FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under Section 73 (4) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, applying the provisions of the said section to all cases of *toxic jaundice* occurring in a factory or workshop; that is, jaundice due to tetrachlorethane or nitro- or amido-derivatives of benzene or other poisonous substance.

This draft is in substitution for the draft Order (published on the 21st September last) to extend the provisions of the section to "dope poisoning," which is now withdrawn.
