HIS MAJESTY the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Distinguished Conduct Medal to the undermentioned Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and Men for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty whilst serving with the Expeditionary Forces in France and Flanders, The Dardanelles, and Turkey in Asia.

10807	Serjeant	Albone, W	2nd Battalion, Grena- dier Guards	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Cuinchy on the night of 21st June, 1915, in going down a mine and assisting in the rescue of four men under circumstances of great risk. On the morning of the 22nd June the enemy exploded a mine, entombing about nine of our men, and this Non-commissioned Officer went down the mine, time after time, with the greatest courage, and assisted in bringing out all the men. He was badly affected by the poison fumes.
7762	Lance- Corporal	Alexander, A. W	2nd Battalion, The Hampshire Regi- ment	For coolness under fire on the 8th May, 1915, south-west of Krithia (Dardanelles), in reforming the men in the firing line, and going back for reinforcements for an isolated posi- tion.
