Lisbon, August 18.

**T**HE King of Portugal has named Don Francisco de SusaPachieca, to go in the Quality of his Envoy Extraordinary to the States General of the United Provinces, and he designs to set out the next Week. Orders are given for reinforcing the Garisons in all our Maritime Places. We expect our Fleet from Rio di Genero in the beginning of the next Month. The Hamburgh Convoy will Sail in 2 or 3 days.

Lemberg in Poland, August 27. The Army of this Crown is now encamped near Wisnowiec; from whence a strong Detachment was sent some days ago to destroy all the Corn and Forage about Caminiee, and to fall upon the Tartars, who are lately come, to the number of 10 or 12000 Men, into the Neighbourhood of that place, with a design to make Incursions into the Frontier Provinces of this Kingdom; One of their Parties which had been Ravaging the Country about Karlo-ritz, was, in their return the last Week, met and defeated by some of our Troops, who killed about 200 of them upon the place, and brought back Forty Three Prisoners and 145 Horses. The Advices from Moldavia say, That they were again making Preparations at Jassy, and other Places in that Province, which were thought to be designed for the attacking of Sorocke on the Niester, which is Garisoned by the Poles. The Tartars have put a new Convoy of Provisions into Caminiee.

Falmouth, Sept. 18. On Saturday last came in from Cruising Their Majesties Ship the *Winchester*, having lost her Fore-Top-Mast in foul Weather; The same day several Ships passed before this Harbour bound to the Westward. On the 16th arrived here the *George of London*, Nicholas Liston Commander, laden with Wine and Fruit from Cadiz. Yesterday was seen off of this Harbour a Fleet of Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of several Men of War, standing to the Eastward. The *Barbadoes* Ships are still in Port.

Plimouth, Septemb. 19. Yesterday came into this Port Their Majesties Ship the *Adventure* from Cruising to the Westward; and the *St. Albans* from Kinsale, with a French Privateer of 10 Guns, which she took lately on that Coast. The *St. Albans* came from Ireland in Company of the *Turky* and *Streights* Fleet, which passed by this Port last Night to the Eastward, being about 50 Sail, under Convoy of 6 Men of War, a Fireship, and Bomb Ketch. Yesterday also came in from Falmouth, the *James Galley*, and the *Swift*, who sailed again the same Evening for Spitthead.

Bristol, Sept. 20. This day arrived here a great *Virginia* Ship, called the *Friendship*, the Commander whereof tells us, That the whole Fleet is not far behind, he having parted with them some days ago. The *Owners Endeavour* is just now coming in from the *Barbadoes*.

Weymouth, Sept. 20. Monday in the Evening came into Portland Road Their Majesties Ship the *Hampshire*, with several Merchant Ships under her
