We, the Master Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in manner following:—

By repealing Section 1 of Statute XIII, intituled "Admission of Fellows," and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 1 of the same Statute:—

"1. Every Fellow shall be admitted within three days after his election, unless prevented by illness or other grave cause to be approved by the Council, and if so prevented shall be admitted at the first opportunity when he is not so prevented. And if he neglect or refuse to be so admitted he shall thereupon forfeit his fellowship. He shall enjoy the advantages of his fellowship from the date of his election."
