The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows —

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908

Commencement

2 This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

NORTH LINDSEY LIGHT RAILWAYS
(POWER TO ADVANCE AND ADDITIONAL CAPITAL) ORDER.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the North Lindsey Light Railways Company (in this Notice referred to as "the Company") intend to apply to the Light Railway Commissioners in the present month of January pursuant to Rule 38 of the Statutory Rules and Orders 1913, No. 1111, made by the Board of Trade, for the consent of the Commissioners to make certain additions and alterations to the above Order for which application was duly made to the Commissioners by the County Council of the County of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey) in the month of September, 1914.

The additions and alterations hereinbefore referred to are to extend the times limited by the North Lindsey Light Railways (Amendment) Order, 1913, for the compulsory purchase of lands required for the railways and works authorised by and described in the North Lindsey Light Railways (Extensions) Order, 1906 (except the part of Railway No. 1 authorised to be abandoned by the said Order of 1913), and the North Lindsey Light Railways (Amendment) Order, 1913, and for the completion of the said railways and works

To alter, vary, amend or repeal any of the provisions of the North Lindsey Light Railways Orders, 1906 to 1913, that are inconsistent with the objects of the intended Order.
