

amongst divers other hereditaments) to certain uses, under and by virtue of which Earl Manvers is tenant for life in possession, and subject to a power of sale and exchange contained in the said Indenture of the 21st day of June, 1876, exercisable by Hugh Edward Egerton, and the Honourable Algernon Malcolm Arthur Percy, (commonly called Lord Algernon Malcolm Arthur Percy), as the present Trustees thereof, at the request and by the direction of Earl Manvers, and to powers of revoking subsisting uses and appointing new uses for effectuating any such exchange:

“And whereas it has been proposed to us that the Patronage of the said Benefice of Kneesall, and the Patronage of the said Benefice of Weston, should be exchanged in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said Benefices of Kneesall and Weston, and of the Patronage thereof, respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that such circumstances and values respectively are as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed:

“And whereas the yearly value of the said Benefice of Kneesall in Your Majesty's Books is £10 0 0, and the yearly value of the said Benefice of Weston in the same Books is £19 2 11:

“And whereas by an Indenture of Appointment already prepared, and intended to be executed immediately after the publication in the London Gazette of this Scheme, and any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, which said Indenture is intended to bear date the day of the date of such publication as aforesaid, and is expressed to be made between the said Hugh Edward Egerton, and the said Lord Algernon Malcolm Arthur Percy, of the first part, Earl Manvers of the second part, and the Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, of the third part, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage and presentation of and to the said Benefice of Weston is intended and expressed to be appointed unto and to the use of Your Majesty, Your Heirs, and Successors, for ever:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent

of the said Hugh Edward Egerton, and the said Lord Algernon Malcolm Arthur Percy, (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and at the request and by the direction of Earl Manvers, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Kneesall, and the Church thereof, shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs, and Successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in or limited to the said Hugh Edward Egerton, and the said Lord Algernon Malcolm Arthur Percy, and their heirs, nevertheless to such of the uses, upon such of the trusts, and with, under, and subject to such of the powers, provisos, and agreements, in and by the said Indenture of the 21st day of June, 1876, and the said deeds and documents referred to in the Schedule to the said Indenture of Appointment, limited, declared, and contained, of and concerning the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage and presentation of and to the said Benefice of Weston, as immediately before the execution of the said Indenture of Appointment were subsisting and capable of taking effect, and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage and presentation of and to the said Benefice of Weston, and the Church thereof, shall in like manner, and upon and from the same date, be assigned and transferred to and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs, and Successors, for ever, and shall and may, from time to time, and at all times, be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
