THE King of Spain has named the Duke of Giovanazzato be Viceroy of Arragon in the piace of the Duke of Escalona, who is gone to his Government of Satalonia. The Marquis de Constant is continued Governor of Arms in Catalonia; and made behides Captain of the Kings Life-Guard. Five Regiments of Foot are ordered to be raised in Estremedura, or which the Colonels and other Officers are already declared, and other Levies are to be made in Andalusia and Castille; and towards defiaying these, and the other Expenses of the War, great Sums of Money are vailed, by way of Donatives, upon all the Towns and Societies, as well as Biskers, Farmers, and other private Persons of this Kingdom. We have an account from Cadiz. That Don Privade Corbette, Admiral of the Spanish Armada, had on the first instant, in pursuance of the Orders he received from hence, visited and sized a Genousse Ship, called the St. John Baptish, of 60 Guns, and two smaller Ships belonging to the same Republick, which had on board near two Millions of pice s of Eight upon French and Genousse Accounts.
