ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH AUGUST 1915.)

(AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW INFECTED
AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Declaration of American Gooseberry Mildew Infected Area.

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be infected with American Gooseberry Mildew and an Infected Area for the purposes of the American Gooseberry Mildew (Infected Areas) Order of 1915.

Notification of Disease.

2. Reports of the existence of American Gooseberry Mildew within the Infected Area shall be made to the Board or to Mr. B. L. Wolf, 8, Hotspur Terrace, North Road, Plymouth.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS (AMEND-
MENT) ACT, 1907.

URBAN DISTRICT OF SURBITON.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order made by the Local Government Board and dated the 26th day of July, 1915, it is ordered that on and after the 30th August, 1915, section 25 of the Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Surbiton, subject to the following condition and adaptation, namely, that the power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section 157 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section 23 of the Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling-houses, other than yards and open spaces common to two or more dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exercisable in the said district.

RAILWAY AND CANAL TRAFFIC ACT,
1888.

Proposed Amendment of Classification.

NOTICE is hereby given that, pursuant to the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, the various Railway Companies of Great Britain and Ireland, represented by the undersigned, have applied to the Board of Trade to amend the Classification of Merchandise Traffic and Schedule of Maximum Rates and Charges applicable thereto charged by such Railway Companies by adding Tanks or Reservoirs, iron or steel, for storage of compressed air or compressed gas to Class 2 of the said Classification.
