PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the City of Worcester, on the 23rd day of June, 1914, agreed to petition, and the Council of the said City thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of The Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the Boundaries of the Wards of the said City:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 10th day of August, 1914, to refer the Petition of the said Council to a Committee of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 17th day of September, 1914, to approve the Report of the said Committee to the effect that, no Petition having been presented against a compliance with the prayer of the said Petition within the time limited by Statute in that behalf, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme in accordance with the provisions of the said Section 30 of The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas on the 29th day of September, 1914, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did duly warrant and appoint Harold McKenna, Esquire, Barristerat-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for carrying into effect the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas the said Commissioner has, in pursuance of the powers given him by virtue of the said Appointment, prepared the following Scheme, dated the 9th day of February, 1915, accordingly:

CITY OF WORCESTER.

"I, the said Harold McKenna, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said Appointment under the said Act, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the Boundaries of the said Wards into which the said City is divided, which Wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:---

No. 1, ST. JOHN'S WARD. No. 2, ST. NICHOLAS WARD. No. 3, All SAINTS WARD. No. 4, ST. PETER'S WARD. No. 5, CLAINES WARD. No. 6, ST. MARTIN'S WARD.

"And when in the following descriptions of the Ward boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the City Boundary) a street, road, or footpath is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road, or footpath, and when any street, road, or footpath is deS. 1

scribed as adjoining another street, road, or footpath the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets, roads, or footpaths and continued would intersect each other, and a point described as opposite a street, road, or footpath is to be taken as opposite the centre of the street, road, or footpath, and when a river, stream, or canal is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary (except when it refers to the City Boundary) is to be taken as the *medium filum* of such river, stream, or canal.

"No. 1, St. John's Ward.

"I do hereby determine that St. John's Ward shall comprise so much of the City of Worcester as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of Hallow Road, on the boundary of the City, thence following the said boundary commencing along the centre of the said road, and thence proceeding in an easterly direction to the centre of the river Severn, thence along the centre of the river Severn in a generally southerly direction to the City boundary, thence along the City boundary commencing in a westerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No 2, ST. NICHOLAS WARD.

"I do hereby determine that St. Nicholas Ward shall comprise so much of the City of Worcester as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore described, in the river Severn opposite to the centre of the street called the Butts, thence proceeding in a straight line to and along the centres successively of the said street and Shaw Street, thence proceeding to and along the centres of Sansome Street, Lowesmoor and Lowesmoor Place successively to a point in the centre of Lowesmoor Bridge, above the centre of the Worcester and Birmingham Canal, thence to and along the centre of the said Canal in a northerly direction to St. George's Lane Bridge, thence to and along the centre of the said Bridge and St. George's Lane North in a westerly direction to the intersection of Shrubbery Road, thence southward along the centre of Shrubbery Road to the intersection of Shrubbery Avenue, thence along the centre of Shrubbery Avenue in a westerly direction to the intersection of the Barbourne Road, thence proceeding along the centre of the Barbourne Road in a northerly direction to the intersection of Thorneloe Walk, thence along the centre of Thorneloe Walk in a westerly direction and continuing in a straight line in prolongation of the centre line of that part of Thorneloe Walk which lies between the southern end of Thorneloe Road and Pound Walk to the boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore described, in the centre of the river Severn, and thence following the said boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, in a generally southerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 3, All Saints Ward.

"I do hereby determine that All Saints Ward shall comprise so much of the City of

Worcester as is contained within the following: boundary: ----

Commencing at a point on the boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore described, at the point of conjunction of the eastern boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, and the western and southern boundaries of No. 2, St. Nicholas Ward, as hereinbefore described respectively in the river Severn, thence proceeding along the southern boun-dary of No. 2, St. Nicholas Ward, in an easterly direction to the intersection of Silver-Street, thence along the centres of Silver Street, St. Martin's Gate, George Street, and George Street Bridge successively to a point in the said Bridge above the centre of the Worcester and Birmingham Canal, thence proceeding to and along the centre of the said Canal in a generally southerly direction to the boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore described, in the river Severn, thence along the said boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 4, ST. PETER'S WARD.

"I do hereby determine that St. Peter's. Ward shall comprise so much of the City of Worcester as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore de-scribed, at the point of conjunction of the eastern boundary of the said Ward and the south-eastern boundary of No. 3, All Saints Ward, as hereinbefore described, thence proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction. along the said south-eastern boundary of No. 3, All Saints Ward, to a point in the centre of the Worcester and Birmingham Canal opposite to the centre of Canal Side Walk, thence to and along Canal Side Walk to the intersection of Dent Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Dent Street to its junction with Windsor Place, thence to and along the centre of Windsor Place to the intersection of Wyld's Lane, thence along the centre of Wyld's Lane to the intersection of Perry Wood Walk, thence along the centre of Perry Wood' Walk to the City boundary, thence along the-City boundary in a generally southerly and subsequently in a westerly direction to the point of conjunction of the City boundary with the eastern boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore described, and thence following the said eastern boundary of the said Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 5, CLAINES WARD.

"I do hereby determine that Claines Ward's shall comprise so much of the City of Worcester as is contained within the following: boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore described at the point of conjunction of the eastern boundary of the said Ward with the northern boundary of No. 2, St. Nicholas Ward, as hereinbefore described, thence proceeding in a northerly direction along the said eastern boundary of No. 1, St. John's Ward, to the City boundary, thence along the City boundary commencing in a northerly direction to a point in the centre of Bilford Bridge, thence proceeding to and along the centre of the Worcester and Birmingham Canal in a southwesterly direction to the point of conjunction of the northern boundary of No. 2, St. Nicholas Ward, as hereinbefore described, with the said Canal, thence along the said northern boundary of the said Ward in a south-westerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 6, St. MARTIN'S WARD.

"I do hereby determine that St. Martin's Ward shall comprise so much of the City of Worcester as is contained within the following boundary:----

Commencing on the City boundary at the point of conjunction of the said boundary with the eastern boundary of No. 5, Claines Ward, as hereinbefore described, in the centre of Bilford Bridge, thence following the City boundary commencing in a north-easterly direction to the intersection of Perry Wood Walk, thence following successively the northern boundary of No. 4, St. Peter's Ward, and the boundary of No. 3, All Saints Ward, on the east, north, and subsequently on the east again to the point of conjunction of the boundaries of No. 2, St. Nicholas Ward, and No. 3, All Saints Ward, thence along the southern and subsequently the eastern boundary of No. 2, St. Nicholas Ward, and the eastern boundary of No. 5, Claines Ward, all as hereinbefore described respectively, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" "And I do hereby assign and apportion six Councillors to each and every of the said Wards as follows, that is to say:—

"To No. 1, St. John's Ward.

"To No. 2, ST. NICHOLAS WARD.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Christ's College, Cambridge, on the 31st day of July, 1915, and sealed on the same day, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in. "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":---

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes approved by the late Queen Victoria in Council on the 29th day of June, 1895, as. amended by the Statute approved by the late King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 15th day of September, 1902, in relation to Christ's College, in the University of Cambridge, duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose, held on the 31st day of July, 1915, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the persons present and voting, and submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council:

We, the Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of the said College, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, (40 and 41 Victoria, chap. 48), do hereby alter and amend the Statutes approved by the late Queen Victoria in Council and by the late King Edward the Seventh in Council, in relation to our said College in the following manner, viz.:--

By repealing the whole of the Statutes approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 29th day of June, 1895, as amended by the Statute approved by the late King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 15th day of September, 1902, and by substituting therefor the following Statutes to form an amended body of Statutes:—

STATUTES OF CHRIST'S COLLEGE IN THE

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE

CHAPTER I.

The Visitor.

The Visitor of the College shall be the Chancellor of the University.

CHAPTER II.

The Foundation.

There shall be in the College a Master or Keeper, fifteen Fellows, or more or less according to the provisions of Chapters XVIII, XIX and XXXII, and such number of Scholars as are provided for out of the Scholars' Fund (Chapter XXIV) and the Additional Funds for Scholars (Chapter XXV).

CHAPTER III.

The Government of the College.

1. The Master and Fellows for the time being shall have the complete government and control of the College and of its property and income, subject to such exceptions and special provisions as are hereinafter laid down in these Statutes.

2. The consent of the Master and Fellows expressed by a College Order, as defined in Chapter XXVII, § 8, shall be essential before (1) any action at law is undertaken on behalf of the College, (2) any property of the College is alienated or let on lease, (3) any pension is granted out of the revenues of the College, (4) any receiver of College rents is appointed, (5) any person is preferred to a benefice in the patronage of the College, (6) any person is pre-sented for the office of Proctor or other University office, (7) the College Seal is affixed to any document or writing.

CHAPTER IV.

The authority of the Master.

1. The Master shall preside over the Fellows, Scholars, and other Members of the College, and shall administer the affairs of the College according to the Statutes.

2. In cases where no provision has been made by the Statutes of the College, or by any College Order or Resolution of the Master and Fellows, the Master shall have power to do what he thinks necessary for the maintenance of good order and discipline in the College. He shall however refer any question of importance, which does not require an immediate decision, to a meeting of the Master and Fellows for decision by them.

CHAPTER V.

The qualifications, election, and admission of the Master.

1. The Master shall be a Master of Arts or of some equal or superior degree in the University of Cambridge or of Oxford. He shall be such as in the judgment of the Fellows is well qualified to preside over the College as a place of education, religion, learning and research.

2. On the day after a vacancy of the office of Master has become known to that one of the Fellows then resident in Cambridge who is first in order of precedence as defined in Chapter XVI, § 13, or if that day be Sunday then on the Monday following, he shall summon a Meeting of the Fellows then in Cambridge and announce to them the vacancy. He shall also, on the same day, cause to be fixed on the outer door of the Chapel a notice in writing of the vacancy and of the time appointed for the election of a new Master. Such time shall be noon on the fourteenth day from the date of the notice if the vacancy occur in term, or on the twenty-eighth day if it occur out of term. He shall also send a copy of such notice to all the absent Fellows.

3. On the appointed day the Fellows shall meet together at noon in the Chapel; the Fellow then present who is first in order of precedence shall preside and shall read aloud the above § 1 on the "qualifications of the Master," and every Fellow in order of admission shall make the following declaration:—" Ego M.N.polliceor me in huius Collegii magistrum electurum illum virum quem Statuto antelecto significari et apertius describi, et optimum esse ad Collegii commodum et honorem promovendum, mea conscientia iudicabit; omni illegitima affectione, timore, odio, spe et amore, postpositis. Ita bona fide polliceor et ita do fidem."

4. The Fellow presiding shall write his own vote and receive the written votes of the other Fellows, and shall read the votes aloud.

5. If a majority of the existing Fellows agree in voting for one person, the Fellow presiding shall declare him to be elected. If there be no such majority in favour of one person, the process of voting may be repeated as often as the Fellows think fit during five days, reckoned from the beginning of the election. If at the end of the said five days there be no such majority in favour of one person, the election of a Master qualified according to § 1 above shall for that turn be made by the Visitor of the College.

6. If any Fellow who was absent at the beginning of the election returns to College before the election is completed, he shall be allowed to take part with the other Fellows in electing, having first made the required declaration.

7. As soon as may be after his election the Master elected shall be presented by two of the Fellows to the Vice-Chancellor of the University, in whose presence he shall make the following declaration:—" Ego M.N. polliceor me Collegium Christi, cuius nunc sum electus magister et custos, diligenter et fideliter administraturum iuxta vires et industriam meam; parique modo illius bona omnia, terras, tenementa, possessiones, reditus spirituales et temporales, iuraque, libertates, et privilegia, ceteras quoque res universas tam mobiles quam immobiles curaturum; correctiones praeterea et punitiones ac reformationes quoties et quo loco eas fieri conveniat, omni personarum acceptione postposita, iuste executurum, iuxta Statuta pro Collegio administrando edita; quae

Statuta omnia et Ordinationes universas Collegii pro virili parte enitar tam a meipso quam. ab aliis integre inviolateque observari. Ita bona fide polliceor, et haec omnia in me. recipio."

CHAPTER VI.

Residence and Emoluments of the Master.

1. The Master shall reside in College during two-thirds at least of every term, and altogether during two hundred and ten days at least in every year, unless he shall be absent on . the business of the College or on account of illness or other sufficient cause.

2. The Master shall have free occupation of. the College Lodge, which shall be kept in good and sufficient repair and habitable condition externally and internally at the cost of the College.

3. Besides the dividends described in Chapter XXX the Master shall receive during every week of his residence in College twice the sum which is assigned for commons to a Fellow; and when he is absent and engaged on College business he shall be allowed an adequate sum for travelling expenses.

CHAPTER VII.

Government of the College during vacancy of the Mastership.

1. When the office of Master is vacant the Fellow then resident in Cambridge who is first in order of precedence shall have the authority of the Master.

2. There shall be no election of Fellows or Scholars while the office of Master is vacant.

3. There shall be no election to any other College office while the office of Master is, vacant.

CHAPTER VIII.

The Deputy of the Master.

When the Master is absent or sick, one of the Fellows appointed by him under his Seal, or in default of such appointment the Fellow then resident in Cambridge who is first in order of precedence shall act in his place and exercise for all purposes the authority of. Master.

CHAPTER IX.

Appointment of Vice-Master in case of the incapacity of the Master.

1. If the Master shall at any time become incapable of performing the duties of his office, and if the Master himself make application to the Visitor, or if at a meeting of the Fellows convened for the purpose a majority of the existing Fellows agree to make application to the Visitor, the Visitor may, if he think fit, authorize the Fellows to appoint one of the Fellows to act in the Master's place during his incapacity, and to assign to the Fellow so appointed, in addition to his dividend as a Fellow, such portion as they shall think fit, not exceeding one half, of the income assigned to the Master by way of dividend under Chapter XXX, § 3. 2. It shall be the duty of that one of the

2. It shall be the duty of that one of the Fellows then resident in Cambridge who is first in order of precedence to convene the meeting of the Fellows for the purpose mentioned in § 1 upon the request of any five or more of the Fellows, and to cause notice of such meeting to be sent to each of the Fellows. 3. The Fellow who shall be appointed to act in the Master's place shall be called Vice-Master. He shall retain his office and receive the portion of the Master's dividends which shall have been assigned to him until the Master shall be reinstated in his functions and powers, or shall cease to be Master, and he shall perform all the functions and duties, and shall have all the power and authority of the Master, and shall be bound to residence, as may be defined by College Order, for the same time and be liable to deprivation for the same causes and in like manner as the Master.

4. If the Vice-Master shall die or resign his office, or vacate his Fellowship, or become incapable of discharging the duties of his office, the Visitor shall have the like power upon the like application of authorizing the appointment of another of the Fellows to be Vice-Master in his room, and the assignment with like limitation of an income to such Vice-Master.

5. If the Master shall at any time after the appointment of a Vice-Master again become capable of performing his duties, the Visitor, on being satisfied thereof, shall have power to reinstate him in his functions and powers and in receipt of his whole emoluments.

CHAPTER X.

Resignation of the Master.

1. If the Master at any time on account of ill-health or old age or other sufficient cause desire to resign his office and become a Fellow of the College, he shall be allowed to do so when a Fellowship is vacant.

2. He shall then be first in order of precedence among the Fellows and shall be a Senior Fellow even though at the time of his resignation of the Mastership the number of Senior Fellows is already two-thirds of the whole number of Fellowships, but in that case no Senior Fellow shall be elected afterwards until the whole number of Senior Fellows becomes less than two-thirds of the whole number of Fellowships. He shall have no right to any privileges beyond those enjoyed by a Senior Fellow.

3. His tenure of the Senior Fellowship shall be subject to the conditions laid down in Chapter XIII, § 1, but it shall not be subject to his being qualified in accordance with the conditions laid down in Chapter XV or of his residing in the University in accordance with the provision of Chapter XV, § 1.

4. The tenure of his Fellowship shall lapse at any time on his acceptance of any post or ecclesiastical preferment of the net annual value of $\pounds750$ at least.

CHAPTER XI.

Deprivation of the Master.

1. If the Master shall have been convicted by a court of competent jurisdiction of any crime, the Visitor may, if he think fit, proceed to inquire into the fact of such conviction, and if it be established may deprive the Master of his office.

2. If any five or more of the Fellows shall prefer to the Visitor a charge against the Master of disgraceful conduct, or of malversation in his office, or of gross neglect of duty, whereby he has in their judgment become unfit to preside over the College, the Visitor shall,

with all convenient speed, proceed to inquire into the facts of the case, and if the charge be established may deprive the Master of his office.

CHAPTER XII.

Qualifications of the Fellows.

1. The Fellows shall be divided into Senior Fellows and Junior Fellows. The number of Senior Fellows at any one time shall not (except in certain special cases provided for in these Statutes) exceed two-thirds nor be less than one-third of the whole number of Fellowships.

2. All the Fellows shall be graduate Members of the College or Graduates of the Universities of Cambridge or of Oxford (subject to the exception in § 4 D), and such as in the judgment of the electors are well qualified to be Fellows of the College as a place of education, religion, learning, and research.

3. No person shall be capable of being elected a Senior Fellow who is not of standing to take the degree of Master of Arts (except a person elected in accordance with § 4 D).

4. The persons qualified for being elected Senior Fellows shall be as follows:—

A. Persons who hold the office of Tutor, Bursar, Dean, or Lecturer in the College, or the office of Professor, Reader, Registrary, or Librarian in the University.

B. Persons who hold the office of University Lecturer, or who hold an office established by the Senate as Demonstrator in a Laboratory or Curator of Scientific or Literary collections in the University, or who have any University employment of a like nature which has been sanctioned by grace of the Senate.

C. Persons of known ability and learning who are engaged in research in any art, or science, or other branch of learning, either within the precincts of the University or elsewhere.

D. Persons distinguished in literature or science who are not graduates of the University of Cambridge or of Oxford.

CHAPTER XIII.

Conditions of tenure of Fellowships.

1. A Fellow who shall become Master or Fellow, other than honorary Fellow, of another College in Cambridge or Oxford or of Trinity College, Dublin, shall thereby and thereupon vacate his Fellowship.

2. Every Fellow who is a graduate of the University of Cambridge shall be required to proceed as soon as he is of proper standing to such a degree as will qualify him to become a Member of the Senate.

CHAPTER XIV.

Conditions of tenure of Junior Fellowships.

1. A Junior Fellow shall vacate his Fellowship at the end of three years from his admission; unless at some time within one year before the expiration of the three years, by a College Order in which not less than two-thirds of the body of the Master and the remaining Fellows concur, his tenure be converted into a tenure for a period of six years reckoned from the original admission.

No person shall at any time be re-elected a Junior Fellow subject to the exceptions in § 2.

2. If any Junior Fellow shall at the expiration of six years from his admission be performing the duties of Tutor, Bursar, Dean, or Lecturer in the College, and shall have held one of those offices during the whole of the twelve months immediately preceding, it shall be competent for the Master and Fellows if in their opinion the interests of the College demand it, by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the Master and the remaining Fellows,

(a) to prolong the tenure of his Fellowship for a period of one year, provided he continue to hold one of the above mentioned offices in the College; and at the expiration of one year under the same conditions to prolong his tenure for a further period of one year, and so on until he have held his Fellowship in accordance with this provision for at most four years; but there shall never be more than one Junior Fellow at any one time with his tenure thus prolonged: or

(b) to prolong his tenure for a period of one year provided he continue to hold such office, as a supernumerary Junior Fellow (see Chapter XIX); and at the expiration of one year to prolong his tenure for a further period of one year under the same conditions, and so on until he have held his Fellowship in accordance with this provision for at most four years; but there shall never be more than one such supernumerary Junior Fellow existing at any one time.

CHAPTER XV.

Conditions of tenure of Senior Fellowships.

1. A Senior Fellow elected on account of qualification A of Chapter XII, § 4, shall retain his Fellowship as long as he continues to hold one or other of the specified offices or employments and resides in the University not less than one hundred and eighty days in each year; provided that the Master and Senior Fellows may grant permission in the case of a Fellow holding a College office to intermit his College duties for one term in any year for the purpose of study or for other sufficient cause and that a Senior Fellow to whom such permission is granted shall be deemed to be in continuous tenure of his office; and provided further that in the case of such a Fellow holding a University office who by leave of the University Authorities is allowed to intermit his University duties for one term in any year such Fellow shall be deemed to be in continuous tenure of his office.

2. In the case of a Senior Fellow elected on account of one of the qualifications B of Chapter XII, § 4, an order shall be made by the Master and Senior Fellows at the time of his election which shall state the particular qualification and shall fix the length of his tenure either for a definite term of years subject to the continuance of the particular qualification, or indefinitely during its continuance. A new order may at any time be made by the Master and Senior Fellows extending the period of tenure for a further term of years, or indefinitely, subject in either case to the continuance of the particular qualification. A new order shall be essential at any time when the particular qualification under B is changed to any other particular such qualification.

3. A Senior Fellow elected on account of one of the qualifications C or D of Chapter XII, § 4, shall retain his Fellowship for a period not exceeding five years fixed by an order of the Master and Senior Fellows made at the time of the election, but such period may be extended in like manner from time to time on account of one of the qualifications C or D.

4. A Senior Fellow who having been qualified under A of Chapter XII, § 4, ceases to have such qualification, but who is or becomes qualified under B, or C of the same section may retain his Fellowship without reelection provided an order of the Master and Senior Fellows be made stating the particular qualification and fixing his tenure as in §§ 2, 3 above.

5. A Senior Fellow who having been qualified under B, or C of Chapter XII, § 4, becomes qualified under A of the same section may retain his Fellowship without re-election, provided an order be made by the Master and Seniors approving his change of qualification, and his tenure shall then be subject to § 1 above.

6. A Senior Fellow who for a period of not less than twenty-five years in the aggregate has held one or other of the offices of Tutor, Bursar, Dean, or College Lecturer, whether or not he have during the whole of that period been a Fellow of the College, shall retain his Fellowship for life, discharged of the obligation of holding any such office, and of residence in accordance with § 1, subject however to the conditions in Chapter XIII, § 1, provided however that he shall vacate his Fellowship at any time on his acceptance of any post or ecclesiastical preferment of the net annual value of £750 a year at least.

7. A Senior Fellow who for a period of twenty-five years in the aggregate has either held one of the qualifying offices and employments enumerated under A and B of Chapter XII, § 4, or held a Senior Fellowship on account of the qualification C of that section, provided further that he have for at least fifteen years in the aggregate been a Senior Fellow of the College, shall retain his Fellowship for life, discharged of the obligation of holding any College or University office or of residence in the University, under the like conditions as in § 6 above.

8. If any Senior Fellow is prevented by illhealth or other sufficient cause from fulfilling his duties continuously, he may be allowed by a vote of two-thirds of the Master and Senior Fellows exclusive of himself, to intermit his duties for a period not exceeding one year, and a similar exemption may be granted at the end of such period, and so on from time to time; provided always that the time during which such intermission is allowed shall not be reckoned in computing the periods required in accordance with § 6 and § 7 above for the tenure of his Fellowship for life.

9. In case a Senior Fellow ceases to hold one of the qualifying offices or employments specified in Chapter XII, § 4, A, or B, and is not qualified in accordance with §§ 6, 7 above to retain his Fellowship for life, the Fellowship shall become vacant on the first day of the Term next following that in which such cessation of qualification takes place.

CHAPTER XVI.

Election and Admission of Fellows.

1. The Master and all the Fellows shall be the electors of the Junior Fellows.

2. The Master and Senior Fellows shall be the electors of the Senior Fellows. 3. When a Fellowship becomes vacant the Master shall, as soon as the vacancy is made known to him or on the first day of the following term, according as the vacancy is made known to him in term time or out of term time, give notice thereof to all the Fellows.

4. If by such vacancy the number of Senior Fellows is reduced to less than one-third of the whole number of Fellowships, the Master shall, on the day on which the notice is given, fix a day and hour for the election of a Senior Fellow, such day being not earlier than the fourth day nor later than the eighteenth day next following, so that the election may be completed by the thirtieth day from the date of giving notice, and shall cause notice of such election to be sent to all the Senior Fellows.

5. If by such vacancy the number of Senior Fellows is not reduced to less than one-third of the whole number of Fellowships, but is less than two-thirds of such number, the Master shall fix a day and hour for a meeting of the Master and Senior Fellows, such day being not earlier than the fourth day nor later than the eighteenth day next following and give notice thereof to all the Senior Fellows. At such meeting the majority of the Master and Senior Fellows may, if they think fit, make an order for the election of a Senior Fellow within thirty days, and thereupon the Master shall fix a day and hour of election as above provided and shall cause notice of such election to be sent to all the Senior Fellows.

6. If either (a) the Master and Senior Fellows decide to make no such order, or (b) by such vacancy the number of Junior Fellows is reduced to less than one-third of the whole number of Fellowships, the Master shall in case (a) on the day of such decision, and in case (b) forthwith, fix a day and hour for a meeting of the Master and all the Fellows, such day being not earlier than the fourth day nor later than the eighteenth day next following, and give notice thereof to all the Fellows. At such meeting the majority of the Master and Fellows may, if they think fit, make an order for the election of a Junior Fellow within thirty days, and they shall make such order so that the election may be completed within one year at latest from the date of the vacancy.

7. Provided that if more than one Fellowship be vacant at one time the Master and Fellows may defer the election to one, but not more than one, Fellowship for such a period that not more than one year shall elapse between two successive elections. For the purposes of this section the election of a Junior Fellow to a Senior Fellowship shall not count as an election.

8. Whenever the Master and Fellows shall have made an order for the election of a Junior Fellow, the Master shall fix the day and hour of election as above provided in the case of the election of a Senior Fellow *mutatis mutandis*, and shall cause notice of such election to be sent to all the Fellows.

9. At any time when the number of Senior Fellows is less than two-thirds of the whole number of Fellowships, the Master and Senior Fellows may elect a Senior Fellow in the manner prescribed in § 5, subject to the provisions of Chapter II.

10. On the day of election the Master and Senior Fellows, or the Master and Fellows, as the case may be, shall meet at the appointed hour; Chapter XII of the Statutes on the "Qualifications of the Fellows" shall be read

aloud; and the Master and each of the Senior Fellows or Fellows present shall make the following declaration:—" Ego M.N. polliceor me in socium huius Collegii electurum illum virum, quem Statuto antelecto significari et apertius describi, et optimum esse ad Collegii commodum et honorem promovendum, mea conscientia iudicabit. Ita bona fide polliceor et ita do fidem."

11. The Master shall then write his own voteand receive the written votes of the Senior Fellows or Fellows present. He shall then read the votes aloud; and if a majority of the existing body of Master and Senior Fellows or Master and Fellows as the case may be shall. have voted for any one person, the Master shall declare him to be elected; provided however that in the case of an election to a Senior Fellowship under Qualification D of Chapter x11, the majority shall consist of at least twothirds of the existing body of Master and Senior Fellows. If there be no such majority of votes in favour of any one person, the process of voting shall be repeated as often as the Master and Senior Fellows or Master and. Fellows think fit during twelve days reckoned from the beginning of the election; and if at the end of the said twelve days there be no. such majority as aforesaid the election of a Fellow qualified according to the Statutes shall for that turn be made by the Visitor of the College.

12. The Fellow elected shall make, as soon as may be, the following declaration :—" Ego • *M.N.* socius huius Collegii electus polliceor me Statuta omnia et singula pro Collegio administrando edita, bona fide observaturum; magistro in omnibus obtemperaturum quaecunque legitime praeceperit; omnia. denique, e quibus Collegio commodi vel honoris accessio aliqua fieri possit, pro virili parte provecturum. Ita bona fide polliceor, et haec omnia in me recipio ";—and he shall then beadmitted in the customary manner.

13. The order of precedence of the Fellows in the College shall be regulated by the date of their admission without regard to their tenure as Senior or Junior Fellows, and Fellows admitted on the same day shall take precedence according to their degrees. A Junior Fellowelected to a Senior Fellowship shall not require re-admission.

14. The Master and Fellows may, in any special case in which the interests of the College seem to them so to require, make it at the time of election a condition of the tenure of a Fellowship that the Fellow shall, if called upon to do so within one year from the date of his election, accept any specified College office and hold it for such time as the Master and Fellowsshall require. On any breach of such condition the Fellowship shall become vacant.

CHAPTER XVII.

Emoluments of Fellows.

1. Every Fellow resident in College shall be entitled to the use of rooms rent free and kept in good and substantial repair by the College. The Master shall assign such rooms to the several Fellows, having regard to their order of precedence. The conditions of residence for the purpose of this paragraph shall be defined by the Master and Fellows by College order.

2. Every Fellow in residence shall receive a moderate weekly allowance for commons, the amount to be determined by the Master and

Fellows by College order. The conditions of residence for the purpose of this paragraph shall be defined in like manner.

3. The Fellows shall receive dividends from the revenues of the College according to the provisions of Chapter xxx, and in case of the vacancy of a Fellowship in any year, the proportional part of the dividend assigned to that Fellowship for the period during which it is vacant shall not be distributed as provided in Chapter xxx, but shall be disposed of in such way for the permanent benefit of the College as the Master and Fellows may determine.

4. The thirteen Fellows highest in order of precedence except the Supernumerary Fellows, if any, provided for in Chapter XIV, § 2 (b), and in Chapter XIX, shall for the purposes of the settlement of Mr Tancred be taken to be "the thirteen Fellows of Christ's College, in Cambridge, upon the Foundations of Margaret Countess of Richmond and King Edward VI." The Fellow thirteenth in order on the list of Fellows shall be called and taken to be the Fellow on the Foundation of King Edward VI. The two Fellows lowest on the list of Fellows shall be called and taken to be Fellows on the Foundation of Sir John Finch and Sir Thomas Baines. All the other Fellows shall be called and taken to be Fellows on the Foundation of the Lady Margaret, Countess of Richmond and Derby, Foundress of the College.

CHAPTER XVIII.

Professorial Fellowship.

1. One of the Fellows shall be deemed to be a Professorial Fellow, and his Fellowship shall be held according to the terms and conditions prescribed for Professorial Fellowships by the Statutes of the University, made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

2. If the Professorial Fellow shall at any time resign his Professorship and be still entitled in accordance with the provisions of Chapter xv to remain a Senior Fellow, the Master and Senior Fellows may, if they think fit, proceed to elect a Professor of the University as a Senior Fellow, and the Professor so elected shall be the Professorial Fellow, even if at the time of such election there is no vacancy in the Fellowships and even if at the time of such election the number of Senior Fellows is already two-thirds of the whole ordinary number of Fellowships. In such case, however, no further election of a Fellow shall take place until the number of Fellows becomes less than the whole ordinary number of Fellowships in the College, and no further election of a Senior Fellow shall take place until the number of Senior Fellows becomes less than two-thirds of the whole ordinary number of Fellowships.

CHAPTER XIX.

Supernumerary Fellows.

Any Fellow, other than the Professorial Fellow, may declare in writing to the Master his wish to become a Supernumerary Senior or Junior Fellow as the case may be. If the Master and Fellows consent, he shall become a Supernumerary Fellow, and shall thenceforth be a Fellow to all intents and purposes, and hold his Fellowship under the conditions of tenure provided by these Statutes for Senior and Junior Fellows respectively, and shall

enjoy all the benefits of the same, except that he shall not be entitled to any dividend. He shall not, however, be counted towards making up the number of Fellows required by these Statutes, and a new Fellow shall be elected in due course.

CHAPTER XX.

Honorary Fellows.

1. The Master and Fellows may at a special meeting to be held for the purpose, and by a resolution in which the votes of three-fourths at least of the existing body of Master and Fellows shall concur, elect as an Honorary Fellow any person distinguished in art, science, or other branch of learning, who is or has been a member of the College. The Master and Fellows may at any time by a like vote terminate the tenure of an Honorary Fellowship.

2. The person so elected shall not have any voice or authority in the affairs of the College, nor be entitled to any dividend or have any claim to presentation to a benefice, but he shall enjoy such other privileges and advantages as the Master and Fellows may from time to time determine.

CHAPTER XXI.

Suspension and Deprivation of Fellows.

1. If, in the opinion of the Master, there are sufficient grounds for preferring a charge against a Fellow of having been guilty of criminal or disgraceful conduct, or of conduct gravely prejudicial to the good order or reputation of the College; or if such a charge be preferred by three Fellows at least in a written notification sent to the Master, it shall be the duty of the Master to summon as early aspossible two of the Senior Fellows to act with him as Assessors, and in their presence to investigate the charge, ample opportunity being given to the Fellow in question of being heard in his defence.

2. If, in the judgment of the Master and one at least of the Assessors, the charge be established, the Master shall, with the assent of one at least of the Assessors, either deprivethe Fellow so offending of his Fellowship and expel him from the College, or suspend him for a time limited or contingent from the profits and enjoyment of his Fellowship, or admonish him, according as the offence committed seems to require. Provided that in every case either of deprivation or suspension, the Fellow deprived or suspended shall have a right of appeal to the Visitor, who shall be empowered to annul the sentence, or to vary it at his discretion.

3. No Fellow whose conduct is to be investigated shall act as an Assessor.

4. If, in accordance with § 2, a Fellow be suspended from the profits and enjoyment of his Fellowship, the dividends during the time of the suspension shall be disposed of for the permanent benefit of the College in such manner as the Master and Fellows may determine.

CHAPTER XXII.

Election and Admission of Scholars, and their Tenure.

1. The Scholars shall be elected by the Master and Fellows from among the Students of the College or of the University, or according to the result of the examinations instituted for the purpose, from among persons who have not commenced residence at the College or in the University.

2. The maximum emolument of Scholarships (hereinafter called "Entrance Scholarships") awarded to persons who have not commenced residence shall be eighty pounds (£80) a year inclusive of room rent and all allowances. No one shall be allowed to compete for a Scholarship before commencing residence in the University if his age will exceed twenty years on the last day of the Academical year in which the examination is held, provided always that the Master and Fellows may offer not more than two of such Entrance Scholarships for competition in any one year without restriction of age.

3. The tenure of an Entrance Scholarship shall be in the first instance for not more than two years. But the Master and Fellows shall have the power to prolong the tenure of such Scholar till he be of standing to be admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate of Arts, or to elect him to a scholarship of a different value.

4. An election of Scholars shall be made once in every year, or oftener if the Master and Fellows think fit, and the election shall be conducted in the same manner mutatis mutandis as the election of a Fellow. The Scholars elected shall make the following declaration:—" Ego M.N. Scholaris discipulus huius Collegii electus polliceor me omnia Collegii Statuta et Ordinationes, quae ad me pertineant, bona fide observaturum; magistro in omnibus comiter obtemperaturum quaecunque legitime praeceperit: sociis omnibus et singulis reverentiam iustam et honorem debitum praestiturum; Collegio denique ipsi fidelem et benevolum futurum. Ita bona fide polliceor et haec omnia in me recipio." They shall be admitted in the usual manner as soon as may be after election.

5. The Master and Fellows may promote a Scholar from one Scholarship to another of higher value.

6. Every Scholar shall vacate his Scholarship when he is of standing to be admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate of Arts, unless the Master and Fellows shall think fit in case of special merit to prolong the tenure for a further period not exceeding the time when he is of standing to be admitted to incept in Arts. He shall also vacate his Scholarship if he be admitted to a Fellowship, or to a Scholarship or Fellowship at any other College in Oxford or Cambridge, or at Trinity College, Dublin.

7. The Master and Fellows may award out of the Scholars' Fund Exhibitions of value not exceeding forty pounds (£40) a year and tenable for such time as may be fixed in each case by College Order, to candidates for an Entrance Scholarship or Students already in residence, who have sufficiently distinguished themselves in examination. In awarding these Exhibitions the Master and Fellows may take into account the means of the candidates. They may also grant gratuities out of the Scholars' Fund from time to time to poor Students of the College who acquit themselves with credit in the College or University Examinations.

8. An Exhibitioner elected to a Scholarship shall vacate his Exhibition.

9. The Master and Fellows may award out of the Scholars' Fund by a vote in which a majority of the Master and Fellows concur a

Bachelor Scholarship to a Scholar or former Scholar of the College who has been admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate of Arts or of an equivalent degree, of such value for such time and under such conditions as may be determined in each case by College Order. A Bachelor Scholar may under special circumstances be exempted by the Master and Fellows from the general obligation to reside during either the whole or a part of his tenure. He shall vacate his Scholarship as soon as he is of standing to be admitted to incept in Arts, or if he be admitted to a Fellowship at this or at any other College. A Bachelor Scholar shall not need to be admitted.

10. The Master and Fellows may also elect as a Bachelor Scholar, a Student of the College who has not before been a Scholar. A Student so elected shall be admitted in due course.

CHAPTER XXIII.

Residence, Duties and Emoluments of the Scholars.

1. A Scholar shall keep by residence such portion of each Academical term as the Statutes and Ordinances of the University direct. He shall receive for each term that he keeps by residence one-third part of the annual value of his Scholarship.

2. He shall diligently pursue his studies, shall regularly attend such Lectures, and when of proper standing pass such Examinations as are prescribed to him by the Rules of the College, or the Statutes and Ordinances of the University; and he shall proceed without loss of time, and in a regular manner, to a degree in the University.

3. Provided however that the Master may, for sufficient cause, excuse a Scholar from any of the provisions of this Statute, except that the consent of the Master and Fellows shall be required if he is allowed to receive any emolument in respect of a term of which he has not kept the major part by residence.

CHAPTER XXIV. The Scholars' Fund.

1. The Scholars' Fund shall receive the share of the distributable income assigned to it in Chapter xxx, § 2, and it may be augmented from time to time from the revenues of the College at the discretion of the Master and Fellows.

2. The Fund shall be considered as the benefaction of the Foundress and distributed as such: except that it shall be charged with such Scholarships as may be awarded on the Foundation of King Edward VI, and on the Foundation of Sir John Finch and Sir Thomas Baines.

CHAPTER XXV.

Additional Funds for Scholarships.

In addition to the Scholarships mentioned in Chapter xxiv, § 2, there shall be Scholarships as heretofore on each of the following Foundations, that is to say, Mr Bunting, Dr Widdrington, Dr Ward, Bishop of Sarum, of the annual value of fifty pounds (£50), and Mr Rysley, Mr Broadbanke, Archdeacon Clarke, Lady Drury, Mr Tancred, of the annual value of thirty pounds (£30). There shall be from time to time as many Scholars on each Foundation as the income belonging tto it will allow. In every case the Fund of the Scholarship shall be deemed a Trust Fund to be administered for the benefit of Scholars, ibut the Master and Fellows may by College "Order alter any of the foregoing amounts if the income of the Trust or other circumstances connected therewith seem to them to render such alteration expedient.

CHAPTER XXVI.

Correction and Removal of Scholars.

1. If, in the opinion of the Master, there are sufficient grounds for preferring a charge against: a Scholar of having been guilty of disgraceful conduct, or of conduct gravely prejudicial to the good order and discipline of the College; or if such a charge be preferred by three Fellows at least in a written notification sent to the Master, it shall be the duty of the Master to summon as early as possible two of the Senior Fellows to act with him as Assessors, and in their presence to investigate the charge, ample opportunity being given to the Scholar in question of being heard in his defence.

2. If, in the judgment of the Master and one at least of the Assessors, the charge be established, the Master shall, with the assent of one at least of the Assessors, either deprive the Scholar so offending of his Scholarship and expel him from the College, or suspend him for a time limited or contingent from his Scholarship, or award such other punishment as the offence committed seems to require.

3. A Scholar who is deprived of, or suspended from, his Scholarship shall have the same right of appeal to the Visitor as a Fellow.

CHAPTER XXVII.

College Meetings.

1. The Master shall preside at all meetings of the Master and Fellows, and if on any occasion he is not able to be present he shall appoint one of the Fellows to act as his Deputy.

2. The Master may summon a meeting of the Master and Fellows at any time, and he shall, on the written request of any six of the Fellows, summon a meeting to be held at a convenient time within seven days of the receipt of such request.

3. The Master (or his Deputy) shall put to the vote any motion on a matter falling within the powers of the Master and Fellows which has been duly proposed and seconded.

4. The Master (or his Deputy) and Fellows shall have the power at any meeting of fixing by resolution the time of any future meeting or meetings.

.5. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Master and Fellows unless a majority of the Master and existing Fellows be present.

6. A resolution shall be deemed to be carried if it receive the votes of a majority of those of the Master and Fellows who are present at the Meeting.

7. If the numbers voting for and against a resolution be equal, the resolution shall be deemed not to be carried.

-8. A decision of the Master and Fellows entered in the book called the Agreement Book shall be called a College Order. A College Order shall require for its validity the signature of the majority of those present at the meeting except in special cases in which some larger proportion is required in accordance with these Statutes.

9. I'ne Master shall have power to require at any time the attendance of a Fellow at a College Meeting, if the interests of the College seem to him to require it.

10. Meetings of the Master and Senior Fellows shall be governed by the same rules as are above laid down for the case of the Master and Fellows; the words "Senior Fellows" being substituted for Fellows in \S 1—6, and the words "An Order of the Master and Senior Fellows" being substituted for the words "a College Order" in § 8.

CHAPTER XXVIII.

The Bursar.

1. The Master and Fellows shall appoint a Bursar, who may be the Master, or one of the Fellows, or other qualified person.

2. The Bursar shall receive the revenues and make payments according to the Statutes and Orders of the College, shall render his account in accordance with the provisions of Chapter xxix, and shall perform all other duties incident to the management of the financial affairs of the College, subject to the control of the Master and Fellows.

3. He shall receive out of the revenues of the College an adequate remuneration determined from time to time by College Order. 4. If the Bursar be the Master or one of

the Fellows of the College he shall vacate his office after a tenure of ten years, except that his tenure may be prolonged for a further period of five years by a vote of the Master and Fellows at a College Meeting, provided that a majority of the existing body of Master and Fellows and at least two-thirds of those present at the Meeting concur in such vote. At the expiration of the five years his tenure may be prolonged for a further period of five years under the same condition, and so on from time The appointment of a Bursar who to time. does not belong to the body of the Master and Fellows shall be for one year only, but the appointment may be renewed from year to year.

5. If the Bursar be elected Master of the College during his tenure of office he shall vacate the office of Bursar at the next ensuing Audit unless by a vote in which the majority of the existing Fellows concur he be allowed to complete the period of his tenure. If a Bursar who is a member of the body of Master and Fellows ceases to be a member of that body during his tenure of office, he shall vacate the office of Bursar at the ensuing Audit, but shall be eligible for reappointment in accordance with the provision of § 4 above, which applies to the case of persons who do not belong to the body of the Master and Fellows.

body of the Master and Fellows. 6. The Bursar may at any time be removed from his office by a vote of the Master and Fellows in which at least two-thirds of the existing body concur.

7. Whenever the office of Bursar becomes vacant, and the Master and Fellows have not already appointed a successor to the office, that member of the body of Master and Fellows who is first in order of precedence of those then resident in Cambridge shall as soon as possible summon a meeting of such of the Master and Fellows as are then resident in Cambridge, notice of such Meeting being sent to all those who are absent. Those present at this meeting shall appoint one of the body of the Master and Fellows to manage the financial affairs of the College until such time as a new appointment to the office of Bursar is made by the Master and Fellows.

CHAPTER XXIX.

College Accounts and Audit.

1. Once in every year, on some day within forty-five days after the Feast of St Michael, three days' notice at least having been given by the Master to the Fellows, the Bursar shall, in the presence of a majority of the existing body of Master and Fellows, give account in writing of his receipts and expenditure on behalf of the College, together with a statement of the balance in hand and of the financial position of the College.

2. One copy of such accounts shall be placed in the College Chest and another copy shall be kept by the Bursar.

3. One or more Auditors, elected by the Master and Fellows for each Audit, shall examine and verify the said accounts before they are submitted to the Master and Fellows, and sign them, if they be found correct.

4. Each Auditor shall receive an adequate remuneration out of the revenues of the College.

5. If a majority of the existing body of Master and Fellows are satisfied with the accounts, they shall sign them in token of approval. The Bursar shall however not sign the accounts.

6. If they are not satisfied with the accounts in any particular, the question shall be referred to the Visitor for his decision.

7. An abstract of the several accounts of the College relating to funds administered either for general purposes, or in trust, or otherwise, shall be sent on or before the thirtyfirst day of December in each year to the Vice-Chancellor of the University for publication. The abstract shall be made, as nearly as practicable, in the form contained in the Schedule annexed to these Statutes. The accounts of the receipt and expenditure of money, if any, raised under the borrowing powers of the College shall be sent annually at the same time to the Vice-Chancellor for publication.

CHAPTER XXX.

Distribution of College revenues.

1. On the day of Audit, after providing for the special payments required by the unrepealed wills of benefactors, by College indentures or agreements, and other lawful obligations, together with all payments required by the Statutes and Orders of the College, or by the Statutes of the University, a sufficient sum shall be applied or reserved for repairing and improving the buildings of the College, for defraying the expense of managing the College property, and for any other purpose which the Master and Fellows may consider necessary or advantageous to the College, as a place of education, religion, learning, and research.

2. One-fifth of the remaining income of the College shall be paid to the Scholars' Fund.

3. Out of the four-fifths then remaining there shall be taken a sum sufficient for the weekly allowance for commons to the Master and Fellows in residence. The sum then

remaining shall be divided into a number of shares greater by seven than twice the whole number of Fellows, as determined in Chapter 11, other than supernumerary Fellows. Seven of such shares shall be paid to the Master, and two to each of the Fellows.

4. Provided, however, that the amount of the dividend of a Fellow in any civil year shall not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds (£250), or that of the Master eight hundred and seventy-five pounds (£875). Such arrangements may be made for the payment by the College of the whole or a part of the income tax on the dividend of the Master and each of the Fellows as the Master and Fellows may think fit. Any such payment shall not be reckoned as part of the maximum of £250 or £875.

5. In case of the vacancy of a Fellowship, the Fellow who vacates it shall receive the proportional part of the dividend declared at the next ensuing audit for the time between the next preceding audit and the day of vacancy; and the Fellow elected and admitted into any Fellowship shall receive in like manner the proportional part of the dividend declared at the next ensuing audit for the time between the day of his admission and the day of the said audit.

6. Within forty-five days after the first day of the Easter Term the Bursar shall pay to the Master and Fellows in the proportion of their shares such sum on account of the dividends which will become due at the following audit as may be determined by College: Order.

CHAPTER XXXI.

Payments for University Purposes.

The College shall pay in every year to the University the sum authorized by the Statutesof the University made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge-Act, 1877, to be levied from the College.

CHAPTER XXXII.

Variation in the number of Fellows:

1. If at any time it shall appear to the Master and Fellows that the revenues of the College are greater than the amount required to afford to every Fellow a dividend of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) a year, exclusive of rooms and allowance for commons and any allowance made for income tax, but inclusive of all other allowances, they may submit to the Visitor a scheme, approved by a majority of the whole body of Master and Fellows, for increasing the number of Fellowships, or for applying the surplus in some other way for the benefit of the College or of the-University, and the said scheme, if approved by the Visitor, shall thenceforth have the same force and effect as if it formed part of these-Statutes.

2. The Visitor may from time to time, on a like application of a majority of the Master and Fellows, approve the modification or alteration of any such scheme.

3. If at any time the revenues of the College are fallen so low that the dividend of a Fellow on the average of the three preceding years has been less than one hundred and fifty pounds (£150) exclusive of rooms and allowance for commons and any allowance made for income tax but inclusive of all other allowances, the Visitor may on the application of a majority of the Master and Fellows approve the suspension of one or more Fellowships next falling vacant or already vacant till such time that the dividend on the average of three consecutive years shall be such that the average dividend of a Fellow would have reached one hundred and sixty pounds (£160) if during that time no Fellowship had been suspended.

CHAPTER XXXIII.

The College Seal and Muniments.

There shall be in the Treasury a Chest, called the Common Chest, in which shall be placed copies of the College accounts after every audit, together with a copy of the Statutes of the College, and the College Seal. There shall be two keys of different make for the Common Chest, one of which shall be kept by the Bursar and one by the Steward of the College.

CHAPTER XXXIV.

The Dean.

1. The Master and Fellows shall appoint a Dean, who shall be at least of sufficient standing for the Degree of Master of Arts. He shall be appointed from among the Master and Fellows, if that can be conveniently done, and shall by preference be a Priest in Holy Orders of the Church of England.

2. The Dean shall be responsible for the celebration of Divine Service in the College Chapel according to such rules as may from time to time be made by College Order, or in default of College Order, by the Master, and shall see that all persons conduct themselves decently therein. He shall superintend the conduct of the members of the College in statu pupillari. He shall reside within the precincts of the University during the periods of the year in which Divine Service is celebrated daily in the College Chapel, except for reasonable cause to be approved by the Master, and in case of absence he shall appoint a Deputy to be approved by the Master.

3. He shall receive out of the revenues of the College an adequate remuneration determined from time to time by College Order.

4. If the Dean is not the Master or a Fellow he shall have the same privileges as a Fellow in respect of rooms and commons.

5. If the Dean be the Master or one of the Fellows of the College he shall vacate his office after a tenure of ten years except that his tenure may be prolonged for a further period of five years by a vote of the Master and Fellows at a College Meeting, provided that a majority of the existing body of Master and Fellows and at least two-thirds of those present at the Meeting concur in such vote. At the expiration of the five years his tenure may bo prolonged for a further period of five years under the same condition, and again for a third such period, after which he shall no longer be eligible for reappointment. The appointment of a Dean who does not belong to the body of the Master and Fellows shall be for one year only, but the appointment may be renewed from year to year.

6. If the Master or a Fellow of the College be appointed Dean the appointment shall be subject to confirmation by a majority of the Master and Fellows before the end of the year next after his appointment. In default of such confirmation he shall at once vacate his office.

7. If the Dean be elected Master of the College during his tenure of office he shall vacate the office of Dean at the end of the current academical year, unless by a vote in which a majority of the existing Master and Fellows concur he be allowed to complete the period of his tenure. If a Dean who is a member of the body of Master and Fellows ceases to be a member of that body during his tenure of office he shall vacate the office of Dean at the end of the current academical year, but shall be eligible for reappointment in accordance with the provision of § 5 above, which applies to the case of persons who do not belong to the body of the Master and Fellows.

8. The Dean may at any time be removed from his office by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of the existing body of Master and Fellows concur.

CHAPTER XXXV.

Divine Service and Religious Instruction.

1. Whereas by the fifth and sixth sections of the Universities Tests Acts, 1871, it is enacted as follows:—

"The governing body of every College subsisting at the time of the passing of this Act in any of the said universities shall provide sufficient religious instruction for all members thereof *in statu pupillari* belonging to the Established Church.

"The Morning and Evening Prayer according to the Order of the Book of Common Prayer shall continue to be used daily as heretofore in the chapel of every college subsisting at the time of the passing of this Act in any of the said universities; but notwithstanding anything contained in the statute thirteenth and fourteenth Charles the Second, chapter four, or in this Act, it shall be lawful for the Visitor of any such college, on the request of the governing body thereof, to authorize from time to time in writing the use on week-days only of any abridgment or adaptation of the said Morning and Evening Prayer in the chapel of such college instead of the order set forth in the Book of Common Prayer: "

2. The Master and Fellows shall, so long as the enactment cited in § 1 remains in force, appoint some one or more persons to give religious instruction to members of the College *in statu pupillari* who belong to the Established Church and some one or more persons to act as Chaplains, and shall, if necessary, provide stipends for these persons from the revenues of the College, and shall also make such regulations as they may deem expedient for the due celebration of Divine Service and for the due maintenance of religious worship and discipline.

3. The Master, if in Holy Orders, may at all times at his discretion take such part in celebrating Divine Service in the Chapel, or in giving religious instruction to members of the College *in statu pupillari* who may belong to the Established Church as he thinks fit.

CHAPTER XXXVI.

The Steward.

1. The Master and Fellows shall appoint in every year within fifteen days after the feast of St. Michael, a Steward.

2. The Steward shall attend to the due supply of provisions for use in the College Hall and otherwise by members of the College. He shall perform such other duties as may be determined from time to time by College Order. He shall be paid an adequate stipend to be determined from time to time by College Order.

3. The accounts of the Steward shall be audited annually by the Auditor or Auditors of the Bursar's accounts. They shall be presented to the Master and Fellows in like manner to those of the Bursar, and be subject to similar approval signified in similar manner.

CHAPTER XXXVII.

The Council.

1. There shall be in the College a Council of which the duty shall be to control the educational business of the College in accordance with the directions hereinafter laid down.

2. The Council shall consist of the Master, the Senior Tutor, and four Fellows of the College, elected annually by the Master and Fellows within fifteen days after the feast of St. Michael, on a day to be previously fixed by College Order.

3. Every vacancy occurring among the elected members of the Council out of the ordinary course shall be filled up by the Master and Fellows as soon as can conveniently be done, and the Council shall not be competent to exercise any of the powers conferred upon it by Statute when its number is incomplete.

4. The Master shall preside at the meetings of the Council, or if he be unable to be present, he shall appoint another member of the Council to act as his Deputy. If neither the Master nor a member of the Council appointed by him to act as his Deputy be present, the members of the Council present shall appoint one of their own number to preside at that meeting.

5. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Council unless at least four members are present.

6. A motion which has been duly proposed and seconded shall be deemed to be carried if four members at least of the Council vote in favour of it. Any motion, duly proposed and seconded and falling within the powers assigned to the Council by Statute, shall be put to the vote by the member of the Council presiding.

7. The Master may summon a meeting of the Council at any time; and he shall, on the written request of any two members of the Council, summon a meeting to be held at a convenient time within seven days after the receipt of such request.

8. The Council shall have power at any meeting of fixing by resolution the time for any future meeting or meetings.

9. On any question as to the tenure of an office by a member of the Council, that member shall be precluded from voting.

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

The Tuition Fund.

1. There shall be a Tuition Fund into which shall be paid the Tuition Fees paid by Students of the College and such sums from the revenues of the College as may be determined from time to time by College Order.

2. The Council shall determine from time to time the amount of the Tuition Fees to be paid by Students of the College.

3. The Council shall have the management and control of the Tuition Fund. They shall determine from time to time what payments

shall be made out of it in respect of fees for Students of the College attending Lectures or Laboratories or receiving other instruction outside of the College, and what amounts out of the Fund shall be assigned to each of the Tutorsand College Lecturers. They shall also determine from time to time what payments shall be made from the Tuition Fund to persons not. College Lecturers who are giving instruction. to members of the College in accordance with Chapter XL, § 6.

4. The Master and Fellows shall have power on the recommendation of the Council to modify the terms of this and of other Statutes. so far as may be necessary in order to organize a combined educational system for this and any other College or Colleges.

5. The accounts of the Tuition Fund shall be audited annually by one or more auditors appointed for the purpose by the Council, who shall be empowered to pay for such audit an adequate remuneration out of the Tuitions Fund. The accounts so audited shall be presented to the Master and Fellows.

CHAPTER XXXIX.

[•] The Tutors.

1. There shall be in the College one or more Tutors. It shall be the duty of a Tutor to promote the studies of his pupils, to superintend their conduct, and generally to be to them. *in loco parentis*. One Tutor shall discharge the duties of Praelector unless the Master and Fellows appoint some other person to perform. the duties of this office.

2. The determination of the number of Tutors from time to time shall rest with the Council. When a Tutor vacates his office, nosuccessor shall be appointed until the Council have decided that the office shall be filled upby a fresh appointment. The Council shall assign to the Tutors, if there be more than one, their several duties, and shall determine which among them shall be Senior Tutor.

3. A Tutor shall be appointed by the Master from amongst the body of the Master and Fellows, but the Master shall appoint himselfi as Tutor only with the consent of a majorityof the existing Fellows.

4. The appointment of a Tutor shall be subject to confirmation by a majority of the Master and existing Fellows, excluding the person concerned, at the end of one year from the date of that appointment. A Tutor whose appointment is not so confirmed shall forthwith vacate his office, and shall not be capable of reappointment except with the consent of a majority of the existing body of Master and Fellows, excluding the person concerned.

5. A Tutor shall vacate his office when he has held it for ten years. He may however be reappointed to his office for a further period of five years by a vote of the Master, and Fellows at a College Meeting, provided that a majority of the existing body of Master and Fellows and at least two-thirds of those present. at the Meeting concur in such vote. At the end of such period of five years he may under a similar condition be reappointed for a second period of five years, and again for a third such period, after which he shall be no longer eligible for reappointment. If a Tutor be elected! Master of the College he shall vacate the office of Tutor at the end of the current academicall year unless he be allowed by a vote of the Master and Fellows in which two-thirds of the existing body of Master and Fellows concur, to complete his term of office.

6. A Tutor may at any time be removed from his office by a vote of the Master and Fellows in which not less than two-thirds of the existing body of Master and Fellows concur.

CHAPTER XL.

The Lecturers.

1. There shall be such number of College Lecturers and in such subjects as the Council may from time to time determine. When a College Lecturer vacates his office no new appointment shall be made until the Council have determined that the office shall be filled up by a fresh appointment, and have decided to what subject the office shall be assigned.

2. A College Lecturer shall be appointed by the Master, but the Master shall appoint himself as College Lecturer only with the consent of a majority of the remaining members of the Council.

3. The appointment of a College Lecturer shall be subject to confirmation by a majority of the Council at the end of one year from the date of the appointment. A College Lecturer whose appointment is not so confirmed shall forthwith vacate his office, and shall not be capable of reappointment except with the consent of a majority of the Council.

4. A College Lecturer shall vacate his office when he has held it for twenty-five years. He may however be reappointed to his office for a further period of five years by a vote of the majority of the Council. At the end of such period of five years he may be similarly reappointed for a second period of five years, and so on, from time to time. If a College Lecturer be elected Master of the College he shall vacate the office of Lecturer at the end of the current academical year unless he be allowed by a vote of the majority of the Council to complete his term of office.

5. A College Lecturer may at any time be removed from his office by a vote of the Master and' Fellows in which at least two-thirds of the existing body of Master and Fellows concur.

6. The Council may at any time make temporary appointments for periods not exceeding one year of persons who are not College Lecturers to give instruction to Members of the College. A person so appointed shall not be deemed to hold a qualifying office in accordance with Chapter XII, § 4 A, nor to count the time during which he holds such appointment as a part of the qualification for holding a Senior Fellowship for life.

CHAPTER XLI.

Residence of Fellows and Officers.

1. The Master and Fellows shall nominate a Tutor and at least one other College Officer or a Fellow who shall reside in College during full Term; and at least one College Officer or Fellow shall reside in College during that part of the vacation after the Easter Term in which members of the College *in statu pupillari* are allowed to reside; provided that this duty of residence may be divided between two or more Tutors or other College Officers or Fellows, in any manner approved by the Master and Fellows.

2. The Master and Fellows shall make such provision as may seem to them expedient for

the residence of College Officers or Fellows during the other vacations.

3. The Master and Fellows shall have the power of requiring any College Officer to reside in College during full Term, and during such part of the vacation after Easter Term as they may think necessary for the due maintenance of discipline.

4. Every Fellow or College Officer who is fulfilling the duty of residence under this chapter shall sleep in College at least five nights in each week, and if he shall be absent on either of the remaining nights he shall have a Deputy, approved by the Master, and such Deputy shall sleep in College: provided always, that a house communicating with the College and approved by the Master and Fellows shall, for the purposes of this Chapter, be deemed to be within the College.

CHAPTER XLII.

The Caution Fund.

1. All Caution money shall be placed to the credit of a fund to be called the Caution Fund.

2. The Caution Fund shall be managed in such manner as the Master and Fellows shall by College Order from time to time direct. The accounts of it shall be annually audited with the other accounts of the College.

CHAPTER XLIII.

Benefactions and Endowments.

1. The Master and Fellows shall have power to make orders from time to time for the distribution among deserving Students of the College of the proceeds of the endowments given to the College for the maintenance of Exhibitioners by the following Benefactors; that is to say, Mr. Jenens, Dr. Hawford, Sir Walter Mildmay, Mr. Rawlins, Mr. Harvey, Mr. Laughton, Dr. Plume, and Mrs. Berridge.

2. The Master and Fellows shall have power to make orders from time to time for the application to the instruction of Students of the College in Divinity, or in the Greek or Hebrew language, of the endowments for Readers or Lecturers and Preachers in the College provided by the following Benefactors; that is to say, Mr. Rysley, Sir Walter Mildmay, Dr. Hawford, Mr. Wentworth, Mr. Bunting, and Mr. Burrell.

CHAPTER XLIV.

Exhibitions for Students coming from Special Schools.

1. In the cases of Exhibitions or emoluments where it is provided that a preference should be shown to Students coming from Special Schools, the Master and Fellows shall have power to examine the candidates, and, rejecting the unworthy, to elect only those who show themselves duly qualified.

2. If in any case either no candidate, or no candidate whom the Master and Fellows consider duly qualified, from the Special School or Schools present himself, the Master and Fellows shall have power for that turn to throw open the Exhibition or emolument, and elect some duly qualified person in the same manner as they elect the Scholars of the College.

3. The Students holding such Exhibitions or emoluments shall be subject to the same rules, and be liable to be deprived or have the receipt of their emoluments suspended in the same manner as the Scholars of the College.

CHAPTER XLV.

Members not on the Foundation.

1. The Master and major part of the Fellows in residence at any time may admit persons, of whose good character and sufficient learning they have assurance, to be members of the College.

2. It shall be the duty of every person so admitted to obey the Master in all things lawful and honest, to show due respect to the Fellows, behave himself in a becoming manner, and observe the Statutes and Ordinances of the College in all things.

3. He shall pursue the course of study provided for him in the College and in the University; shall attend the required lectures and examinations, and proceed to the degree which he seeks when he is of sufficient standing for it.

4. He shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter XXVI, as to the Correction and Removal of Scholars, in all respects except that he shall have no right of appeal to the Visitor.

5. The Master and Fellows shall have power to determine from time to time the payments to be made by all such persons for the use of rooms, for commons, and for all other advantages which they may be allowed to enjoy in College.

CHAPTER XLVI.

College Servants.

1. The Butler, the Cook, the Porter, the Gardener, shall be chosen by the Master and Fellows; the rest of the Servants shall be appointed by the Master. The amount of money to be paid out of the College revenues, or by the Fellows, Scholars, and Students individually, to each of these Servants as fair wages for their work, shall be determined by the Master and Fellows as they think right; and equitable.

2. If the Master or a majority of the Fellows so determine a Servant shall be removed from his post by the Master; and a Servant so removed shall have no right of appeal to any authority whatsoever.

CHAPTER XLVII.

Presentation to Benefices.

In presenting to the several Benefices in the patronage of the College, the Master and Fellows shall have regard to the Master and Fellows, the former Fellows, the Chaplain or former Chaplains, and other present or former Officers, or former Scholars of the College, but it shall not be necessary to present one of such persons, and none of them shall have any claim to any such presentation on the ground of seniority or any other ground.

CHAPTER XLVIII.

Commemoration of Benefactors.

The Commemoration of the Foundress and other Benefactors shall be celebrated according to the following manner: —

Quotannis, die et hora congruis per magistrum assignandis, magister, socii, discipuli, pensionarii in capellam conveniant, et commemoratio fiat dominae Margaretae, Collegii fundatricis, principis illustrissimae et eximia pietate insignitae, aliorumque benefactorum, quorum munificentia Collegium locupletatum fuerit vel exornatum; et cuncti Deo gratias agant, qui tanta per illos beneficia contulerit, et Eundem orent ut ipsorum quoque corda ad Dei gloriam illustrandam, honorem Christi Iesu amplificandum, et in Eius fidei incrementum Divini Spiritus gratia incendat.

CHAPTER XLIX.

Notice of Address.

Every Fellow shall leave with such person as the Master and Fellows may appoint an address at some place within the United Kingdom to which notices intended for him should be sent; and in all cases in which by these Statutes notice is required to be given to any Fellow, it shall be sufficient that a notice be sent to such address by post or otherwise.

CHAPTER L.

Change in the Value of Money.

No alteration in the specific sums mentioned in these Statutes shall be made in consequence of any change in the value of money or for any other reason, except by Statute made in accordance with the provisions of the fifty-fourth and fifty-fifth sections of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

CHAPTER LI.

Interpretation of Statutes.

If any doubt shall arise with respect to the true intent and meaning of any part of the Statutes it shall be lawful for the Visitor on the application of the Master or of any of the Fellows to declare in writing the intent and meaning on the matter submitted to him, and the intent and meaning so declared shall be deemed the true intent and meaning thereof.

CHAPTER LII.

Preservation of Interests.

1. The conditions of tenure of the Fellowship or of the College Office held by any person elected to a Fellowship or appointed to any College Office before the date of the approval of these Statutes by the King in Council shall be regulated by the Statutes approved by the late Queen Victoria in Council on the 29th day of June, 1895, or by the Statutes similarly approved on the 3rd day of May, 1882, as the case may be, as if those Statutes had remained unamended, subject however to the provisions here below.

2. Any person referred to in § 1 may signify to the Master and Fellows within one year after the approval of these Statutes by the King in Council by writing under his hand that he wishes to be placed under the operation of these Statutes. The conditions of tenure of his Fellowship or of any College Office he may hold shall be thenceforth governed by these Statutes and shall accordingly be the same as if these Statutes had been in operation at the time of his election or appointment.

3. The dividends of the Master and of all the Fellows shall be as in accordance with these amended Statutes.

4. Any person who at the time of the approval of these Statutes by the King in Council is not a Senior Fellow, and is at any subsequent time elected a Senior Fellow shall thereupon, as regards the conditions of tenure of his Fellowship, come under the operation of these Statutes.

5. Any person who shall at any time subsequent to the approval of these Statutes be appointed to a College Office shall, as regards the tenure of such College Office, be subject to the provisions of these Statutes. Provided that a re-election of a College Officer to the same Office for a further period shall not be deemed to be an election to a new College Office for the purpose of this section.

CHAPTER LIII.

Repeal of former Statutes.

From and after the approval of these amended Statutes by the King in Council, all the Statutes of the College in force before that time shall be repealed, excepting the four Statutes for the conversion of Scholarships into Exhibitions, which were confirmed by the late Queen Victoria in Council on the 1st day of August, 1860, and excepting any temporary or emergency Statutes which may have come into force after January 1, 1915, and subject to the reservation of the rights of any person which are preserved in accordance with the provisions of Chapter LII; but the repeal of the said Statutes shall not be taken to revive the provisions of any former Statutes of the College which were repealed by the said Statutes.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH AUGUST 1915.)

MAINTENANCE OF LIVE STOCK ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Maintenance of Live Stock 'Act, 1915, and for the purpose of maintaining a sufficient stock of cattle and swine, do thereby order as follows:—

Restriction of Slaughter of Animals In-calf or In-pig.

1. An animal which is visibly or obviously in-calf or in-pig shall not be slaughtered, or be caused or permitted by its owner to be slaughtered.

Restriction of Slaughter of Calves.

2.—(1) After the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and fifteen, until the Board shall by Order otherwise provide, and subject to the provisions of this Article, a calf, as defined by clause (5) of this Article, shall not be slaughtered, or be caused or permitted by the owner thereof to be slaughtered. From the commencement of this Order until the said date this provision shall apply only to calves under the age of eight weeks.

(2) This Article shall not apply to the slaughter of a calf of a cow of any of the following dairy breeds, that is to say:—Channel Island, Ayrshire, Kerry and Dexter breeds.

(3) This Article shall also not apply to the slaughter of a calf which has been offered for sale by public auction at any market or saleyard in England, Wales or Scotland, without reserve or subject to a reserve price of thirty shillings or less, and for which no bid exceeding thirty shillings has been made on such occasion; but this provision shall have effect only—

(a) if the calf so offered for sale is before movement from the market or saleyard marked by, or under the direction of, the auctioneer in the manner prescribed by this Article; and

(b) if such mark is on the calf at the time of slaughter.

(4) The prescribed mark for the purposes of this Article shall be a broad arrow branded, in hot pitch or a mixture of hot pitch and tar, on the back of the calf midway between the hips, the shaft and two barbs of the arrow to be a quarter of an inch in width, and the length of the shaft and of the barbs (outside measurement) to be two and a half inches.

(5) For the purposes of this Article the expression "calf" means, except where otherwise expressly stated, a bovine animal in which the first permanent molar or grinder tooth is not cut and visible.

Exceptions from Restrictions.

3. The restrictions of slaughter imposed by the preceding Articles of this Order shall not apply to—

(a) slaughter of an animal under the powers conferred by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, or any Order made thereunder; or

(b) slaughter of an animal necessary or desirable on account of accidental injury to the animal or its illness; or

(c) slaughter of an animal if in the opinion of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries the slaughter is desirable for any exceptional reason or purpose, and the slaughter is authorised by a licence granted by that Board or an officer of that Board.

Local Authorities authorised to execute and enforce Order.

4.—(1) The local authority for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and the executive committee (if any) for those purposes of such local authority, may execute and enforce the provisions of this Order within the district of the local authority, and any expenses so incurred by a local authority may be defrayed as if they were expenses incurred under the said Acts.

(2) The council of a borough (including a metropolitan borough) or urban or rural district may execute and enforce the provisions of this Order within the borough or district, and any expenses so incurred may be defrayed as part of the expenses incurred by the council in the execution of the Public Health Acts, or the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, as the case may be.

(2) A council of a borough which is a local authority for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, may defray the expenses under either of the powers conferred by this Article or partly under each power, as the council shall determine.

Powers of Entry.

5. For the purpose of executing and enforcing this Order any officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries may, subject to any directions given by that Board, and upon production, if so required, of his appointment, enter any slaughter-house or other premises on which animals are slaughtered for human food, and examine any animals or carcases therein; and any officer of a local authority to which the preceding Article applies shall, subject to any directions given by the local authority, have the like power of entry of premises in the district of the local authority in

1. The premises described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Wharf for the purpose only of the landing for slaughter in the Wharf of animals brought from the Dominion of Canada or from Newfoundland or from Iceland in a vessel which has not-

(a) within twenty-eight days before, or at any time since, taking the animals on board, had on board an animal exported or carried coastwise from a port in any country except the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, Iceland, and the British Isles; or

(b) within twenty-one days before, or at any time since, taking the animals on board, entered or been in a port in any country except the British Isles, the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, Iceland and the United States of America, or entered or been in a port in a State in such last mentioned country in which, or in part of which, special regulations relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease are for the time being in force:

Provided that animals shall not be landed at the Foreign Animals Wharf unless and until the master of the vessel has on the occasion of their importation delivered to the Commissioners of Customs and Excise, or their proper officer, a declaration made and signed that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of September, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.

Closing of Ports.

Former Notice.—No. 274 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three *red* vertical lights by night, or three *red* vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this Notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

PART II.

Examination Service.

(4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad, referred to in Part III of this Notice.


(5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels are advised to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Examination Anchorage. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

(6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two *red* and two *white*, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.



By night the steamer will carry:-

(a) Three *red* vertical lights if the port is closed.

(b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the distinguishing signal of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer. makes the signal.

(9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructionsgiven to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty Charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer.

(10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached with caution.

(11) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night: the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

H.M. Vessels are constantly engaged in sweeping operations off ports in the United Kingdom.

PART IV.

Whilst so engaged, they work in pairs connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following signals :-

A black ball at the foremast head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best. be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For the public safety, all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 274 of 1915, with the addition of Sunderland to the list of ports mentioned in Part III.
