpath became a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large by or at the expense of a person other than the highway authority responsible for the repair of the street or footpath" were added to and formed part of that section.

(4) Section 35 of Part III shall have effect as if the words and figures "This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section

ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875. The power of making or enforcing byelaws under section twenty-three of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not be exercisable in relation to any subject-matter of this section" were added to and formed part of that section.

(5) Section 38 of Part III shall have effect as if the words and figures "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," were added to and formed part of that section.

(6) Section 75 of Part V shall have effect as if the words and figure "The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this section is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the local authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section" were added to and formed part of that section.

(7) Section 76 of Part VI shall have effect as if the words and figure "(5) In every case for which no other provision is made by this section and in which any such action or proceeding as is authorised by this section will contravene any covenant or condition subject to which a public park or pleasure ground has been acquired and is held by the local authority, no such action or proceeding shall be taken without the consent of every person entitled in law to the benefit of the covenant or condition" were added to and formed part of that section.

(8) Section 92 of Part X shall have effect as if the words "Nothing in any local Act shall affect the making or confirmation of any byelaws under this section; and on and after the date of the confirmation of byelaws under this section the power of enforcing byelaws with respect to any subject-matter of this section shall, so far as that power is conferred by a local Act, cease to be exercisable. Nothing in this section or in any byelaws made thereunder shall be deemed or taken to prejudice, diminish, alter or affect the estates, rights, titles, privileges, powers or authorities of any persons in, over or under the foreshore or sands within or in front of the district or the immediate approaches thereto, or any part thereof respectively" were added to and formed part of that section.

The Order further provides that—

(1) On and after the date of the confirmation of any byelaws made by the local authority under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the height of buildings, section 39 of the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1885, shall be repealed.

(2) On and after the date of the confirmation of any byelaws made by the local authority under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the matters mentioned in section 92 of the Act of 1907, sections 51 and 52 of the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1885, shall be repealed.

(3) On and after the day on which such Order comes into operation

(a) Section 38 of the Borough of Sunderland Act, 1885, so far as the section relates to

any subject-matter of section 23 of the Act of 1907; and

(b) Section 60 of the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1907, so far as the section relates to any subject-matter of section 76 of the Act of 1907;

shall be repealed.

[No. 1805 of the year 1914.]

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING
BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.

Closing of Ports.

Former Notice.—No. 1 of 1914; hereby cancelled.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that local or other circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of periodical exercises, manœuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this Notice,

searchlights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable searchlights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when searchlights are observed to be working.

PART II.

Examination Service.

(4) Under certain circumstances it may become necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad, referred to in Part III of this Notice.

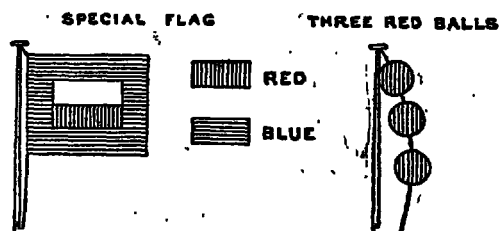
(5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Examination anchorage. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

(6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two red and two white, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.



By night the steamer will carry:—

(a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.

(b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(8) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination anchorage Masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer.

(9) In case of fog, Masters of vessels are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination anchorage itself should be approached with caution.

(10) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are specially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night: the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(11) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

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PART IV.

Sweeping Operations.

H.M. Vessels are constantly engaged in sweeping operations off ports in the United Kingdom.

Whilst so engaged, they work in pairs, connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following signals:—

A black ball at the foremost head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For the public safety, all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to *pass between* the vessels of a pair.
