1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the No. 29543,

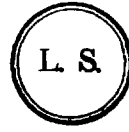

WELSH CHURCH ACT, 1914.

Whereas the Commissioners have satisfied themselves that in the ecclesiastical border parish of Llanislin the general wishes of the parishioners are that the said parish should be treated as being wholly within Wales,

The Commissioners do therefore by this Order determine that the said ecclesiastical parish of Llanislin, shall, for the purposes of the Welsh Church Act, 1914, be treated as being wholly within Wales
