Groynes, Septemb. 26. N. S.

THE Letters from *Cadiz* of the 7th instant give an account, That out of the three *Turky* Ships, the *Shandois*, *Asia*, and *Loyalty*, which were weighed at *Gibraltar*, they had landed 43000 pieces of Cloth, with little Damage; and that they were endeavouring to weigh likewise the *Italian Merchant*, with good hopes of effecting it. They write from *Madrid* of the 16th, that Letters were come in the day before from *Alicant*, which said, That they had received Advice from *Marsailles*, that before the French Fleet got to *Thoulon*, there Died on Board 4000 Men of a Malignant Fever, and that they had put ashore 6000 Sick; That the Count *d'Estrees* Squadron was disarming, in order to lay up the Ships, and to put the Men on Board the Fleet, Commanded by the *Mareschal de Tourville*, who designed to Sail from *Thoulon* about the 15th instant, towards the Ocean.

Falmouth, Sept. 21. On the 18th instant Sailed out of this Port Their Majesties Ships the *Plimouth*, *Winchester*, and *Carlisle*, to the Eastward, with the Merchantmen lately arrived here from *Barbadoes* and *Cadiz*, under their Convoy. On the 19th came in the *Spanish Expedition* Packet Boat, *Francis Chyes* Commander, in three days

from the *Groynes*; In his passage outward he took a French Ship of 80 Tuns, bound from *Rochel* to the Banks of *New-found-land*, and retook a Dutch Pink laden with Salt, which was taken in the Latitude of 67, by a French Privateer of *Bayonne*. Yesterday Morning Sailed hence the *Spanish Alliance* for the *Groynes*, having on Board the Corps of the *Marquis de Villalegre*; The same day arrived here the *Elizabeth* of and from *Boston* in *New England*, *James Updick* Master, with Fish, Oil, Furs, &c. for *London*. On the 19th passed by this Port to the Eastward 11 big Ships under Dutch Colours.

Falmouth, Sept. 23. This day arrived here the *Biscay Merchant* of and for *London*, and the *George* of *Topsham*, both from *Barbadoes*. The *Spanish Alliance* Packet Boat is put back by contrary Winds, and has brought in a Prize, called the *Pigeon*, of 90 Tuns, bound to *France* with Fish from *New-foundland*.

Plimouth, Sept. 22. The 20th instant arrived here the *James and Thomas* of this place, *Paul Bickford* Master, with Sugars from the *Barbadoes*; He parted on the 15th instant with the *Scepter* of *London*, a Ship of 30 Guns, which he supposes to be gone up the Channel.

Plimouth, Sept. 24. Yesterday arrived here a Dutch Merchant Ship of 18 Guns from *Lisbon*; She came thence 13 days ago, in Company of two other Dutch Ships, one of which Foundered at Sea 3 days after they came out,
