The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of April, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson, or perpetual right of Patronage, of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Noke, in the County and Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas the Advowson, or perpetual right of Patronage, of and presentation to the said Benefice of Noke is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in George Herbert Radcliffe, of the Sanctuary, Westminster Abbey, in the County of Middlesex, Esquire:

“ And whereas the said George Herbert Radcliffe is desirous that the whole Advowson,

or perpetual right of Patronage, of and presentation to the said Benefice of Noke, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster (hereinafter called the said Dean and Chapter), and their Successors:

“ And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are willing to accept the proposed transfer, and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter-mentioned:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Charles, now Bishop of Oxford, in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter-mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Noke, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in, or in respect of which, the right of Patronage, or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Noke:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George Herbert Radcliffe, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter, (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right
