Temporary Certificate.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, on the application of the Managers of the Institution known as Allerton Priory, Woolton, Liverpool, he has issued a Certificate with a view to the reception in the Institution of mentally defective girls sent to an Industrial School in pursuance of the provisions of the Children Act, 1908, or of the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

The Certificate, which bears date the 16th February, 1916, provides that the number of children resident in the school at any one time, whether sent thereto in pursuance of the said provisions or not, shall not exceed fifteen. It will cease to have effect on the expiration of three months from this date unless renewed or made permanent before that date.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE BRISTOL AND BATH AREA.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

WE, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

Limits of area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is the Bristol and Bath Area, being the area comprising the Cities of Bristol and Bath, the Petty Sessional Division of Lawford's Gate in the County of Gloucester; the Petty Sessional Divisions of Long Ashton, Keynsham, Weston and Frome, and the Parishes of Chew Stoke, Chew Magna, Stowey, Stanton Drew, Chelwood, Publow and Norton Malreward, in the County of Somerset; and the area within the circumference of a circle having a radius of five miles measured from the Lighthouse known as the "South Pier Lighthouse," Avonmouth, and situate in the Bristol Channel at or near the estuary of the River Avon.
