Hazie, Sept. 11. From Deventer they tell us, that the Bishop of Munster and the Count d. Bentem are now at Bentem, where the took possession of Church be-longing to those of the Resourced Religion where they ordered Masse to be sung f dealing somewhat everely with their Minister.

The States General having received Anfaers from all the Seven Provinces, in relation to the Proposals made to them by the C ntons of swifferland, have accordingly ordered a Letter to be written to the faid Cantons, giving them Thanks for the freenels of their Offers, with an account of their . folution upon the whole matter ; with which their Envoye is to be suddenly di missed.

From Flushing we are told of the arrival there of one Ship from Grende, one from Martinege, and another from Surinam. Some more of the Grocaland Fleet are arrived at the Texel, one of them with the freight of 13 Whalos taken about the height of 78 degrees, where they met with an extraordinary number of those Fish. Several others are also expected with a confiderable return.

A Ship arriving also in 20 day: a from Moscowy, informs us that the Fleet of Merchant Ships which went out from the Texel and other parts of these Provinces, were happily arrived at Archangel, where the Faires are observed at the time which they were anciently used to be kept.

Hague, Septemb. 13. The Sieur Romswinkel, Envoye from Brandenburgh and the Hoers Burgersdijck and Vander To the deputed from this State, are going hence for Malines to end a difference there depending between their Masters.

The Count de Eentem has by his Letter to the States informed them, that he is heely become a stoman Catholick and a Member of the Empire; withall, deficing his Children who demanded their protecti ni might be fent to him.

The Lunenburg forces will be sudden'y pain off and dilmiffed, and tis faid, the Dukes of Lunenburg are Treating with the Republick of Venice to have them I nt for Candia.

Exussetts, Sept. 14. The people belonging to the Territories of this City are much diffitisfied with the Contributions charged on them towards the quartering of the Spanish forces; and on Thursday alt the Women getting together, went with much noise to the Town-House, crying out against the Bourgomaster; who appearing to them, had probably ran some hazard of his life, had he not rimely fled from their fury.

The Citizens are not yet pleased to commit the Guard of their Ports to the Spanish Soldiers, but in order thereunto the Commons have been several times called together, where it has been proposed to them that for the prevention of Tumults and Diforders, they would give way at least For a time that some of the Spanish forces might be drawn into the City, but as yet without any effect; in the mean time double Guards are set upon all the Gates, and care tak n for the prevention of any farther disorders.

The 9th instant was publishe an Edict at Lille, by which a'l the Nobility of the Provinces who enjoy any Estates within the places lately conquered by the Freich, are commanded to refide upon the places where their Estates lie, upon pain of Confication.

The Plague which continues with much Violence in the French Quarters, begins to spread it self into our Neighbourhood, but the Magistrates are taking what care they -can to put a stop to it.

Paris, Septemb. 15. The Chevalier d'Almeras is ready to fail from Thousen for Conftantinople to attend our Am bassidor in his return home; the Count de St. Paul and Duke de Roannez, with the Officers and V lunteers are at Marscilles, where they may embark the 15th instant for Can lia.

The President Barentin Intendent of the Province of Portfou having lent to the Court to delire some forces might be sent thither to secure the peace of the Countrey against those of the Reformed Religion; the D. de la Vieuville's by His Majesties Order to march within & days into the Province belonging to his Government with a party of 500 horse.

The Duke Fean Frederick of Hanouer arrived here the

4th instant incognite, and the next day went to Marbiffon, to visit the Daughters of the Princels Palatine; where he made choice of the Princels Beneditte for his Wife, and figned the Control of Marriage. On Tuelday last he returned again, having left full power with Monsieur Groot to marry her by Procu: ation, and to attend her into Germany.

F. om the Netherlands we are advised, that the Spaniards having fent a Troop of Horle to take possession of Fountain l' Evesque , the Sieur de Landes Governour of Binche, drew a Company of foot into the Castle to keep postession as a dependant on the Casteleny of Binche 3 but having farther i telligence that the Spaniards had drawn a company of foot into the Town, seising on the Gates, and keeping the Castle belieged, he immediately drew our a party of Horle and Foot from Binche, and summon d the Spanish Officer in chief to fend him the Keys of the Town, and to march out, which was accordingly done without any farther disturbance.

Bruges, Sept. 16. The Marquis de Caffel Rodrigo having taken a view of Oftend and Nemport, and the 12th instant returned hither, went hence on Thursday Mo ning to Ghent . The same Evening arrived a offend Don Pedro de Velasco our New Governour, with 5 Spanish Men On Friday Night the Marquits h v ng notice of War. thereof return d hither, and yesterday morning went hence for Oslend to at end Don Pedro, who with the greatest part of the Nubility and Court is expected here this Night or to mor:ow.

Tarmouth, Septemb. 7. On Saturday last sailed from this road to the Northwards about 200 fail of light thips, and

were this day I llowed by all 3 30 more.

This day arrived three thips of this place from Rotterdam, and one from Oftend with Merchants goods, and twelve Ripaladen fom Newcastle.

Portfroith, Septemb. 8. On Sunday morning a small vel-Tel which came from Rouen with Linnen and Barly for the Canaries, by the heating of the Corn took fire and burnt down to the water, two of the company perished with the vessel, the Master and two others getting away in their boats.

Yesterday was driven in here by contrary winds, the America with some other stips bound for Virginia.

Bug fort, Sept. 9. Thursday left His Majetty, accompar nied with his Royal Highnels, arrived here, and have spent the time since in hunting hereabouts. Sunday last His Majesty did Sir Thomas Draper the honour to dine with him at his House at Sunninghill, where he was very hand-somely entertained. In the Afternoon he went thence to Windsor, where according to the Statutes of the Order, His Majesty, accompanied with his Royal Higness, Prince Rupers, and several other Knights of the Order, Offered in St. George's Church; which was performed with the Ulual Ceremomies: and from thence they returned in the Evening to this place.
