Notice is hereby given, that the Local Government Board, by an Order dated the 14th day of February, 1916, have made a Regulation under section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, which will come into operation on the 21st day of February, 1916, and remain in operation for a period of twelve months from that date, limiting to ten miles per hour the speed at which a motor car may be driven within the limits comprising so much of the main road from Whitchurch to Prees as extends from its junction with Edgeley Road, Whitchurch, to a point opposite the Raven Inn on Whitchurch Heath

## (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED PLACE.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

## SCHEDULE.

*Description and Limits of Infected Place.*

The Home Farm premises and the fields known as Farmers Joy and Trundells Batch at the Somerset and Bath Asylum, in the parish of St. Cuthbert Out, in the administrative county of Somerset.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Clacton-upon-Sea, in the county of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, one temporary yearly sum or stipend of nine pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the twenty-sixth day of September, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and to cease as from the avoidance of the said vicarage of Saint Paul, Clacton-upon-Sea, by the Reverend Henry Seeley, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage, and to be receivable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each year so long as the same shall continue payable.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this tenth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a piece of land comprising two thousand and four hundred square yards or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured by deed dated the twentieth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, as a site for a parsonage or house of residence for the consolidated chapelry and benefice (hereinafter called the benefice) of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, in the county of York and in the diocese of York, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said benefice of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, to meet such benefaction one capital sum of nine hundred and sixty pounds, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said benefice, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough.
