His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Military Cross on the undermentioned Officers, in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:—

Captain Robert Francis Day Burnett, 42nd Deoli Regiment (attached 89th Punjabis).

For conspicuous gallantry near Neuve Chapelle on the night of 7th-8th August, 1915.

With one Non-commissioned Officer and 4 Sepoys he voluntarily advanced from a sap-head under machine gun fire and rescued a badly wounded Non-commissioned Officer. The whole party had to stand up under fire in order to lift the wounded Non-commissioned Officer over the barbed wire.

Captain Ernest Cotton Deane, Royal Army Medical Corps (attached 2nd Battalion, The Leicestershire Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry on 22nd August, 1915, near Fauquissart. A standing patrol 120 yards in front of our line was bombed by the enemy at about 10 p.m., the

only notification being two loud bomb explosions. Captain Deane, without any knowledge of the enemy's strength, at once got over the parapet and ran by himself to the spot under rifle and machine gun fire. Finding four wounded men he returned for stretchers and got them back into safety.

This is not the first time that Captain Deane's gallantry under fire has been brought to notice.

Temporary Captain Leonce Delphin, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous energy in raising, practically unaided, in the district of Bethune, a labour corps from the refugee and local population. He carried out valuable work with this corps in the preparation of defences, and worked with it for many weeks under shell fire during the spring and summer of 1915.

Lieutenant (temporary Captain) George Douglas Begg, Reserve of Officers, 6th Battalion, The Royal Scots Fusiliers.

For conspicuous gallantry near Vermelles on 28th August, 1915. He made his way in broad daylight to a point within 8 yards

of a German sap, discovering two rifle pits and noting accurately the formation and wiring of the sap. During the whole time he was subjected to heavy fire.

Temporary Lieutenant Thomas Hamilton Carlisle, 171st (Mining) Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 12th September, 1915, near Armentières.

With another Officer he entered a mine, which was in a highly dangerous state at the time owing to gas fumes following an explosion, in order to rescue a man who had been overcome.

Their prompt action undoubtedly saved the man's life.

Lieutenant William Harold Hillyer, 3rd London Field Company, Royal Engineers, Territorial Force (attached 171st Mining Company).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in mining operations at "Hill 60," near Ypres, between 2nd and 17th April, 1915. The task of completing and charging one of our mines was one of great difficulty and strain. Lieutenant Hillyer worked and watched long hours at the end of a gallery 165 feet long and 3 feet by 2 feet 3 inches in size, knowing that the enemy was counter-mining close by. His pluck and endurance were remarkable, and resulted in the successful explosion of the mine and consequent capture of the hill.

Lieutenant Loudoun James MacLean, 57th Field Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and determination during the nights of 25th to 31st August, 1915, when he skilfully erected a bridge over the Yser Canal near Boesinghe under heavy rifle fire.

Although he lost several of his men, he carried the work through satisfactorily.

Temporary Lieutenant Eric Guy Sutton, 7th Battalion, The Royal Sussex Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 12th September, 1915, near Armentières. With another Officer he entered a mine, which was in a highly dangerous state at the time owing to gas fumes following an explosion, in order to rescue a man who had been overcome.

Their prompt action undoubtedly saved the man's life.

Temporary Second Lieutenant Fred Bell, attached 173rd (Tunnelling) Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and determination at Cambrin on 6th September, 1915. After the Germans had broken through into one of our mining galleries he went down into the working under fire, cleared out the enemy with his revolver in the dark, and held the ground till a sandbag revetment could be built.

This action contributed greatly to the successful completion of the mining operations.

Temporary Second Lieutenant Ernest William Byrde, 173rd (Tunnelling) Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and skill in France, when he was engaged in pushing

forward advanced galleries through those of the enemy, thereby determining the success of the mining operations.

Second Lieutenant Charles Henry Dowden, D.S.O., 2nd Battalion, The King's Royal Rifle Corps.

For conspicuous gallantry on 5th September, 1915, near Le Rutoire. He crawled out in broad daylight 200 yards in front of our advanced trench, which was 300 yards in front of the firing line, and reconnoitred the enemy's position from a point within 200 yards of their front line, bringing back very valuable information.

On 6th September he crawled out again and completed his reconnaissance, being fired on from a German sap.

On both occasions Second Lieutenant Dowden went out entirely on his own initiative.

Temporary Second Lieutenant Gilbert Hart, 173rd (Tunnelling) Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and skill in France, when he was engaged in pushing forward advanced galleries through those of the enemy, thereby determining the success of the mining operations.

Temporary Second Lieutenant Bernard Russell, 2nd Battalion, Princess Charlotte of Wales's (Royal Berkshire Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on the afternoon of 12th September, 1915. Knowing that a detailed reconnaissance of the enemy's line in front of his brigade would be of value, he went out alone on his own initiative, and reconnoitred the enemy's wire, barricades and parapet, working in some places along the front face of the enemy's parapet itself in broad daylight. His reconnaissance proved to be of the greatest value.

Temporary Second Lieutenant Horace Scott Shield, Royal Flying Corps.

For conspicuous gallantry and skill when on patrol duty with Corporal T. Bennett on 13th September, 1915.

When over Bois De Biez, at about 10,000 feet, he sighted a German Albatross, and at once dived and attacked it at about 7,000 feet, being subject at the time to heavy anti-aircraft gun fire. The German Albatross used a machine gun very conveniently mounted, but Corporal Bennett handled his gun with such skill that he disabled the German machine, which side-slipped and then nose-dived to the ground in our lines.

Second Lieutenant Shield has been exceptionally keen in pursuing German machines whenever seen, and on this occasion he manœuvred his own machine with admirable judgment and courage.

Second Lieutenant (temporary Lieutenant) Charles Sproxton, 1st/4th Battalion, Alexandra, Princess of Wales's Own (Yorkshire Regiment), Territorial Force.

For conspicuous gallantry and resource on many occasions in securing the defences of his Company line, notably the following:—

On the night of 5th-6th July, 1915, near Wulverghem, although exposed by the enemy's flares to heavy rifle fire and assisted

only by one Non-commissioned Officer, he carried 8 "knife-rests" (entanglements), and placed them in position within 40 yards of the enemy's line.

On the night of 6th-7th August, near Armentières, he was in charge of a party wiring in front of our fire trench. A German machine-gun was turned on the party, but Lieutenant Sproxton, after withdrawing his party, returned with the same Non-commissioned Officer, and, with utter disregard to danger, they completed the work.

Second Lieutenant (temporary Captain) Arthur Ashford Benjamin Thomson, The Royal Warwickshire Regiment, attached Royal Flying Corps.

For conspicuous gallantry and determination on 29th August, 1915, near Neuve Chapelle. When ranging a heavy gun on the German trenches he stayed up over two hours in heavy rain, with clouds at about 500 feet. At one time he found himself in a cloud on the far side of the German trenches; but, after coming back under heavy fire, he continued to observe with the greatest bravery and skill, only returning when too dark for more work. His gallant conduct resulted in 10 direct hits on the enemy's parapet.

Second Lieutenant (temporary Lieutenant) Harold Henry Walton, 7th (Robin Hood) Battalion, The Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment), Territorial Force.

For conspicuous gallantry and energy on several occasions:—On the night of 30th-31st July, 1915, near Ypres, when ordered to re-occupy an advanced sap, he was heavily bombarded with trench mortars and rifle grenades, several of his men being killed and buried; but by his cheerful example and gallant conduct he kept his men in hand and held on to his position. Had the enemy been able to get a footing in it the defence of the next trench would have been very difficult.

On the night of 3rd-4th August he led a patrol up an evacuated trench. It was not known if it was occupied by the enemy or not, and the information he brought back was of great value.

Lieutenant Walton has frequently reconnoitred close up to the enemy's trenches and obtained valuable information.

Temporary Second Lieutenant Raymond Burke Williams, 176th Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Givenchy on 25th August, 1915, when in charge of a mine. He went down the gallery immediately after the end had been blown in and ordered the men out owing to gas fumes. He then endeavoured to rescue the men till he was himself overcome by fumes, and had to be dragged out; but as soon as he recovered he again went half way down the mine and directed further rescue operations.

Second Lieutenant Williams has been in charge of mines in the Givenchy area since 7th July, and has consistently shown the greatest coolness in difficult operations necessitating rapid charging and blowing up of mines in very close proximity to the enemy's counter mines.
