

## NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

(1 and 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 83 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and of every other power enabling them on that behalf, to issue Regulations for the purpose of confirming the provisional Treasury Regulations dated the 20th ultimo, which provide for the exercise and performance by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee alone of certain of the powers and duties of the several bodies of Commissioners appointed for the purposes of Part I. of the Act as provided in subsection 2 of the above quoted section.
