

of the London Area, as defined by Article 1 of the Order of the Board made on the 18th day of November, 1915, as is not within the Metropolis as defined in Schedule 6 of the Licensing (Consolidation) Act, 1910, may be open on Sundays for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor until the hour of 3 p.m.

And whereas further doubts have been expressed as to the hours during which licensed premises and clubs may be open for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor on Christmas Day.

Now therefore we the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the Powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

1. All licensed premises within the Area notwithstanding the fact that they are not situate within the Metropolis as above defined, may be open for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor up to the hour of 3 p.m. on Sundays.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold and supplied for consumption on or off the premises in licensed premises and clubs in the Area, whether situate within the Metropolis as above defined or not, on Christmas Day, shall be the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the said Order for the London Area such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is respectively permitted on Sundays, and the said Article shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.
