

aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some Public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with Notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present or nominate to such United Benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant”:

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in Writing, bearing date the 28th day of December, 1914, in the words following:—

“We, Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“That the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Benefice of Coln Rogers, and the Benefice of Coln St. Denis, both in the County of Gloucester, having represented unto us that the said Benefices are contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

“That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Coln Rogers (in case the same were now vacant), and The Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Coln St. Denis, (in case the same were now vacant), have consented to the proposed Union:

“That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with Notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, might, within such 6 weeks show cause in writing, under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to us the said Archbishop against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

“The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Gloucester, our Inquiry into the

circumstances of the Case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in Writing of the said Patrons, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before-mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

“And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

“And we recommend that the Patronage of the said United Benefice shall be vested in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, and the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, alternately, and that the first right of presentation, after the said Benefices shall come to be holden by the same Incumbent, shall belong to the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Coln Rogers, situate in the County and Diocese of Gloucester, and the Rectory of Coln Saint Denis, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the Patronage or right of presentation to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant, shall be exercised in the following manner, that is to say:—the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, and the Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, alternately, and the first turn, or right of presentation, shall belong to, and be exercised by, the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester.
