

and excluding articles which are knitted or are made from knitted fabrics), but which are not engaged in the making of handkerchiefs, neckties, scarves, mufflers, gloves, socks, stockings, spats, gaiters, hats, caps (other than chefs' caps and hospital ward caps), infants' millinery,

baby linen and such articles of clothing as are made for children without distinction of sex.

The minimum time-rate for learners under 14 years of age shall be 3s. a week, and on reaching 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shown above, all employment prior to the age of 14 being disregarded.

The above rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.
