At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of March, 1915.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the German Government has issued certain Orders which, in violation of the usages of war, purport to declare the waters surrounding the United Kingdom a military area, in which all British and allied merchant vessels will be destroyed irrespective of the safety of the lives of passengers and crew, and in which neutral shipping will be exposed to similar danger in view of the uncertainties of naval warfare;

And whereas in a memorandum accompanying the said Orders neutrals are warned against entrusting crews, passengers, or goods to British or allied ships;

And whereas such attempts on the part of the enemy give to His Majesty an unquestionable right of retaliation;

And whereas His Majesty has therefore decided to adopt further measures in order to prevent commodities of any kind from reaching or leaving Germany, though such measures will be enforced without risk to neutral ships or to neutral or non-combatant life, and in strict observance of the dictates of humanity;

And whereas the Allies of His Majesty are associated with Him in the steps now to be announced for restricting further the commerce of Germany:

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

I. No merchant vessel which sailed from her port of departure after the 1st March, 1915, shall be allowed to proceed on her voyage to any German port.

Unless the vessel receives a pass enabling her to proceed to some neutral or allied port to be named in the pass, goods on board any such vessel must be discharged in a British port and placed in the custody of the Marshal of the Prize Court. Goods so discharged, not being contraband of war, shall, if not requisitioned for the use of His Majesty, be restored by order of the Court, upon such terms as the Court may in the circumstances deem to be just, to the person entitled thereto.

II. No merchant vessel which sailed from any German port after the 1st March, 1915, shall be allowed to proceed on her voyage with any goods on board laden at such port.

All goods laden at such port must be discharged in a British or allied port. Goods so discharged in a British port shall be placed in the custody of the Marshal of the Prize Court, and, if not requisitioned for the use of His

Majesty, shall be detained or sold under the direction of the Prize Court. The proceeds of goods so sold shall be paid into Court and dealt with in such manner as the Court may in the circumstances deem to be just.

Provided that no proceeds of the sale of such goods shall be paid out of Court until the conclusion of peace, except on the application of the proper Officer of the Crown, unless it be shown that the goods had become neutral property before the issue of this Order.

Provided also that nothing herein shall prevent the release of neutral property laden at such enemy port on the application of the

proper Officer of the Crown.

III. Every merchant vessel which sailed from her port of departure after the 1st March, 1915, on her way to a port other than a German port, carrying goods with an enemy destination, or which are enemy property, may be required to discharge such goods in a British or allied port. Any goods so discharged in a British port shall be placed in the custody of the Marshal of the Prize Court, and, unless they are contraband of war, shall, if not requisitioned for the use of His Majesty, be restored by order of the Court, upon such terms as the Court may in the circumstances deem to be just, to the person entitled thereto.

Provided that this Article shall not apply

in any case falling within Articles II. or IV.

of this Order.

IV. Every merchant vessel which sailed from a port other than a German port after the 1st March, 1915, having on board goods which are of enemy origin or are enemy property may be required to discharge such goods in a British or allied port. Goods so discharged in a British port shall be placed in the custody of the Marshal of the Prize Court, and, if not requisitioned for the use of His Majesty, shall be detained or sold under the direction of the Prize Court. The proceeds of goods so sold shall be paid into Court and dealt with in such manner as the Court may in the circumstances deem to be just.

Provided that no proceeds of the sale of such goods shall be paid out of Court until the conclusion of peace except on the application of the proper Officer of the Crown, unless it be shown that the goods had become neutral property before the issue of this Order.

Provided also that nothing herein shall prevent the release of neutral property of enemy origin on the application of the proper Officer

of the Crown.

V.—(1) Any person claiming to be interested in, or to have any claim in respect of, any goods (not being contraband of war) placed in the custody of the Marshal of the Prize Court under this Order, or in the proceeds of such goods, may forthwith issue a writ in the Prize Court against the proper Officer of the Crown and apply for an order that the goods should be restored to him, or that their proceeds should be paid to him, or for such other order as the circumstances of the case may require.

(2) The practice and procedure of the Prize Court shall, so far as applicable, be followed mutatis mutandis in any proceedings conse-

quential upon this Order.

VI. A merchant vessel which has cleared for a neutral port from a British or allied port, or which has been allowed to pass having an ostensible destination to a neutral port, and proceeds to an enemy port, shall, if captured on any subsequent voyage, be liable to condemnation.

VII. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the liability of any vessel or goods to capture or condemnation independently of this Order.

VIII. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the relaxation of the provisions of this Order in respect of the merchant vessels of any country which declares that no commerce intended for or originating in Germany or belonging to German subjects shall enjoy the protection of its flag.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act. 1990 VV ties Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two-Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Dioceseor Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to. any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to makeand issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present

or nominate to such united Benefice, from time ' to time, as the same shall become vacant.

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions. of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 8th day of February, 1915, in the words following:

We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to

Your Majesty in Council:-

'That the Right Reverend Huyshe, Lord Bishop of Worcester, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of Beaudesert, and the Perpetual Curacy of Henley-in-Arden, both in the County of Warwick, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we

inquired into the circumstances of the case.
"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the said Lord Bishop of Worcester, being the Patron or person entitled in full right to collate to the Rectory of Beaudesert if the same were now vacant, and William Ernest Nelson, the High Bailiff for the time being of the Township of Henley-in-Arden, being the Patron or person entitled in full right to present or nominate to the Perpetual Curacy of Henley-in-Arden if the same were now vacant, have consented to

the proposed Union.
"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us, the said Archbishop, against such Union, and no such cause

has been shown.

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Worcester, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in writing of the said Patrons, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned,

are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice for Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only, and we recommend that the House of Residence belonging to the Benefice of Beaudesert shall be the House of Residence of the United Benefice, and we further recommend that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, namely:—As to the first and every alternate turn thereof the Patronage shall be vested in the High Bailiff for the time being of the Township of Henley-in-Arden aforesaid, And as to the second and every alternate turn in the said Right Reverend Huyshe, Lord Bishop of Worcester, and his Successors.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Beaudesert, situate in the County of Warwick, and Diocese of Worcester, and the Perpetual Curacy of Henley-in-Arden, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls

for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall collate, present, or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benence, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows, that is to say: -the right of presentation shall be exercised by the respective Patrons alternately, the first and every alternate turn, or right of presentation, being vested in the High Bailiff for the time being of the Township of Henleyin-Arden aforesaid, and the second and every alternate turn, or right of presentation, being vested in the Lord Bishop of Worcester for the time being.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Section 21 of the by Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of popula-tion, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more Benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this. Act should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when two or more Benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one Benefice, and, with respect to his own Diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the Benefices within his Diocese, of which such United Benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and, if on such Inquiry, it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such Benefice or Benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such Inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in all other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the Benefices forming part of the United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six

weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent, when the Patron's Consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices from such United Benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the Diocese to which such United Benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such Diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such United Benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be, ipso facto, dissolved, so far only as regards such Benefice or Benefices so proposed to be separated from such United Benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices shall be, and be deemed and taken to be, a separate and distinct Benefice or Benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the Patron or Patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no Benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the Consent in writing of the Patron or Patrons thereof.

And whereas by Section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that "Whenever two or more Benefices which have at any time been united into one Benefice shall be disunited and become separate Benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of Benefices of which such United Benefice consisted, or to one or more of such Benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the Consent of the Patron or Patrons of such Benefices respectively, (such Consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such United Benefice to each of such Benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the Benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such Benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole United Benefice."

And whereas the Right Reverend Archibald, Lord Bishop of Exeter, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 3rd day of July, 1912, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—
"We, Archibald Lord Bishop of Exeter,

do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to us that the disunion of the United Benefice of Knowstone with Molland, in the County of Devon, and our Diocese of Exeter, by the separation of the said Vicarage of Knowstone from the said Vicarage of Molland, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"A. Exon."

And whereas, on the 11th day of July, 1912, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case.

And whereas the said Bishop did, by a further Representation in writing, dated the 10th day of October, 1913, furnish the said Archbishop with a Statement of Circumstances as follows:—

"Whereas your Grace having inquired of me, Archibald, Lord Bishop of Exeter, what are the circumstances of the case on which I found my opinion that the disunion of the Vicarage of Knowstone with the Vicarage of Molland, in the County of Devon, and Diocese of Exeter, by the separation of the said Vicarage of Knowstone from the said Vicarage of Molland may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, I do hereby represent to your Grace that the circumstances of the case are as follows, that is to say:-

"1. That each of the said Parishes of Knowstone and Molland has its own Parish Church with accommodation for 245 and 250 persons respectively and that the population of the said Parishes was 343 and 397 respectively at the Census of 1901 and at the Census of 1911 the combined population was 722.

"2. That the distance between the two Parishes is five miles or thereabouts and they are separated by a very rough and hilly road.

"3. That there is a house of residence at Knowstone but no house of residence at

"4. That the Reverend Edward Henry Moscardi is the Incumbent of the said United Benefice, and he and Ethel Moscardi his wife are the Patrons thereof and they are consenting to the proposed disunion as appears by their consent hereunder written.

"5. That the gross Annual Income of the Parish of Knowstone is £369 derived from Tithe Rent Charge amounting to £301 as commuted and 55 acres of Glebe and there is a house of residence belonging to the said

Vicarage.

"6. That the gross Annual Income of the Parish of Molland is £339 derived solely from Tithe Rent Charge commuted at £339 and there is no house of residence belonging thereto.

"7. That in addition to the above-mentioned Incomes of Knowstone and Molland there is at present payable to the Vicar of Knowstone with Molland under the trusts of the Will of one Thomas Clarke, dated 7th August, 1721, and a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners dated 6th May, 1892, the Sheaf Tithes of the Parish of Molland except West Molland Farm commuted at £99 13s. 2d. (hereinafter referred to as 'Clarke's Charity') towards defraying the Stipend of a Curate resident in the said Parish and duly licensed

thereto by the Ordinary.
"8. That the First Fruits £26 10s. 10d. and Tenths £2 13s. 1d. now charged upon the united Vicarage of Knowstone with Molland shall be apportioned equally between the said Vicarage of Knowstone and Molland.

"9. That the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne have consented to such apportion-

ment as aforesaid.
"10. That it is proposed that if the said Benefice of Knowstone with Molland shall be disunited that the income derived from Clarke's Charity shall be retained for the Benefice of Molland. It is intended to apply to the Charity Commissioners to amend the said Scheme so far as may be necessary in order to render this effectual and the Commissioners have signified their readiness to give effect to such proposed amendment.

"A. Exon."

And whereas, on the 20th day of March, 1914, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council as follows, that is to

say:—
"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:— "That the Right Reverend Archibald, Lord

Bishop of Exeter, in which Diocese is situate the United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Knowstone and the Vicarage of Molland, in the County of Devon, having represented unto Us that the Disunion of the said United Benefice, by the separation of the Vicarage of Knowstone from the Vicarage of Molland, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, We inquired into the circumstances

of the case.
"That on such Inquiry it appeared to Us that such Union might be usefully dissolved and that the Reverend Edward Henry Moscardi and Ethel Moscardi his Wife being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said United Benefice of Knowstone with Molland if the same were now vacant consent to

the proposed Disunion.
"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council We caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer doors of each of the Parish Churches of Knowstone and Molland with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to Us the said Archbishop against such

Disunion but no such cause has been shown.
"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Exeter, Our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said Patrons of the said United Benefice, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto

annexed.

"And We do hereby certify the Inquiry aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for the Dis-union of the said United Benefice by the Separation of the Vicarage of Knowstone from the Vicarage of Molland so as to constitute each of them a separate Benefice with Cure of

Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only. "And We further recommend that the Benefices when so disunited shall retain their respective incomes and bear their respective outgoings except that the annual payments for first fruits and tenths shall be apportioned equally between the said Benefices and that the income derived from Clarke's Charity (under the Trusts of the Will of the said Thomas Clarke, dated 7th August, 1721, and a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners dated 6th May, 1892, from the Sheaf Tithes of the Parish of Molland except West Molland Farm commuted at £99 13s. 2d.) shall be retained by the Benefice of Molland for which purpose an amending Scheme is to be made by the Charity Commissioners.

"Randall, Cantuar."

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Knowstone and the Vicarage of Molland, situate in the County of Devon, and Diocese of Exeter, shall be disunited by separating the said Vicarage of Knowstone from

the said Vicarage of Molland.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, and with the consent of the Patrons, to assign and attach to each of such Benefices respectively its own original endowments and emoluments and to direct that each Benefice shall bear its own charges and outgoings except that the annual payments for first fruits and tenths shall be apportioned equally between the said Benefices and that the income derived from Clarke's Charity (under the Trusts of the Will of the said Thomas Clarke, dated the 7th day of August, 1721, and a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners dated the 6th day of May, 1892, from the Sheaf Tithes of the Parish of Molland, except West Molland Farm, commuted at £99 13s. 2d.) shall be retained by the Benefice of Molland, for which purpose an amending. Scheme is to be made by the Charity Commissioners.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Lancaster) Order, 1915.

Dated 12th March, 1915.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the administrative county of Lancaster, I hereby make the following Order:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County. of Lancaster) Order, 1915."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the administrative county of Lancaster so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—Wild Duck, Snipe, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. (a) The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the administrative county of Lancaster to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Bunting, Buzzard (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Harrier (all species), Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Lengtailed Tit, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Wryneck.

(b) The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall also apply to the following additional species of Wild Birds in the townships of Alt, Ashton-under-Lyne, Audenshaw, Bardsley, Denton, Droylsden, Hartshead, Hurst, Lees, Little Moss, Mossley, Waterloo, and Woodhouses, in the Ashton-under-Lyne Union, in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Blackbird, Bullfinch, Bunting (all species), Chaffinch, Coot, Corncrake (Landrail), Turtle Dove, Firecrest, Flycatcher (all species), Greenfinch, Hawfinch, Moorhen, Pipit (all species), Water Rail, Mealy Redpole, Shrike (all species), Missel Thrush, Tit (all species).

All birds protected during the whole of the Year in certain Areas.

- IV. During the particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned areas of the administrative county of Lancaster:—
- (a) Such portion of the River Mersey, between the City of Liverpool and the County Borough of Warrington as is within the district of the administrative county of Lancaster. This area is shown in pink on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, and dated the 12th March, 1915.
- (b) That portion of the Hundred of West Derby bounded on the west by the Irish Sea, on the east by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway running between Southport and Liverpool, on the north by the County Borough of Southport, and thence to low water in a straight line, and on the south by the road leading from Formby Station to the Formby Lifeboat Station, and thence to low water in a straight line. This area is shown in blue on the map referred to above.

Sunday and Christmas Day Protection.

V. During the particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the administrative county of Lancaster except in the township of Poulton-with-Fearnhead.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

VI. (a) During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the administrative county of Lancaster:—Buzzard (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Harrier (all species), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark (all

species), Merlin, Owl (all species), Raven, Woodpecker (all species).

(b) And during such period the killing or taking of any of the following additional species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the townships of Alt, Ashton-under-Lyne, Audenshaw, Bardsley, Denton, Droylsden, Hartshead, Hurst, Lees, Little Moss, Mossley, Waterloo, and Woodhouses, in the Ashton-under-Lyne Union:—Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Blackbird, Brambling, Bullfinch, Bunting (all species), Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corncrake (Landrail), Crossbill, Cuckoo, Tree Creeper, Dipper, Turtle Dove, Fieldfare, Firecrest, Flycatcher (all species), Goldcrest, Grebe (all species), Greenfinch, Hawfinch, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Moorhen, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Gray Phalarope, Red Necked Phalarope, Pipit (all species), Water Rail, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Redwing, Robin, Sand Piper (all species), Shrike (all species), Siskin, Stone Chat, Swallow, Swift, Missel Thrush, Song Thrush, Tit (all species), Twite, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Eccs.

All Eggs Protected in a certain Area.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the undermentioned area, which is shown in blue on the map referred to in Clause IV:—

That portion of the Hundred of West Derby bounded on the west by the Irish Sea, on the east by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway running between Southport and Liverpool, on the north by the county borough of Southport, and thence to low water in a straight line, and on the south by the road leading from Formby Station to the Formby Lifeboat Station, and thence to low water in a straight line.

Certain Eggs Protected throughout the County.

VIII.—(a) The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the administrative county of Lancaster:—

Bittern, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Sheld Duck, Tufted Duck, Wild Duck (Mallard), Dunlin, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Linnet, Merlin, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Golden Plover, Ringed Plover, Pochard, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Snipe, Stonechat, Teal, Tern (all species), Long-tailed Tit, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Widgeon, Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species), Wren, Wryneck, and (after April 20th in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

(b) The taking or destroying of the eggs of

the following additional species of Wild Birds is prohibited in the townships of Alt, Ashton-under-Lyne, Audenshaw, Bardsley, Denton, Droylsden, Hartshead, Hurst, Lees, Little Moss, Mossley, Waterloo, and Woodhouses in the Ashton-under-Lyne Union:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Blackbird, Bullfinch, Bunting (all species), Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corncrake (Landrail), Crossbill, Cuckoo, Turtle Dove, Flycatcher (all species), Grebe (all species), Greenfinch, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), House Martin, Sand Martin, Moorhen, Nightingale, Nuthatch, Pipit (all species), Water Rail, Robin, Shrike (all species), Swallow, Swift, Missel Thrush, Song Thrush, Tit (all species).
