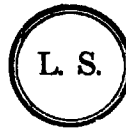
(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY AND TOWN WATERWORKS ACT, 1910.

Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Board of Trade hereby extend for one year from the 3rd August, 1915, the time limited by Section 6 of the Cambridge University and Town Waterworks Act, 1910, for the completion of the

Pumping Station No. 3 authorised by that Act, and at the expiration of which the Cambridge University and Town Waterworks Company are required to cease to pump or take water from the lower chalk formation by means of their existing works at Cherryhinton and Fulbourn.
