

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, of the Parish of Bovingdon, of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Boxmoor, and of the Parish of Hemel Hempstead, all in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Cures:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, of the said Parish of Bovingdon, of the said New Parish of Boxmoor, and of the said Parish of Hemel Hempstead, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John, Bourne End, situate as aforesaid:

"And whereas a Warrant under Your Majesty's Royal Sign Manual has authorized the passing of these presents under the Seal of the Duchy of Cornwall:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), with the consent of His Royal Highness Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David, Prince of Wales, Duke of Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Chester and Carrick, Baron of Renfrew, Lord of the Isles and Great Steward of Scotland, as the Patron, in right of His said Duchy of Cornwall, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, (in testimony whereof the Seal of the said Duchy of Cornwall has hereunto been affixed), with the consent of The Church Association Trust, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Bovingdon, (in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their Common Seal), with the consent of the Reverend Lawrence Gee, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Hemel Hempstead, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Boxmoor, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Hemel Hempstead, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, of the said Parish of Bovingdon, of the said New Parish of Boxmoor, and of the said Parish of Hemel Hempstead, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John, Bourne End, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Con-

solidated Chapelry of Saint John, Bourne End.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Bourne End, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, the Parish of Bovingdon, the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Boxmoor, and the Parish of Hemel Hempstead, all in the County of Hertford, and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which are comprised within, and are bounded by, an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Ashley Green, in the County of Buckingham, and in the Diocese of Oxford, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, crosses the middle of the footpath leading from Lower Farm to Long Green, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Bourne End to Long Green, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road running along the eastern side of Long Green, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Long Green into the road running from Bourne End to Berkhamstead, and extending thence first eastward, and then north-eastward, along the middle of the said road leading from Long Green for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road running from Bourne End to Berkhamstead, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading across Bankmill Bridge to Little Heath, and extending thence first north-eastward, then south-eastward, and then again north-eastward, along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of Bullbeggars Wood, and extending thence south-eastward first to and along the said fence and then along the fences forming the northern boundaries of the Closes numbered 1, 2 and 3 upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation for a distance in all of 30 chains or thereabouts to a point on the western side of the road leading from Littlebeath Great Farm to Bourne End, and extending thence south-eastward first across such road to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the Close numbered 4 upon the said map or plan, and then along such fence for a distance in all of 14 chains or thereabouts to the eastern end of the said fence upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Sunnyside, from the said Parish of Hemel Hempstead, and extending thence in a straight line due east for
