The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS** respecting an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Established Clerk to Surveyor of Taxes under the Board of Inland Revenue. Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service, included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910.

*N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alterations as necessity may arise.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 16 and 18, and candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st of January, 1915.

2. The Examination will be in the following subjects:—

## Obligatory—

1. English.
2. Arithmetic.

## Optional—

3. Mathematics.
4. History and Geography.
5. Latin or French or German.
6. Science.
7. Shorthand.

Of the subjects numbered 3-7 not more than three may be taken up.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. Application to attend the Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

4. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Established Clerk to Surveyor of Taxes will be held under the foregoing Regulations in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Birmingham, Bristol, Cambridge, Cardiff, Exeter, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Nottingham, Belfast, Aberdeen and Glasgow, commencing on the 2nd March, 1915.

Not fewer than 250 Candidates in all will be declared successful on the result of this Examination, if so many should be found qualified.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 28th January, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

## MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

## COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following parts of roads within the Urban District of Acton, that is to say,—

So much of the main Uxbridge Road as extends from the bridge of the North and South Western Junction Railway to the Tramway Depôt, Acton Hill;

So much of East Acton Lane as extends from a point 50 yards south of Churchfield Road East to a point 70 yards south of the southern boundary of St. Dunstan's Church; and

So much of Friars' Place Lane as extends from a point opposite the southern end of the bridge over the North and South Western Junction Railway to a point opposite the south end of Friars' Place Green.

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 17th day of March, 1914, and in the Acton and Chiswick Gazette of the 20th March, 1914;

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application:

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the offices of the Urban District Council of Acton, Winchester Street, Acton, on Monday, the 4th day of January, 1915, at half past two o'clock in the afternoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said application.
