Any person, upon satisfying the Council that he has graduated in any of the above Universities, or passed any of the above examinations in accordance with the above conditions, shall be entitled to receive a certificate to the effect that he is exempt from passing the Preliminary Examination of the Institute, upon payment of such fee, not exceeding one guinea, as the Council shall from time to time determine.

The Council may, by a resolution passed at a Meeting specially convened for that purpose, with notice of the object, at which Meeting there shall be present not less than twelve of the Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present, and voting, shall vote, resolve-
