He King of Denmark returned hither yesterday with the whole Court from Hoistein; The Fortifications of Ratzburg are demolished, and the Troops retired out of the Country of Saxe-Lawenburg, pursuant to the late Treaty. The Danish Artillery that was employed against that place is tent back to Gluckstadt; and part of the Infantry which embarked at Travemundt near Lubecke, arrived here this day, having been but 24 hours in their passage. The Letters from Stockholme tell us, that great Preparations were making there for Solemnizing the Funeral of the of Sueden on the 27th of this Month; and that the General Dyet of that Kingdom would be opened the 28th.

Zagrau in Croatia, October 20. The Count de Bathiani, our Ban or Governor, has fince his late Expedition against the Enemy, in which he took and destroyed the Town of Brunzeni-Maydon, been to visit all the frontier places of this Kingdom; but the Vice-ban Steffen Hellasich remains with part of the Croatian Militia near Turopoli, in order to another Excurlion. In the mean time we have advice that the Turkith Army is separated; That the Grand Visier is gone for Adrianople, after having appointed the Winter Quarters for his Troops; and that the Tartars are returned home.

Vienna, November 7. Their Imperial Majesties, with the King of the Romans, and the Queen Dowager of Poland, returned hither this day from Neustadt. The Duke of Croy is expected here the next week, the Imperial Troops being marched to the Winter Quarters affigned Daily Consultations are held about the Preparations for the next year; and several Officers are come hither who are to be employed in the new Levies. The Prince de Fundi intends to part from hence in few days on his Embassy to Rome.

Hailbron, November 12. The Confederate

now marching to their Winter Quarters; a confiderable Body of them will be poited in the Black Forest, and so near together, that they may upon any occasion be quickly in a posture to repulse the Enemies Incursions. Prince Lewis has likewise resolved to quarter several Regiments along the Neckar, and has ordered Redoubts to be built on the River, for the greater fecurity of the Country on that fide; He has caused an Order to be published, dated, the 2d of the last Month at his Head Quarter at Alvingen, by which all Persons are forbid upon pain of death, and confication of Goods, to supply the French with any Cattle or Horses out of these parts, and a Reward of 1000 Crowns is promifed to fuch as shall discover any that offend herein. New Levies are making in the Country hereabouts for the Duke of Savoy and other Princes.

Liege, Nov. 11. The Brandenburg Troops who were lately posted in our Neighbourhood under the Command of the Baron de Heyden, are marched towards Aix la Chapelle, where they are to have their Head Quarters; Of those that are in the Diocess of Cologne part will remain there, and the rest are to Winter in the Dutchy of Cleves. The Mareschal de Boufflers has put the French Troops that lay near the Meuse into Winter Quarters in the Dutchy of Luxemburg and the Condrotz, and is gone himself towards Mons. The Duke of Holstein-Ploen, Velt-Marshal General of the Forces of the States-General of the United-Provinces, arrived yesterday at Maestricht to take possession of that Government, and was received there by the Garifon in Arms, and with a discharge of the Cannon.

Dublin, Nov. 15. The James Yacht arrived here this day with 4 Mails and divers Passengers from Holyhead, whence she failed on Wednesday last was sennight; They had very bad Weather, and were put into the Isle of Man; a Merchant Ship of London who came out with them, was cast away on a Rock in the Bay of Arglas, and another Ship in her Company struck on the same Rock, but got off again.
