

" And whereas the terms of such transfer are in our opinion fair and reasonable:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bristol, and with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter, testified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals, that upon and from the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any further conveyance or act in the law, the property coloured red upon the said tracing annexed hereto with its appurtenances, shall, subject always to the liabilities and charges if any to which the said property may now be specifically liable, be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter in the manner contemplated by the said Act, and that in consideration of such transfer as aforesaid the payment of the said annual sum of £6,780 shall be reduced by the sum of £93 as from the 25th day of December, in the year 1914.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Bristol.
