Warsaw, Sept. 15. Directions are given for issuing out the Circular Letters to summon a General Dier, which is to meet here in December next.

Vienna, Sept. 30. By the last Advices from Hungary, the Imperial Army was encamped near Peter Wavadin; and the Turks about Belgrade. A Body of Tartars had passed the Save at Sabatz, and had afterwards devided into several Parties to make Incursions into Selavonia. The Emperors Forces under General Veterani were encamped the 15th of the last Month near Caransebes, being about 16000 strong, and they will be reinforced by a Detachement from our Main Army in case the Grand Vicier sends any considerable Body of his Troops towards Transilvania. They write from Segedin, that Teckeley lay about Temeswaer with 6000 Turks, Turtars, and Hungarians.
