And whereas His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, has issued the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, under the said last-mentioned Act:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made, loaded, unloaded, and dealt with therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Naval and Military forces are assembled therein:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Scotland, Northern Area, being the area comprised in the Counties of the Cities of Dundee and Aberdeen, the Counties of Perth, Forfar, Kincardine, Aberdeen, Banff, Elgin, and Nairn, including all Burghs within the geographical limits thereof; the Burgh of Inverness, so much of the Parish of Kilmorack as is situate to the North-East and East of the Highland Railway line from Dingwall to Inverness, and the Parishes of Kirkhill, Inverness, Petty, Ardersier, and Croy, in the County of Inverness, and such part of the County of Inverness, including all Burghs within the geographical limits thereof, as lies to the Eastward of Loch Linnhe and of a line drawn parallel to and two miles to the Westward of the western bank of the Caledonian Canal and the western shores of Lochs Lochy, Oich and Ness; the Burghs of Tain, Cromarty, Invergordon, Fortrose, and Dingwall, the Tain Licensing District, and the Parishes of Alness, Kiltearn, Dingwall, Fodderty, Urray, Urquhart, Resolis, Cromarty, Rosemarkie, Avoch, Knockbain, Killearnan, and Contin, in the County of Ross and Cromarty.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Suspensory Act, 1914, that notwithstanding anything in the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, no steps shall be taken to put that Act into operation, and notwithstanding anything in the Welsh Church Act, 1914, the date of disestablishment under that Act shall be postponed, until the expiration of twelve months from the date of the passing of those Acts respectively, or, if at the expiration of those twelve months the present War has not ended, until such later date (not being later than the end of the present War) as may be fixed by

His Majesty by Order in Council; and the provisions of those Acts shall have effect accordingly:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that—

If at the expiration of twelve months from the date of the passing of the said Acts the present War is not ended,—

1. No steps shall be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of eighteen months from the date of the passing of that Act unless the present War has previously ended, nor if at the expiration of those eighteen months the present War has not ended until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council.

2. The date of disestablishment under the Welsh Church Act, 1914, shall be postponed until the end of the present War.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council, dated the 27th day of May, 1915, and the 28th day of July, 1915, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 28th day of July, 1915:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, issued by His Majesty by Order in Council dated the 28th day of July, 1915, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

In Regulation 18A (δ), after the words "United Kingdom," there shall be read the words "and the Isle of Man."
